harmful under conditions of use," he added, speaking as an industry witness.

"You haven't the slightest idea how much of any one of these colors is actually ingested by people," retorted FDA Attorney Alvin J. Gottlieb.

Hazleton conceded that "I don't think anyone could tell you how much is in the diet."

Under present law, the FDA is required to ban the colors if they are found to be harmful when fed to laboratory animals in any amount. FDA agrees with the industry that safe usage levels could be set, and has asked Congress to change the law to allow this.

In the meantime, however, it has gone ahead under the old law to ban the colors. The ban has been held in abeyance pending the outcome of the hearings, which were requested by the lipstick industry.

"I'm very much interested in doing another play, perhaps musical comedy, and, of course, I hope for a film in Hollywood someday. You know, I was under contract to Columbia for five years. You would never know it from the little I did, but I'm looking forward to another opportunity there."

Currently, Betsy is taking vocal coaching. She has her eye on the musical stage. Naturally deep-voiced, Betsy, when asked to describe what her singing voice is, ruefully said, "I don't know, we haven't named it yet."

"After all," Betsy said wistfully, "Everyone else is getting into the singing end of show business—western stars, private eyes—so I thought I would get into the act, too. I am looking forward to singing on the 'Garry Moore Show' in June."
