First Outside Project
The Manchester High School Distributive Education class has entered its first live project this week, organizing a commercial program of display, radio commercial and mail advertising for a North End laundry owner.

AVOID OVER-RUFF TO PROMOTE TRUMPS
By Alfred Sheinwold
In many situations it pays to refrain from over-ruffing. You get your trump trick later, with some interest.

West opens the ten of hearts and the suit is continued for three rounds. East leads the king of hearts. South must ruff with the ten of spades to have any chance at all for his contract.

You know perfectly well what would happen in most cases. West would over-ruff with the jack of spades, burning and gaining with the rest of the tricks. He would win any return and draw trump with the ace, king and nine. The rest would be easy.

The result is very different. If West is patient, there is no need for West to rush in with his jack of spades. He will win that trick later.

When South ruffs with the ten of spades, West simply discards a club or a diamond.

South leads out the ace and king of spades, for lack of any better play for his contract. West must make two trump tricks, defeating the contract.

West's five of spades is promoted by his partner's ruff in trumps.

Right to Know? One of the town government's watchdogs, famous for her on-the-spot investigations of engineering, legal, administrative, budgetary, clerical, and fringe governmental considerations, concentrated her efforts recently on personnel.

She made an on-the-spot investigation of candidates for the town engineering job while they were preparing to take a written examination. Her fervor as a citizen may have disturbed the decorum of the State Personnel Department, but it is just such energetic interest that protects the people from bureaucrats as well as politicians.

It is true, perhaps, that five of the six candidates who took the examination will not get the job and that they might prefer not to have it widely known that they sought it.

But democracy depends on citizen participation. If it were not for this citizen's interest, what guarantee would there be that the town will get the right man?

The hearing set for May 9 is for requests for approval of a proposed subdivision layout of a section of the Darling Farm tract off Keeney St. and for approval of proposed orders establishing new building lines on a piece of property at E. Middle Tpke. and Vernon St.

Joey Bishop Appears On Sinatra's Show

By PAUL GERARD
 Joey Bishop will appear on the "Frank Sinatra Timex Show" on May 12 on the ABC-TV Network along with such notables as Elvis Presley, Sammy Davis Jr., Peter Lawford and Sinatra's 19-year-old daughter Nancy.
 Joey feels Sinatra was the reason for his getting his first big break in show business.
 Though even Bishop himself is not certain when Sinatra first saw him, he remembers very vividly that the crooner requested Bill Miller to book Bishop for his Riviera stint in 1952.
 "It was the first time I was

ever in a class club," Bishop confesses, "and for the first time the right people saw me."
 From then on, it was top money at the top spots, such as the Copa, Chez Paree and the Sands for Joey.
 The road up, however, was not an easy one for Joey.
 Born in the Bronx ("I was the smallest baby ever born in the Fordham Hospital," he proudly announces, "Three pounds.") Bishop was moved to Philadelphia by his family when he was three months old. His father was a bicycle salesman. "My folks were poor, but I didn't mind poverty," he claims. "They always played games. For instance, when I'd come home, they had moved. Maybe they didn't like me."
 After attending Furness Jr. High, South Philadelphia High and Saratwood — "I'm not sure of the

spelling, maybe that's why I didn't graduate," he quit school to help his father in the bicycle business. Though Bishop loved selling, he was still more anxious to enter show business, so he left Philadelphia and came to New York to live with an uncle. However, it proved to be a quick trip.
 "My uncle got me into an amateur contest, and I lost," Bishop reminisces. "He then got me a job in a hat factory at \$3 a week, and I left."
 Formed Trio
 Returning home, Joey teamed with two other show business hopefuls to form an act called the Bishop Brothers Trio.
 "There we were," he recalls, "three guys named Cottlieb, Reisman and Spector. We took the name Bishop because there was a young Negro kid in the neighborhood named Bishop. He had a car and agreed to drive us to auditions if we'd use his name."
 The trio was short-lived. After a few bookings, Reisman dropped out because of illness and Spector was soon after drafted, leaving Joey Gottlieb, now Bishop, to do a single. At the same time his act became a single, Bishop got mar-

ried to, as Variety would say, a "non-pro."
 From the beginning of 1941 to April of 1942, he worked at a club in Cleveland called El Dumpe. He was then drafted and for the next four years was working for Uncle Sam.
 Upon his discharge, Bishop found his wife too ill to move, so the couple temporarily settled in San Antonio, Tex., where he played a few off-the-beaten-path spots. One night, orchestra leader Bob Lee "caught" Bishop's act and became so enthused that, through his recommendation, Joey was booked into New York's Greenwich Village Inn. The next few years saw Bishop spend more time in night clubs than a headwaiter.
 While the money and work grew and grew, Bishop suddenly felt that his career was at a standstill as he had higher hopes than being a night club comic. Though he'd had a few straight acting roles in pictures—"The Deep Six," "Onionhead" and "The Naked and the Dead"—he was still not satisfied. "I'd always start off playing the role straight," he bemoans, "and then, halfway through the picture, they'd decide that they needed some laughs so they'd tell me to joke it up."
 Offered TV Spot
 Thus, in the summer of 1958, Joey Bishop was faced with a perplexing problem. He was offered a weekly TV spot on CBS-TV's "Keep Talking." To accept, however, he would have to give up voluntarily his night club work which brought him a very lucrative salary. The TV stipend was nowhere near that. However, still young and looking toward the future, Joey figured that the financial sacrifice was worth it as a career-building move, so he temporarily cancelled all his future night club bookings to accept a panelist spot on "Keep Talking" and an occasional guest spot on the Jack Paar Show. Joey made the right decision, as was demonstrated recently when he played the Black Orchid in Chicago and broke its all-time record. "In addition to the volume of business I did," he recounts, "it was the type of audience I drew. I could see that, for the early show, there were families there who knew me strictly from my TV appearances. I met people who had driven in from Racine who, a year ago, had never heard of me. There were people who didn't ordinarily go to night clubs to see night club comics. However, thanks to TV, they came to know me and, I guess, like

me, or they wouldn't have been there."
 With his new-found stature, Bishop now believes that he really can get down to the business of being the kind of comic he really wants to be—the "genuine comic." "Without a name," he reveals, "you can't do the comedy you want to do. You've got to do what the audience wants. You've got to 'get' them. But once you're a name, they accept what you want to do."
 Bishop lives in Englewood, N. J., where he's part owner of a golf club with fellow comedians Phil Foster, Buddy Hackett and Dick Shawn. He and his wife, Sylvia, have an 11-year-old son, Larry.
 Writing Book
 Right now, he's trying to finish a book called "Comedy, Self-Taught," but every time he finishes a few pages, he uses them in his act. For instance, he advises
