ments should be pumped out, washed down and disinfected.

President de Gaulle, before British Parliament, once more exhibited that larger vision, France's guiding light, which has made him the world's greatest statesman.

France, said de Gaulle, "does not despair of seeing the progressive diminution of opposition between these two ways of life, in a peaceful atmosphere, through evolution conditioned on the one hand by the aspiration of human nature for the pursuit of progress which demands efficiency."

The whatever arrangements may be made one day, either for reducing the means of war, for bringing peace to the European continent, or for bringing about a detente from all ends of the world to the other, France is convinced that peace will remain precarious so long as two thousand million human beings remain in the depths of misery throughout the world.

There is, once again, de Gaulle's rebuke to the gains the world's centers of power are playing, a rebuke, he believes, which will spur us to effort to explode and win his own way into that same game.

In a rebuke which says there are problems in the world big enough and challenging enough and portentous enough to demand all the attention, research and genius of both Communism and democracy than either poses to the other.

When he speaks like this, one imagines a view of the summit in which de Gaulle summed up all the knoelings heads together, until they are finally emptied of all the pointless, futile, inescapable power deadlocks their mutual folly has hitherto tolerated, and set free to consider the really essential problems of the world in which they live.

Goldwater's Coup

In a move which has the Republican extreme right wing shouting gleefully and no one can blame it for its glees, Senator Barry Goldwater has waited down to South Carolina and picked up that state's 18 delegates to the Republican National Convention for himself. He may claim those of his own state of Arizona, but he has picked up the rest of the delegates in the capacity of a favorite son. Perhaps he may garner some others. Who knows? Out of the blue he maneuvered South Carolina; perhaps he has other operations in progress.

He is not after the nomination. Nor is it merely to relieve the tedium of the Republican National Convention, by seeing to it that there is more than one set of nominating speeches in a convention which was supposed to open unanimously for Nixon.

Senator Goldwater, in fact, is probably not objecting to the nomination of Nixon, whom he has supported in the past. He has himself made his object clear in an open warning to Nixon. He warns that Nixon has a great deal to do to open with respect plans for

How to Save Your Child From Painful Toothaches

Since the element is best brought to the child by the circulating blood, place no reliance on dentifrices or mouth washes of stodgey or such nature.

By following this simple schedule, you will spare your child most of the discomforts that go with toothache and, at the same time, greatly reduce the costs of dental care. However, do not practice a false economy by omitting semi-annual visits to your dentist for cleaning and needed treatments.

Those of us who had not the opportunity for fluoride treatment before formation of our permanent teeth will be less successful than members of our present baby crop. However, we will have the satisfaction of knowing that our children will have fewer cavities, extractions, bridges and dentures than their peers.
