Hebron Town Meets On 6 Items

A special town meeting will be held tonight at the Hebron Congregational Church to discuss six items on the agenda call for action on relocation of the town dump to town owned property on "Nines Rd." and disposal of the present dump; to elect a member of Regional Board of Education to serve from July 1 of this year to June 30, 1962; to receive the report of the Board of Selectmen as per the action of the town meeting of Oct. 1959 tabling a resolution concerning Webster Lane; to authorize the selectmen to convey to the Gilead Congregational Church that portion of Meeting-house Rd. which was abandoned when the road was relocated where it joins Route 85; to determine whether to accept a strip of land for highway or street purposes in the Amazon Lake section of the town, known as Hillside Rd.; and to receive the annual report of the town from July 1 to June 30, 1959. Candidates for membership on the Regional Board of Education include Dr. Charles M. Larcomb, former local school superintendent, now a teacher in Baltic, and Alfred Goldstein, who has served as a member of the Board with terms as member of the Board which expire July 1. He wants to run again. The Board of Selectmen support Larcomb for the position.

High Bus Contract
A 3-year contract for school transportation has been awarded by the Hebron Board of Education to the Clark Transportation Company of Colchester. This contract will cost the town \$23,500 per year. Thirty cents per mile will also be charged for additional mileage; 85 cents per mile for group sponsored trips on a 40 mile radius; 23 cents per mile for trade school and physically handicapped transportation, and 35 cents per mile for the Regional School bus.

The school board asks the Board of Finance to accept an amended budget increasing the transportation allowance by \$271, because of increased expense based on the increased cost of fuel. Also \$500 extra is asked for rental of an outside classroom. The Hebron Congregational Church, which furnished a classroom some years ago, in a similar situation, at \$500, now feels obliged to ask \$1,000.

Mrs. Geraldine Hanna's resignation as a teacher in the primary department of the Elementary School, is accepted with regret. Mrs. Hanna has accepted a school position in Columbia for the coming year.

Members of the Hebron Congregational Church will be asked to attend a meeting at 8 p.m. May 20, to hear and act upon the report and recommendations of the pastoral committee. This committee will submit the names of the Rev. Mr. Cross as minister, for consideration by the church body. The Gilead church will take similar action on May 23.

Loss of Plane Setback For Air History Group

The 8-month-old Connecticut Aeronautical Historical Assn. set to a flying start, was suddenly faced last week with having to pick up the pieces and begin again.

When the association was founded in 1957, its members, with the interest developed from years in the aeronautical field, had visions of the day when a museum would stand somewhere in Connecticut, a repository for the relics of aviation's early years.

These visions had firm footing in the association's ownership of one of the most unusual airplanes ever assembled, a lone biplane built by Louis Brancroft in 1917. The plane was destroyed in a Hebron barn fire and the association's visions went "glimmering" at that time.

The association was begun Nov. 24 by 14 men who gathered for dinner at Willie's Steak House in Manchester. The "idea" was to establish a statewide organization to collect and restore vintage aircraft and to discuss and investigate the history of aviation.

After purchasing the Brancroft, Lippincott and Muse were told of another antique, a Navigator of World War I vintage, said to be in Providence, R.I. Providence turned out to be a dud.

The plane's unique feature is, or was, the possession of two angular stabilizing surfaces, which like huge batwings, stretched from the rear edge of the wings to the tail assembly.

At the time, the Wright Bros. had patents on movable stabilizers usually incorporated into wing and tail pieces. Brancroft simply bypassed the patents by devising his own.

Brancroft never sold the plane, designed probably as a trainer, according to Muse. What information is available tends to show he was unable to install a sufficiently powerful engine in the beast.

The engine mounts indicate he used one of the old, French airplane, "tail power" plants, said Muse, "probably a 6-cylinder motor."

It was Brancroft's last flight. He died in Orzeon in 1930 with little note of either plane.

Found in Garage
The association found the plane in the garage of Robert W. Erwin of Hebron, who told Lippincott about it. The association bought it, assembled it for a brief flight, and then dismantled and stored it in John Horton's barn.

"There are always a danger," said Lippincott. "In my association with the Smithsonian Institute, I remember the loss of several valuable relics through fire in storage buildings."

"None day," he said, "we would like to have a deeproof warehouse. Establish a statewide organization to collect and restore vintage aircraft and to discuss and investigate the history of aviation.

Two schools of thought on the subject of antiquity and historical groups, said Vernon R. Muse, association secretary. "One says you need to look back to see where you've been. The other admits this is true, but says you have to look back to see how you're going to get there."

Forgotten American In Red Czech Prison

NOTE—He never has been seen in his native Czechoslovakia in the late 1930s. Jaromir Zastera was born in 1920. The boy was 19 when his father died.

Jaromir and his mother were living in Prague, south of Prague, when the youth was arrested. His only crime, so far as known, was that a piece of uranium ore from the top-secret Czech uranium mines was found in his apartment.

Kennedy Gets 6th Primary Triumph

With five other primary victories, he said, he was satisfied that he had no chance of winning in Maryland but ran only to promote "the constitutional liberties" he embraces. He had earlier said he would back Adlai Stevenson if his own bid for the nomination failed.

The Oregon Senator said his campaign helped show "the seeds of liberalism" in Maryland and these would flourish "as more and more Democrats in Maryland come to recognize that the reactionary policies of the Democratic party organization in Maryland will never be truly representative of the best political interests of the state."

His campaign manager, Herbert L. Fedder, was almost jubilant. "This was more than I expected," he said. "We spent less than \$5,000, had not one political worker with us and had not one worker in any precinct in the state."

Every major party leader had backed Kennedy even though Gov. J. Millard Tawes' endorsement was limited to the Maryland race. The governor also has been wooed by backers of Sen. Stuart Symington (D-Md) and Lyndon B. Johnson (D-Tex.) In that order of effectiveness: The Maryland law to win with Kennedy as long as it believes he has a chance to be the nominee. In practice, some previous delegations have interpreted this as meaning only the first convention ballot.

The victory impressed just about everybody but the victim, Morse. He's right on insisting that the

winner-loser roles will be reversed when he and Kennedy collide again in the Oregon primary. Morse could be right. He has proved himself to be a tough man on his home ground.

Kennedy told a reporter he will be satisfied if he can come out ahead of Symington and Johnson, who are on the Oregon ballot but not on the Oregon primary. He listed them as "serious contenders for the Democratic presidential nomination."

Humphrey still is on the ballot, too, but no longer as a contender since the Kennedy bidragon crushed him in West Virginia.

"It seems unlikely I will beat Morse," Kennedy told a reporter. "That would be a difficult thing to do."

To a question whether the Maryland outcome may trim the Morse margin, he predicted in Oregon, Kennedy replied: "Well, that's very possible."

Defense psychiatrists convinced the jury that Allen R. Burns, 18, was deranged at the time of the \$157 robbery of the Concord Federal Savings Bank last September.

The money was found in Burns' room at the state hospital here, where he was a summer employe.

In treating Burns yesterday, Judge George H. Grant Jr. said: "In view of the verdict of the jury and in the absence of any affirmative evidence that at this time it will be dangerous that Burns should go at large, and in the absence of any evidence of present aggressiveness on the part of Burns, the prisoner is discharged."

Released on Bond

Hartford, May 18 (AP)—A young bank employe who was arrested last Friday and charged with embezzling \$179,148.65 has been released on bond.

The bond of Thomas P. Clifford Jr., 24, former assistant secretary at the First National Bank of Thompsonville, had originally been set at \$25,000, but was cut yesterday to \$15,000 at the request of his attorney.

Although the FBI says Clifford had admitted the thefts over a period of three and a half years, much of the money has not been accounted for in his description of how he spent what he took.

Clifford's statement to the FBI mentioned \$15,000 for a lifetime general instruction course, "Jeans" of \$9,000 to a man in Hartford, and several thousand dollars for a Cadillac.
