Hal Boyle Life in a Desk: Story of a Man

New York (AP)—An office desk is the silent biographer of the man who works at it. Most desk drawers contain files dealing with the firm's business. But there is also usually a drawer in which the man who works at the desk keeps personal belongings.

Over the years the contents of this drawer tell by their mere mute presence the whole drama of his life — his hopes, his problems, his failures and his victories.

When the man is 25, the personal drawer of his shiny new desk is nearly empty. It contains the picture of a big-eyed, smiling girl in a low-cut gown, a razor (so he can shave at the office after work and not have to go all the way home to do so), a box of tissues, three cubes of sugar, a sheet of letters from girl friends and an invitation to a cocktail party.

There also is likely to be a note from his father saying, "Mother and I have talked it over and decided not to send you the money. It is for your own good. It is high time you got married, settled down and lived on your own income."

When the man is 35, his desk mirrors his growing responsibilities. It holds a picture of a sweet-faced young woman and two little girls in bathing suits, a packet of stomach mints, two packs of cigarettes, a cleaning rag, a box of aspirin, a cleaning rag, and six sugar cubes—for coffee breaks.

The razor is gone, but there is a well-thumbed copy of a book called "A Dozen Keys to Business Success," and a letter from a correspondence school telling him how he can learn to become an executive by mail.

When the man is 45, the desk drawer has much more to tell. It holds a half-empty box of aspirin tablets, two rolls of stomach mints, four packages of cigarettes, mints match packets, a bottle of antacid pills, a cleaning rag, and 12 sugar cubes.

There are also a roll of dental floss, a letter from the bank saying his account is overdrawn, and a note from his daughter in college saying, "I've don't tell mother, but I have to have \$25 extra this month...or life won't be worth living."

When a man is 55, the desk drawer gets really crowded. It has a dozen kinds of pills, capsules, tablets and bottled medicines. There are two pipes, a pouch of tobacco, and a book on "How to Give Up Cigarette Smoking."

There are letters from his wife who is visiting their first grandchild, letters from old friends trying to borrow money, a letter from the bank congratulating him on finally paying off the mortgage on his home, and two notes from his boss telling him out for lunch at the desk in settling a business matter.

At the bottom of the box's notes the man has scribbled dejectedly: "Who the hell does he think he is? I was running this job when he was in kindergarten!"

Naturally the cleaning rag is still there, and so are 24 sugar cubes.

When the man reaches 65, the desk drawer is stuffed with the debris of 40 years.

There are now 24 sugar cubes, a dead cockroach, a note from his boss praising him for his long service, a brand new copy of the company's revised pension program, a book on "Fifty Places to Retire to and live on \$2000 a year," and a memo from his dentist telling him to come in for his new set of upper teeth.

Slowly, thoughtfully, the man arises timidly, takes out the desk drawer and empties its entire contents into a wastebasket. He takes the cleaning rag, polishes the drawer, puts it back into the desk, and tosses the time-worn rag into the wastebasket.

He sits at the desk for a long moment, running his hand over its smooth top, then flicks away a last fleck of dust. He gets up, puts on his hat and coat and walks out the door for ever.

And the desk stands ready and waiting to begin the long chronicle of another man's life in the office.

Change Proposed In Execution Day

Friday as execution day was established by custom through the years. The State Supreme Court regularly meets on Mondays and Tuesdays, but must be called into extraordinary session if stay of execution petitions are filed on Wednesday or Thursday.

How a Lawsuit Begins

Lawsuits fall into two broad categories: civil and criminal. A criminal case is one where the State, as plaintiff, prosecutes an individual accused of a criminal offense. Civil cases, with which will deal today, are those in which an individual or business seeks money damages or relief from another individual or business.

Two main types of civil action are those arising out of a business transaction and those arising out of a personal injury. The latter type of case is known in legal language as a tort, and the most frequent kind of tort is a claim arising from physical injury caused by an automobile accident.

First, it has held, inferentially, and also to practical effect in this particular case, that the social security tax can be collected from one and all, but that it can be paid out according to the political last of whom of Congress. What Congress has done, with the law in question, would be comparable to the act of a private insurance company, if it tried to get out of paying policy benefits to some individual because after it had been collecting from him for years, it discovered that he had become, or had been all along, a Communist, a Socialist, or some other brand of political animal the insurance company didn't consider friendly to insurance companies. The motto Congress has set up by the law in question and the motto the Supreme Court has now undervritten might be said to read as follows: "From such according to his earnings; to such according to his politics."

In order to make such an inferential ruling, the Supreme Court first had to dispose of the silly idea that anybody who pays into a government insurance plan obtains, by that process, any individual vested interest in the plan.

Not Strictly Actuarial (continued)

We do understand quite clearly, of course, so one can get and get their money back out of social security just on the whim of it, or get pay in a lump at all unless the conditions prescribed by the system law for such payments are met. So to be most accurate, we do understand the contract between government and the individual to guarantee that the rights of an individual possessing same when he pays in are not altered by special or discriminatory adjustments.
