Wiley, emerging from the closed-door meeting ahead of other committee members said there were 20 to 30 amendments to be acted on.

While the judiciary committee was wrestling with the legislation, the Senate, which has had a short respite on other business after a week of legislative strategy meetings on the subject behind closed doors tomorrow.

The Senate has given the committee until midnight tonight to complete its consideration of the politically explosive bill.

Well placed sources were predicting that the bill would be passed in the next few days.

There has been a move to seek Senate approval of the bill as early as possible, with the House voting this evening directly to the White House without subjecting it to delay—or even risk of defeat—in a Senate chamber.

An informant who declined to be quoted by name called reporter's attention to the fact the measure.

Boycott Sparks Violence Negroes Demanding End of Pass System

Johannesburg, March 29 (AP)—The Pan-Africanist Congress today demanded an end to the pass system for non-white South Africans.

The militant Negro organization issued its demand as Negroes streamed back to work in Johannesburg last night following a strike that exploded into rioting.

The Pan-Africanist expressed regret at the outbreak but blamed the rioting on the pass system.

"We have said before and we repeat," said a spokesman of the African (non-white) people's party, "that the pass system is a tool of apartheid."

The group sponsored the original anti-pass demonstrations in Johannesburg, which were held in white police opened fire on Negroes, as they were being arrested.

In parliament, Justice Minister F. C. Erasmus declared the acts of the Pan-Africanist Congress are close to rioting.

He declared, "They want to bring the white government to its knees."

State News Ike, Macmillan Agree On N-Test Ban Policy

Hartford, March 29 (AP)—Governor Ribicoff today called for imposition of tariffs on foreign made typewriters which are flooding American markets and hurting Connecticut's typewriter industry.

His appeal came in a letter to Chairman Joseph P. Dabbs, U.S. Tariff Commission. Ribicoff, a Naugatuck Republican, said that the tariff on foreign made typewriters is too low.

The Governor, pointing to the heavy impact that imported typewriters have had, urged the commission to recommend that President Eisenhower impose tariffs on such items.

He noted that during the 6-year period ending June 30 foreign typewriters have accounted for 20 per cent of the sales in this country.

Both the Royal McBee Corp. and the Underwood Corp. located in Hartford, have been hard hit by the importation of such typewriters.

In 1952, the two companies had an employment of 10,000 here comprising 13 per cent of employment in the Hartford labor market area.

However, in 1959, the influx of duty-free foreign typewriters reduced employment here to 7,500—a drop of 25 per cent.

South Windsor Postal Office Contract Set For Building

Contract A. Zarewsky of North Haven, has been selected to build the new South Windsor Post Office on Main St. next door to the present location in Bessen's Store.

The announcement was made by Paul E. Kelleher, regional real estate manager for the post office. Zarewsky will purchase the former tobacco shop owned by George J. Clark Jr. of Main St. and build the new building.

The 1.5-story structure of masonry construction is to be completed within 200 days after acceptance of the plans. There will be 1,750 square feet of space in the building, 1,200 square feet of platform, 1,200 square feet of landscaping, 252 square feet of platform, 143 square feet of driveway, and 7,700 square feet of parking area.
