U.S. Cautious On Adenauer's Plebiscite Plan

West Berlin's government said today it would be asked to vote on the city's future if the occupying powers want to be organized to take place before the May 16 summit conference.

Washington, March 17 (AP)—U.S. officials today began a friendly but cautious inspection of Konrad Adenauer's plan for a pre-summit vote by West Berliners on whether the Allies should stay in Berlin. The West German chancellor launched his surprise suggestion in a speech to the National Press Club yesterday.

Today he arranged to wind up his 11-day visit to Washington with a meeting with the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, then fly to California where he will receive two honorary university degrees.

The State Department termed Adenauer's Berlin proposal "very interesting" and said it had asked West Berliners to vote overwhelmingly to keep their western protection.

It promised consideration of the plan at the pre-summit meeting with the western Allies, after the West German supply a formal proposal spelling out what Adenauer had in mind.

The West German foreign minister, Heinrich von Brentano, said he will stay on in Washington for several days of discussions after Adenauer's departure.

The 84-year-old Adenauer acknowledged the idea to President Eisenhower during their lengthy meeting at the White House Friday. He said he had thought of it only Wednesday morning.

As Adenauer pictured it, a West Berlin plebiscite rejecting Soviet domination of the city would strengthen the U.S. and French chiefs when they meet the Soviet premier in Paris May 16.

Khrushchev has called for withdrawal of the West from the city. The Western Allies' position was reaffirmed by Eisenhower in his news conference yesterday when he said the Allies will not abandon their rights in Berlin except under a renunciation of Germany.

Shirkers Assailed
Hartford, March 17 (AP)—Taxpayers have been complaining about state employees who take it easy on the job.

George J. Conkling, the state finance commissioner, says the letter to his fellow commissioners that employees' work habits should be reviewed to correct "shirkers on the job."

Conkling's letter, mailed yesterday, said "instances of apparent inattention to duty on the part of a small number of state employees have given rise to several recent taxpayer complaints."

Among the complaints, Conkling listed "groups loitering over coffee in corridors of state buildings, excessive time spent on coffee breaks in state cafeterias, prolonged newspaper reading at desks, loud social conversations with the work of other employees and other examples of shirkers on the job."

The company, Motta Supermarket, is accused of selling two products below an established formula cost.

Commissioner Attilio R. Frassinelli gave Motta until April 4 for preparation of a defense. Motta said he will appeal to state court if Frassinelli rules against him.

The commissioner said the supermarket advertised and sold the coffee for 85 cents a pound, while three boxes of the same coffee for 85 cents.

Frassinelli said the law provides that no product can be sold for less than its invoice cost plus 5 per cent profit.

The cost of the coffee in Connecticut is 86 cents a pound, the commissioner said. Motta's coffee was sold for 85 cents a pound.
