Andover Contract Signed For New Buses. A \$27,908 contract for four new buses was signed Thursday night by the Board of Education and Joe Bousa's Garage, Willimantic.

Bousa's original bid, \$28,995, was the lowest of three submitted bids which conformed to the board's specifications.

Since only \$28,000 was budgeted for the purchase of buses, the board eliminated tenders from three buses and one of the two specified interior luggage racks from each bus.

Holliman's Blue Chip:  
Play Up Your Personality

Hollywood—(NEA)—Shades of Errol Flynn, Humphrey Bogart and Mickey Mouse.  
Movie Actors are talking again about smuggling their personalities through the Method Acting Curtain and out into the wide, wide screen world.

After 21 movies—from playing a bit in Jerry Lewis' 1952 "Scared Stiff" to costarring with him in "Visit to a Small Planet" and having his own TV series, "Hotel de Paree"—Earl Holliman would like to say:

"When you black out your personality on the screen you can

never make it as a star. I've learned on TV that if I'm not a personality, I'm nothing.

"Look what happened to Steve McQueen in 'Never So Few.' People went to theaters to see Frank Sinatra and they came out talking about Steve because his personality came through.

"I let my personality come through in the TV series this year and it's fantastic."

The personality Earl Holliman blacked out until he got wised up about life in front of the camera is, in a way, like that mutt dog he calls "Useless" in his weekly TV show.

One day animal trainer Henry East received a telephone call from the Los Angeles County pound.

"Say, Henry," a fellow at the pound said, "we just brought in a mutt with a terrific personality. Why don't you come down and get him and make a movie star out of him?"

That's exactly what East did. Earl Holliman is no mutt, of course. But he's no Cary Grant.

His own description of himself he wraps up with the words:

It was a GI haircut like no one had ever seen before.

"It was," Holliman still laughs, "sort of a GI cut but with bangs."
