Bagpipes whirled a merry fare-the-well at Bradley Field in Windsor Locks yesterday afternoon.

The hubbub started about 4 o'clock, and the key attraction was the Fairfield Pipe Band and Dancers. They entertained on the taxi ramp in front of the terminal for nearly two hours before the passengers boarded their chartered Pan American flight to Glasgow.

When it came time to board the plane, the pipers and dancers formed a corridor for the passengers and serenaded their promenade to the plane ramp.

At the plane ramp, by this time, had checked their luggage and boarded the plane waving American flags and carrying cameras and smaller luggage bags in the other.

The rest of goodbye from the observation platform was almost as touching as the farewells.

Waiting on the apron for a takeoff signal from the tower, a few tears were shed, but they were obviously tears of jealousy. Some wished they were going away. Once you get through the airport, there is no going back.

### You Should Know... Sgt. George P. McCaughey

One of the strongest boosters and backers of the Police and Fire Athletic Assn. is Sgt. George P. McCaughey, 34, of Manchester Police Department. "Red," as he is familiarly known, is secretary of the organization, which sponsors a band and numerous athletic teams and groups such as football, basketball, baseball and bowling for the youth of Manchester.

The largest man on the local police force, standing 6 feet 2 1/2, and weighing 260 pounds, McCaughey became a superintendant in January 1944 at the age of 24.

Officer St. Year was the first man to become a probationary regular, and was appointed sergeant in 1954.

Prior to serving in the Army in World War II, he worked at Pratt and Whitney after leaving high school at the end of his junior year in 1939.

Rocoy was the only competitive sport McCaughey played while attending high school, although he never passed up a sandlot football game.

He didn't play football in high school, although he weighed over 200 pounds at that time.

His interest in sports and youth activities has remained strong through the years, as evidenced by the long hours he has devoted to this cause with the Police and Fire Athletic Assn.

McCaughey's military career started in 1943. It lasted for only two years but he took part in a number of the major Pacific campaigns, from New Caledonia to Japan, with stints at the Fiji Islands, Bougainville, and the Philippines.

Cited for Courage While at Bougainville, he won the Bronze Star for courageous action in the face of the enemy.

An assistant squad leader with the rank of corporal, his 12-man infantry squad was suddenly ambushed and pinned down by enemy fire.

Although three members of his squad were killed at the outset, he alone covered the successful retreat of the others with return fire of his own, and then managed to retreat himself.

He was later awarded two additional citations for acts of bravery, and came through the war without being wounded.

The only visible effect the war had on him was a large loss of weight. When discharged, he scaled 173 pounds.

His ability to work well and coolly under pressure and adverse dangerous conditions has paid off in his police work as well.

Only last summer, after the successful hold-up of the Community Restaurant at the North End, he worked continuously without sleep for 48 hours, investigating the case.

Finally, he walked the streets of Hartford in the Windsor St. section until he saw the man he was seeking and arrested him at gunpoint.

A lifelong resident of Manchester, he was born to Frank and Margaret McCaughey on Oct. 17, 1921. His father is still living.

In 1943 the future police sergeant married Anne Maclean of Williamstown, and there are now three young McCaugheys: Giovanni, 17, who just graduated from Manchester High, Leslie, 12, and Kim, 9.

They reside at 342 E. Center St. Aside from his activities with the Police and Fire Athletic Assn., he is a charter member of the Manchester Lodge of Elks and is a member of both the Bowdoin Police Assn. and the State Police Assn.

Fishing and shooting are McCaughey's hobbies. He prefers salt water fishing, and spends most of the hours of his vacation each year at Point of Woods, dangling a line in the ocean.

A member of the Revolver Club, he averages 280 out of a possible 300.

Won Three Trophies In the seven years he has been on this team, he has won three trophies one for high average and two for being the most improved shooter.

He refers to police work as being interesting, with something different occurring every day. He says:

scene of wrecked buildings, autos, shops and houses. Even a medical clinic was burned.

Government officials went to the section to address a crowd of more than 7,000, which refused to respond to appeals to disperse and return to work in the city's factories.

### Coroner Blames Dog In Horse-Truck Fatal

Tolland County Coroner, Edward J. Ackerman, ruled out any criminal negligence in a fatal dog-truck-horse accident June 12 that took the life of Mrs. Lucille R. Albas, 21, of Birch Mt. Rd., Bolton.

Mrs. Albas died instantly when a pickup truck whose driver spotted the dog, slowed to about 25 m.p.h. and blew his horn. He said the dog began walking off the highway but suddenly turned and ran back onto it. Mistretta slammed on the breaks and the truck skidded into the horse. The horse struck Mrs. Albas and threw her against a rocky embankment; she died instantly of a skull injury.
