### Planners Set Discussion Subdivisions

The first of a probable series of meetings to discuss plans for two subdivisions and the proposed housing for the aged project is scheduled by the Town Planning Commission for Monday.

The subdivisions to be discussed are those submitted earlier this year by builders Irving H. Stuch at West Hartford and Frank R. Wood.

Stuch submitted plans Jan. 6 for a 36-lot subdivision on the 45-acre Bryan Farm tract north of the Wilbur Cross Highway and bounded by Avery Heights and Bowers Farm developments.

Wood submitted plans Feb. 1 for an 181-lot subdivision on the 167-acre Darling Farm tract off Keney St.

Wood and Stuch are slated to appear at the meeting to explain details of their plans to TPC members. Both builders have sought to have their tracts rezoned to permit more lots, but have been turned down by the planners.

They have also appealed TPC decisions in the Court of Common Pleas but have been denied there as well.

The subdivisions are planned now in conformance with Rural Zone requirements.

Planners also expect to hear latest developments in plans for the housing for the aged project off W. Center St.

Atty. Herman P. Yule, counsel for the Manchester Housing Authority, last week announced that the authority should be ready for occupancy next winter.

The \$1,500,000 federally subsidized project would provide 100 living units for Manchester senior citizens.

### Library Wing Item Before Board Again

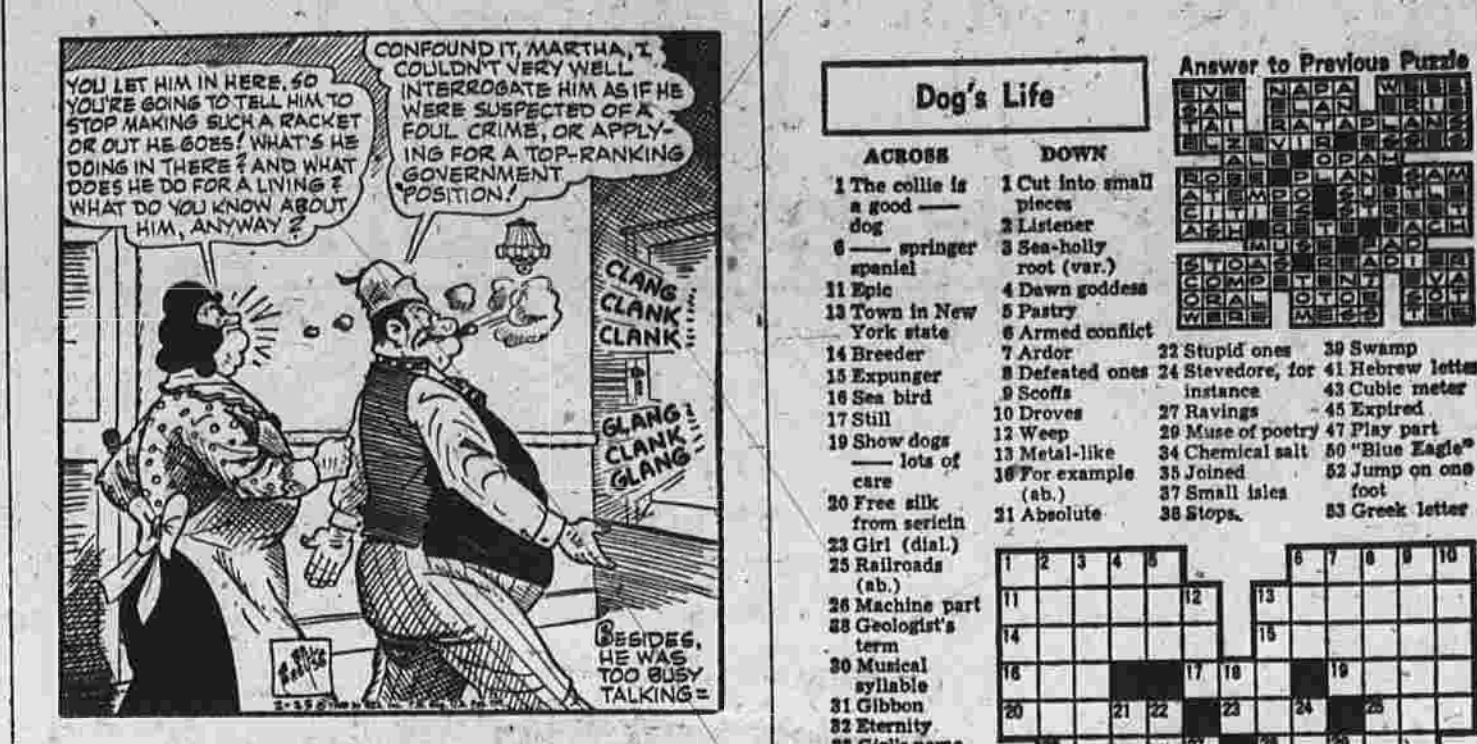

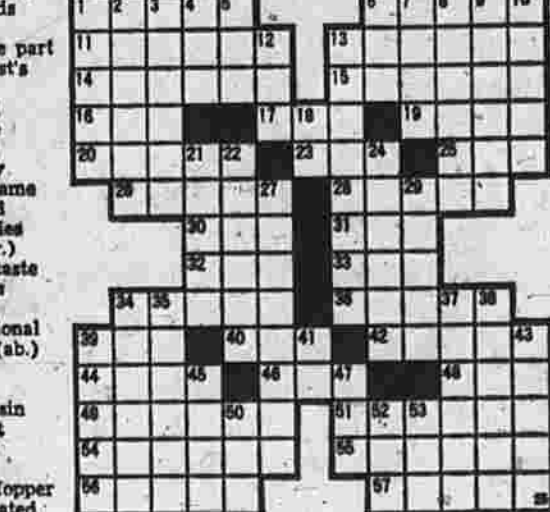
