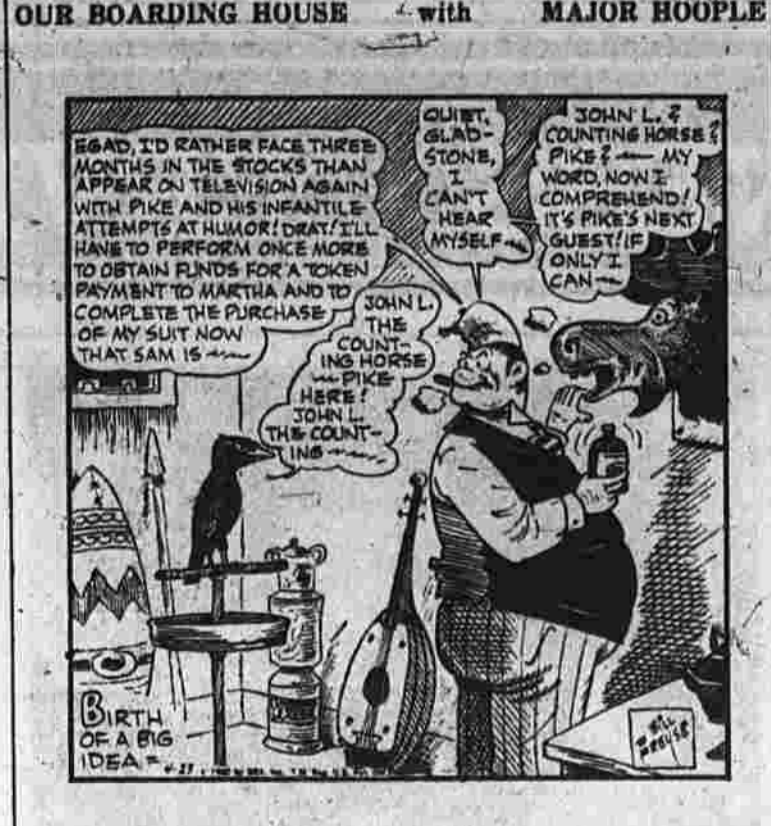

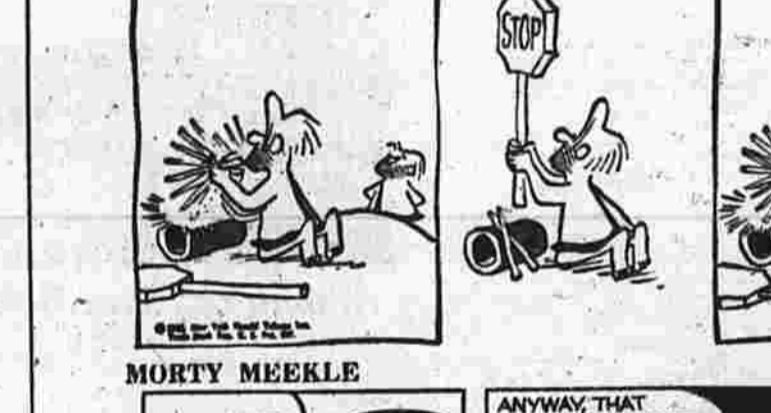

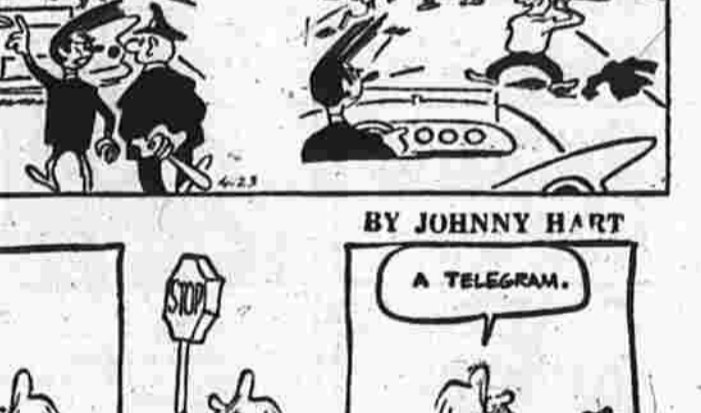

UConn Given \$100,000 for Heart Study

A \$100,000 grant for a five year study of heart and blood vessel disease has been awarded to scientists at the Storrs Agricultural Experiment Station at the University of Connecticut by the National Institute of Health of the U.S. Public Health Service.

Dr. Charles F. Heimbold, head of the Department of Animal Diseases will direct the research.

Mink will serve as guinea pigs. These animals display vividly to the laboratory scientist the blood and tissue changes which occur as a result of cardiovascular diseases, the most common killer of man.

Since some blood vessel diseases of livestock, domestic animals and humans are not well understood, the Storrs scientists will study the changes which occur in mink.

One of these mink diseases is known as Aleutian mink disease and is similar to rheumatic arthritis, rheumatic fever and other diseases. Some scientists have argued that Aleutian mink disease is a form of leukemia. Mink scientists do not yet support this theory.

Boys Playing with Matches Blamed in Lydall-Foulds Fire

Three youngsters playing with matches have been blamed for starting a flash fire in an open storage shed at the Lydall and Foulds Co. paper mill on Parker St. yesterday afternoon.

The fire destroyed the shed roof and scorched most of an estimated 150 tons of baled waste paper stored inside.

Two of the boys police questioned are 10 years old and the others nine. Patrolman John Hughes is investigating. Police say the boys admitted playing with matches near the shed just before the fire. It started at about 4:45.

Robert P. Fuller, general manager of the Lydall and Foulds firm, said the waste paper represented an investment of from \$2,000 to \$4,000. He said some of the baled paper, which is manufacturing process, may be salvaged.

The brief, dramatic blaze roared through the shed in minutes. Flames spread to coarser, dry grass in the adjacent lot but were doused by district firemen carrying hand pumps.

Burning bits of shingle flew from the shed roof several hundred feet to a nearby barn on the Lydall and Foulds property, but the sparks were snuffed out before any damage resulted.

The value of the shed, perhaps 80 feet long and 30 feet wide, was not estimated. Fuller said it was in good repair and was valuable to the company as an auxiliary storage place for paper.

# Dick Powell--Man with a Plan

**By ROGER A. OWEN**  
A man with a plan is a man named Powell.  
Dick Powell is president of the successful television company, Four Star Films, Inc., and, under its banner, is the weekly host-narrator of "Dick Powell's Zane Grey Theater" in which he appears occasionally as an actor. Moreover, he is highly regarded and frequently sought after as a producer-director of motion picture feature films.  
During more than quarter of a century in show business, Dick Powell has been a concert singer, master of ceremonies, a musician, an orchestra leader, a singing motion picture star, a motion picture director, a stage director, a televi-

sion actor, dramatic motion picture actor, and a producer of feature and television films.  
Powell has starred in upwards of 50 motion pictures, directed half a dozen theatrical films, and produced and directed one—"The Conqueror," starring John Wayne. He has produced and starred in upwards of 30 television films for Four Star, and this fall will mark his third season with what newspaper television editors concede is the best western anthology series, "Zane Grey Theater."  
**Born in Arkansas**  
Born in Mountain View, Ark., Dick grew up in Little Rock where he attended Little Rock College and began to formulate the Powell plan for fame and fortune.  
His success in church singing was gratifying, but it did very little for Dick's bank account. So, he went to Louisville, Ky., and landed a job as vocalist with the dinner orchestra at the Kentucky Hotel.  
During his year in Louisville, Powell kept plugging at his plan. At that time, every movie theater of any size had a stage band and a master of ceremonies who could hold the spotlight a good deal of the time. That little arc of light, Dick decided, was the bouncing beam that could land one either on Broadway or in Hollywood. And, the way he figured it, the best way to get a job as emcee was to have a background as vocalist with a name stage band. Dick did considerable angling and finally had his first and only bid, which he took, from Charlie Davis, then conducting the orchestra at the Ohio Theater in Indianapolis.  
The Powell plan was now rolling, and when Davis and his band subsequently moved to a better-paying post, Dick stayed on to form his own stage band, replace Davis and become the emcee. It took him just a few months to land a bigger spot, as emcee at the Stanley Theatre in Pittsburgh.  
"The first girl I ever introduced from a stage," Powell recalls, "was a mighty pretty but slightly skinny little red-headed Charleston dancer. In my intro I piled it on to the point where I felt I overdid it a bit, but as it turned out, I was just being prophetic—the kid's name was Ginger Rogers."  
It was during his stint at the



Stanley that Powell had his first movie nibble, from 20th Century Fox, but Dick decided he wasn't quite ready for the big chance.  
Almost a year later Dick signed with Warner Bros. and went to Hollywood. The Powell plan was picking up speed.  
**Screen Debut**  
Dick's screen debut was in "Blessed Event," starring Lee Tracy and Mary Brian. Powell played a down-and-out band leader. Dick sang three songs in the pic-

ture, and in a way that sent the brothers Warner scurrying for scripts premised on movie musicals. That was in 1932, and it saw the start of a cycle of musicals never equalled before or since. During the next few years, Dick did such memorable movies as "42nd Street," "Gold Diggers of 1933," "Footlight Parade," "Flirtation Walk," "20 Million Sweethearts," and more than a score of others.  
By 1935, the tenor from Little Rock was one of the top ten box office names in movies; one of the hottest entertainers in radio. He was a wallowing success; he was making big money; and he was restless.  
He formed an independent company with Sam Bischoff and made two successful films, "Pitfall" and "Mrs. Mike," but as an actor. The bankers who put up the money wouldn't take chances with an unproven director. Consequently, Dick tried another avenue of attack.  
He teamed with screen writer Bill Bowers to work on screenplays in the hope he could make a package deal with some studio, sell them a script along with a certain fellow named Powell as director. And, finally, Paramount bought this package which turned out to be called "A Likely Story."  
Powell went to work developing several screen plays, among them, "The Conqueror," based on the early conquests of Genghis Khan, which, when filmed, set the biggest budget in RKO's history—six million dollars.  
**Hosts Every Episode**  
Never a person to rest on his past laurels, and even with several feature films on his agenda of directing and producing, Powell is vigorously active in his Four Star television production of "Zane Grey Theater." He hosts every episode, and is committed to appear in starring roles in three segments for the upcoming season.  
Even his idle moments burgeon with activity. Away from the studio, Dick Powell is a busy man. He likes sailing, fishing and flying. He's an experienced aviator, but sold his plane because June Allyson—Mrs. Powell—doesn't like flying and worried when Dick was aloft.  
Also, Dick is a photography enthusiast; he enjoys taking still and 16 mm pictures, and he loves to tinker.  
Mr. and Mrs. Powell live in a

big house amid vast acreage of exclusive Mandeville Canyon. They don't go out much, except to the homes of close friends. When Dick's working schedule permits, the Powells entertain frequently. They have a close, affectionate family life with their children, and the Powells are one of the happy, healthy families to which Hollywood points with pride.  
**Q: Is it true that Elvis Presley will appear on Frank Sinatra's special?** — Carol T.  
**A: It certainly is.** He will appear on May 12. Others in the cast may include Joey Bishop, Sammy Davis Jr., Tommy Sands and Sinatra's daughter, Nancy.  
**Q: How tall is Elaine Malbin?** — Tommy T.  
**A: She's one of the tiniest opera singers—physically—to hit the top. She's slightly under 5 feet 1".**
