State Counts 5 Mishap Deaths

New Haven, May 31 (AP)—Five persons perished in accidents during Connecticut's Memorial Day weekend, three of them in boating mishaps.

A person died in a traffic accident. The other died in the flaming crash of a racing car at West Haven track.

For counting purposes, the weekend started at 6 p.m. Friday and ended at midnight last night. Four of the victims died on Saturday.

In West Haven, 27-year-old Nicholas Ferraro of New Haven was taking his racing car for a test spin around a track when the car struck a guard rail and burst apart.

Four others were hurt seriously in the accident, police said.

Finance Aide Clears Rhee, Funds Charge

Deputy Finance Minister Kim Yoo-kap today cleared his statement before the National Assembly that former President Syngman Rhee misappropriated \$30 million in foreign exchange.

Kim told newsmen that he did not mean Rhee stole the money for his own use but that the appropriation it without proper procedures. He also said the amount was about \$10 million and not \$30 million as reported earlier.

In Hawaii, Rhee called the accusation fantastic.

Kim said the Board of Audits and the Finance Ministry are investigating the details of how the money was spent and the results would be made public. He added that Rhee regime spent some \$17 million of foreign exchange this year. Of this he said, the finance minister was responsible for appropriation of only \$2 million and Rhee himself was responsible for the rest.

A group of student demonstrators demanding the resignation of acting President Huh Chung was strongly denounced and forcibly dispersed today by yellow collaborators after a brief scuffle today in Seoul.

About 1,000 students of Tanguok College and Kyungju University marched to the National Assembly building demanding Huh's resignation for helping Rhee flee from the country.

New Cabinet Bars Politics in Turkey

Ankara, Turkey, May 31 (AP)—The revolutionary government moved today to stamp out political activity in Turkey with scattered arrests.

The roundup followed the suicide of Namik Gedik, former interior minister, Democratic Party functionary and one of the most hated members of ousted Premier Adnan Menderes' regime.

The arrests were behind attempted attempts to stir Menderes' old Democratic Party back to life following last Friday's military coup.

Most prominent of those taken into custody were Sittki Yircally, who had held several key posts in the Menderes cabinet and took over active leadership of the shattered party immediately after the coup.

After its first formal meeting yesterday, the provisional cabinet announced it was banning "for the time being all party activities with the aim of preventing all discussions and struggles between brothers which might create angry incidents."

Sunday, about 95 former deputies were released. That some were hoping to organize an attempt to free Menderes.

Despite the arrests, Turkey was returning to normal life. In Ankara, military authorities lifted the curfew which had been imposed on the city by Menderes' government four weeks ago.

A curfew was still in effect in Istanbul, military permission was still required for telephone calls outside the country.

2 Killed in Plane

Greenwich, May 31 (AP)—Two persons in a single-engine, private plane, were killed early today when the aircraft crashed into some trees on a hillside and burned.

The pilot was identified as Stanley Krinsky, 36, of 22 Hella Terrace South, Yonkers, N.Y.

Police were unable to positively identify the badly burned second victim immediately.

But a woman's pocket book found in the wreckage carried a New York driver's registration bearing the name of Mrs. Jessie Wylie, 34, formerly of Bronxville, N.Y.

Police said a check showed that Mrs. Wylie had moved recently to 1012 Avocado Isle, Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

The plane, a Beechcraft Bonanza, crashed shortly after midnight during a drizzle while the pilot was attempting an instrument landing.

The plane crashed atop a hill off Riversville Road, near the New York state line. It bounced against several trees before catching fire.

Lt. Walter Walden of the Greenwich police said Krinsky took off from the Spring Valley, N.Y., airport and contacted the Westchester County Airport at Purchase, N.Y., by radio at 12:30 a.m. today and said he was preparing to make an instrument landing in the drizzle.

Greenwich police found the crash plane at 10 a.m.

Lights, Students Out

New Haven, May 31 (AP)—The lights went out at Yale University's Old Campus last night, and so did about 900 of the students.

The riot was brief and not very serious. No one was hurt.

For unknown reasons, electricity in the Old Campus, a 2-square-block area, went off. The students, who are taking final exams, shot firecrackers, threw water bombs, and dropped miscellaneous articles from their dormitory windows.

Campus police held the riot down by locking the gates which connect the dormitory buildings with the city streets. No city policemen were called out.

Boris Pasternak Dies, Noted Russian Novelist

Moscow, May 31 (AP)—Boris Pasternak, whose last years were filled with the political stress generated by his novel "Doctor Zhivago," died in his sleep last night. He was 70.

The noted poet, novelist and translator will be buried Thursday at the Russian Orthodox Church in the village of Peredelino, his family said today. Pasternak was an Orthodox convert of Jewish origin.

Family mourners gathered on the lawn outside his small country house at Peredelino, writers' colony 20 miles from Moscow. Inside artists made a death mask of the Nobel prizewinning writer's craggy, brooding features. His wife, two sons and a brother were present.

The brother, Alexander, confided to newsmen that Pasternak was converted before the Revolution of 1917. Pointing to the 18th-century village church, he said "He was a deeply religious man

Dulles Tells About U2 in Secret Talk

Washington, May 31 (AP)—Sen. J. William Fulbright (D-Ark.) said today he still believes it is "unwise" for President Eisenhower to have taken responsibility for the ill-fated U2 spy plane incident. Fulbright said, he blamed the "questionable decisions" on political officials of the State Department and the White House.

Washington, May 31 (AP)—The Senate Foreign Relations Committee, working behind heavily guarded closed doors, heard the inside story of the U2 spy plane today from the country's number one espionage agent.

Allen W. Dulles, director of the supersecret Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) read a long prepared statement. But he provided no copies—not even for the committee members.

Sen. J. William Fulbright (D-Ark.), committee chairman, left it solely up to Dulles whether anything he said would be made public.

Fulbright promised to meet with newsmen but said he did not know what he would be able to tell them.

Washington, May 31 (AP)—President Eisenhower will leave June 12 on his Far Eastern tour to Japan, Korea, the Philippines, Formosa and Okinawa.

Announcing this today, the White House said that on the way the President also will visit this country's newest states, Alaska and Hawaii.

Eisenhower will travel aboard his jet airliner, but may transfer to the U.S. cruiser ST. Paul for the trip from Manila to Taipei, the capital of Formosa.

Ike Lauds SEATO For Curbing Reds

Washington, May 31 (AP)—President Eisenhower said today the SEATO Defense Pact has helped to prevent further Communist domination in Southeast Asia.

Eisenhower made the statement in a brief speech prepared for a White House luncheon attended by delegates of the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization conference which opened today.

"We can take much satisfaction," the President said, "in the fact that our first objective of preventing further Communist domination through aggression or subversion in the treaty area has been realized."

"However, we cannot afford to relax our vigilance or slacken our cooperative efforts to further the high principles of the Pacific theater."

No defensive alliance of which we are a member faces a greater challenge or protects a more vital segment of the free world than SEATO.

3 Democratic Hopefuls Seek California's Votes

California Democrats will see three of a kind today: A trio of senators who want to be president.

Sen. Stuart Symington of Missouri, Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas, and John F. Kennedy of Massachusetts have scheduled a full day in Los Angeles, trying to attract support for the Democratic nomination.

In the morning, the three plan hour-long news conferences, one after another.

During the day, the three meet privately with members of the delegation that probably will go to the national convention. The slate, pledged to cast the state's 51 votes for Gov. Edmund G. Brown as a favorite son, has minor opposition in California's June 7 primary.

In the evening, Symington, Johnson, and Kennedy address 200 Democrats at a \$100-a-plate dinner in honor of Gov. Brown. Republicans plan a rival attrac-

But Texas, Florida Get 10.45 Miles

Washington, May 31 (AP)—In a case potentially involving billions of dollars, the Supreme Court held today that rights of Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama to oil in submerged Gulf lands extend just three miles off their coasts. It ruled that rights of Texas and Florida extend to three leagues, or about 10.45 miles.

The High Court was so split with differences as to the individual states that the precise division in the historic decisions were not sharply defined.

The ruling was by a 7-man court. Chief Justice Warren and Justice Clark disqualified themselves. Warren is a former governor of California, another state where there is a submerged lands issue. Clark headed the Justice Department as attorney general during earlier phases of litigation over the ownership of gulf lands.

By its limiting of Louisiana's ownership of submerged lands to three geographical miles, the government is in a position to pick up \$300 million and untold millions in the future.

The Interior Department has been leasing disputed lands off the Louisiana coast and putting the money in escrow pending today's decision.

The money now tied up in is the neighborhood of \$300 million. It came almost entirely from leases off Louisiana. Only leases off Louisiana so far have brought in substantial revenues. If there is a substantial mineral leasing off Texas and Florida, those states stand to pocket the money.

Justice Harlan wrote the court's main opinion on the case, a matter of long controversy.

Harlan, however dissented as to the Florida decision.

Justice Black wrote the court's main decision in the Florida case. Justice Black also wrote a separate opinion in which he dissented in the cases of Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama. He favored giving them the same treatment as Texas and Florida.

Justice Douglas dissented as to Texas. He said, however, that Florida's claim was fully established.

FIRE THREATENS TOWN

Gagnon, Que., May 31 (AP)—Aided by dying winds and a light rain, hundreds of firefighters feverishly built defenses today against a forest blaze that forced air evacuation of some 500 women, children and hospital cases from this northeast Quebec mining town. Twenty-six military, commercial and private planes moved more than 400 evacuees yesterday to Montreal, where they were installed against the city's best hotels. Another 90 were flown to Sept-les, an ore point on the St. Lawrence, 150 miles to the southeast.

QUAKE IN ATLANTIC

San Juan, Puerto Rico, May 31 (AP)—Quivering of mainland seismographs needs not some experts to report a quake in the Caribbean area today. But no land mass appeared affected. No tremors were felt in Puerto Rico or the Virgin Islands to the east. Modesto Vasquez, observer in charge at the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey here, said his seismographic equipment recorded moderate disturbances somewhere in the east Atlantic.

CASTRO PAPER FIRED ON
Havana, May 31 (AP)—Gummen today fired from a speeding car at the building housing the semi-official newspaper, Revolution. This was the second attack in two days on public buildings supporting Prime Minister Fidel Castro. Several shots from automatic weapons struck the Revolution building. No one was injured. The gunmen escaped.

Drain Nearby Puddles To Kill Mosquitoes

To prevent the mosquito-borne disease Eastern Encephalitis which attacks the brain, and to cut down on mosquito bites this summer, Manchester householder should have a knowledge of mosquito habits and habitats.

South superintendent Horace E. Murphy says that "getting them at the spawning stage is too late. Since most mosquitoes cannot fly far, the water breeding places of those which bother householder are usually within a few hundred feet of the house."

Favorite water spots are at standing ponds and rain barrels, cisterns, cesspools, roof gutters, basements, tree holes, discarded tin cans and tires and under porches.

Householders should: 1. Eliminate all standing water. 2. Be sure sewage disposal program works. 3. Cover rain barrels and cisterns with wire screening.

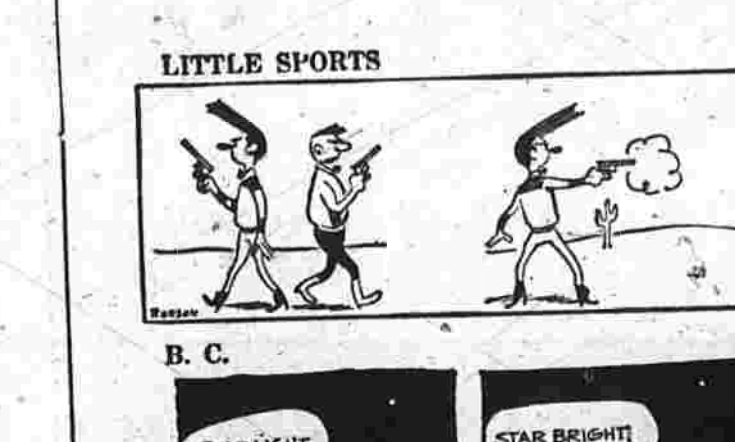
