From Your Neighbor's Kitchen

Fragrant Duck is a Chinese recipe served at a Chinese dinner meeting at a Manchester Gourmet Club, which has become a favorite with Mrs. Charles Hamilton, 91 Dale Rd.

Friends have asked frequently for the recipe since Mrs. Hamilton first served Fragrant Duck a year ago.

Fragrant Duck
 1/4 cups dark brown sugar
 2 teaspoons cinnamon
 2 cloves
 1 cup water
 1 tablespoon salt
 6 lb. duck
 2 teaspoons soy sauce
 2 teaspoons powdered ginger

Place the sugar in a saucepan and cook over low heat until it dissolves. Add half the cinnamon, the cloves, and the water. Cook to a syrup. Combine the salt and remaining cinnamon and rub into the duck thoroughly, inside and out. Place the duck on a roasting pan. Combine the soy sauce with soy sauce and ginger and mix well.

Four over the duck.

Roast in a 425 degree oven until golden in color, basting frequently, reduce the heat to 350 degrees and roast until tender, about two and a half hours in all, including browning time. Add additional water if the pan becomes too dry, and baste frequently. Cut the duck into small pieces to serve.

The Chinese serve the duck with a sauce made by mixing one-half cup of vinegar and three minced cloves of garlic. The duck bits are dipped into this sauce.

As a vegetable dish to accompany this entrée, Mrs. Hamilton serves peas with mushrooms and bamboo shoots.

Peas With Mushrooms
 1 pkg. frozen peas
 1 can diced bamboo shoots
 1/2 lb. fresh mushrooms or 1 cup canned
 2 thin slices Smithfield ham
 1 tablespoon oil
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 cup stock or 1 heaping cup dash monomodium glutamate

Peas can be used in the frozen state. Drain the diced bamboo shoots or drain whole bamboo shoots and slice thinly with the grain. Heat oil in a skillet; add peas, and fork apart as they thaw. Stir in bamboo shoots, mushrooms, salt, stock or bouillon cube dissolved in one cup of boiling water, and cook to the boiling point. Make a smooth paste of cornstarch and quarter cup of cold water, and stir into vegetable mixture along with monomodium glutamate. Cook until sauce thickens slightly. Sprinkle chopped ham over the top and serve.

Dr. and Mrs. Hamilton are members of a Gourmet Club, formed four years ago. Other members are Dr. and Mrs. W. T. Moore, Dr. and Mrs. Thomas M. Healy, and Dr. and Mrs. Walter Schaffel.
