Today is Armed Forces Day, the one day each year that the military opens its doors to the public and gives guided tours and detailed explanations. Frank Curran, CWO William Howland and five other men took part in a parade which included a Nike Ajax missile and trailer, scale model displays of various types of missiles plus numerous pictures.

Col. Vester Shultz, commanding officer of the 63rd Artillery Group in Conn., will give up his command June 30 for a new assignment at Washington, D.C.

Group Headquarters in New Britain said that Colonel Shultz will go to the operations research office. His successor as group commander will be Col. Robert L. Howland, now a student at the Army War College at Carlisle Barracks, Pa.

The 63rd Artillery group is composed of 13 missile battalions in Connecticut, including the one here.

The honor battery plaque has been set in place in front of C Battery's ordery room.

This was won by C Battery in 1957. It was awarded later for obtaining more than 92 per cent in the annual service program.

When they were in the southwest during last summer, Manchester's missile men knocked down three targets in as many tries.

# Douglas Not Well, Not a 'Sick Comic'

New York (NEA) — Jack Douglas is a comedian and he hasn't been feeling too well lately, but don't ever call him a "sick comic." For that matter, don't even use the phrase in his presence. It makes him feel worse. "Sick comics?" he says. "What do they mean by that? What do they mean by 'sick'? If they call a man sick because his humor is macabre, then you'd have to say James Thurber was a sick comic. He has written a lot of funny stuff about death. And so have I.

"I've been dead. (He had a serious heart attack last September). I don't worry about it, and I think it's a proper subject for humor. Does that make me a sick comic?"

"It's the old story—people are afraid of what they don't understand. They call Mort Sahl sick—why, he's as down to earth as he can be. And Shelley Berman—you can't get more commercial than he is. But people are afraid of anything that's different, so they invent a name and call them sick."

Douglas wrote much of the stuff that made Jack Paar popular, and then cashed in with his own books, like the current "Never Trust a Naked Bug Driver." And now he wants to get back into the performing end of humor. He started out as a performer, and his chief reason for wanting to return to it is an honest one—"performers make more money."

Unlike many comedy writers, Douglas isn't planning to turn to serious writing.

"There are two reasons why not," he says. "First, I can make more money doing what I'm doing. And second, I have no confidence. I wrote a 90-minute TV play once, but I never showed it to anybody. I pulled it out a year later and re-read it. I'm glad I never showed it."

### Around TV Town

It's official — Marge and Gower Champion are retiring as active performers. They may still make an occasional appearance on a TV special, but they will do no more nightclub or theater work. Gower, who directed the Broadway hit, "Bye-Bye, Birdie," will concentrate on that end of the business. Marge will stay home mostly, although she'd like to take a crack at a dramatic part on TV. Jackie Gleason's fancy Peekskill home attracts so many tourists that Gleason got upset. He was having difficulty getting in and out of his winding driveway. At first, he

thought of putting up a "No Trespassing" sign, but he's too good-natured to stay angry long. Finally, he just gave up. Now the driveway has a big sign which reads, "Jackie Gleason Ave."

Dame Judith surprised the regular girls on the show. Starbuck says these girls, like most dancers, always watch a person's legs and feet. And they say she has "wonderful legs and feet" and would have made a fine dancer.
