# The Facts Behind the Labor Dispute at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft

The letter reproduced in its entirety below has been sent by the management of Pratt & Whitney Aircraft to each employee at his home. The company believes that its neighbors throughout Connecticut must also be told the facts about its dealings with Lodge 1746, International Association of Machinists.

The union leadership is threatening a strike over issues that do not involve wages. They themselves say that wages are not an issue. A strike would lead to serious economic consequences, not only for our own employees, but for thousands of our neighbors as well.

### Rockville-Vernon Completion of Charter Draft Expected Next Wednesday

Completion of a charter for the consolidation of Rockville, Vernon and the Vernon Fire District is expected next Wednesday, according to Robert P. Kingsbury, chairman of the Consolidation and Charter Commission (CCC).

The CCC last night reviewed in detail nearly half of the charter draft. Members should be ready to complete the review and accept the entire charter at its next meeting, Kingsbury said.

Revised printed copies of the charter as approved so far will be ready for members Monday to study in preparation for Wednesday's meeting.

The only significant action taken by the CCC last night was clarification of the initial appointment procedure for the police chief, finance director and public works director. Each position will be filled by appointment of the mayor from the three applicants rating highest on a competitive written and oral examination, to be conducted by the State Personnel Department.

The CCC has been meeting at least twice monthly since its appointment last July, and weekly for the past two months.

When the complete charter is approved by the CCC copies will be made available to the public for study before a referendum vote is taken.

Sometime in June referendum votes will be taken separately in the City of Rockville and in the Vernon Fire District. A majority of votes cast in each area must be in favor of the charter in order for it to be adopted.

In both city voters and rural voters approve the charter in a election of officers will take place in March and the new government will take over July 1, 1961.

**Fiscal Change Plans**

Meanwhile, a workshop meeting of town officials on a proposed change in the fiscal year has been scheduled tentatively for June 7. Finance Chairman William F. Ludwick said today.

The selection, Board of Education, town council, tax collector and all other officials who will be affected by the change will be asked to attend, Ludwick said. They will discuss all aspects of the plan to change the fiscal year to begin July 1, instead of Sept. 1, effective in 1961.

A public hearing will be held on the change sometime after the workshop meeting. Voters will be asked to approve the plan at a town meeting probably in July.
