



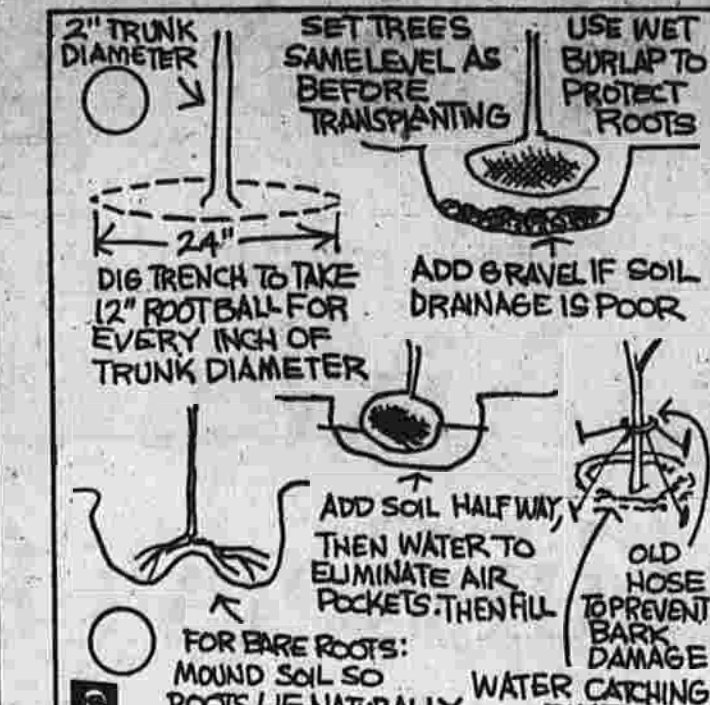


### Fall Is Fine Transplanting Time

As autumn is here, it is time to transplant trees and shrubs. There isn't any secret formula to transplanting trees. It is a fairly simple process if you follow certain basic steps. Here are five important ground rules:

1. Dig and move plants carefully. Do not break the topsoil. Prepare fertile planting soil. Plants are usually lightly watered. Add keep plants moist.
2. The fall planting season ends in the first leaves turn color. This is the best time to transplant. Fall trees are usually planted in the ground in an early spring start.
3. Healthy trees and shrubs are naturally better. Do not transplant a tree that is diseased or has been damaged by frost. Do not transplant a tree that is over 10 years old.

Air-Kut, operated by power takeoff, has enough force, according to inventor Carl Balkus, to be used as an ensilage cutter. Carried on a heavy welded frame, adjustable by remote hydraulic control, the machine cuts runners with a rotary blade, the inner vanes blowing air down and spreading weeds and runners to the side, the outer vanes sucking them up and shredding them.
