New Focus On Health

In a case of **alcoholism**, a study of the effects of alcohol on the body is being conducted by the U.S. Public Health Service.

They may be both a comfort and a protection, report two University of Cambridge researchers in the *British Journal*.

"They tested the speed at which body temperatures fall in men given alcoholic beverages and then plunged into 50 degree water for 15 minutes.

"Alcohol did not speed the body temperature drop as previously believed," said Dr. W. R. Keatinge and M. Evans.

While drunkenness could clearly be dangerous, there was little reason why people forced into cold water after shipwreck should forego the relief that moderate amounts of alcohol can provide.

The relief itself may have survival value by reducing the risk of panic they said.

The only man who survived immersion in cold ocean water until rescue arrived after the sinking of the *Titanic* was said to have had considerable alcohol, they noted.

Muscle, Pain and Waterfalls

Some 6,000 dental patients in the Boston area have been subjected to a noisy sort of pain control, a researcher reports.

Ready for his dental operation, the patient dons earphones and is given a small hand device that controls whether he hears music or noise, and controls the volume.

As soon as the patient is ready, the noise stimulus is turned on, and the intensity of the noise stimulus—sound stimulus is varied.

The function of the music is to relax the patient, explains Dr. Wallace J. Gardner, Cambridge, Mass., dentist in the U.S. Journal.

But for most patients the noise is the main element—the one that draws out pain.

Experimentally the system has also been used by some Boston doctors in other operations such as child birth and the removal of tonsils with some effectiveness.

For Some, Time Stands Still

Among some mentally ill, time is a lost element, two Veterans Administration psychiatrists report.

They put a group of elderly mental patients, hospitalized for many years, to the test, asking the question: "How old are you?"

Of the 10 of the schizophrenics who answered gave their age at the onset of their illness, report Drs. Otto F. Ehrenthel and Peter H. Jenney in the *Archives of General Psychiatry*.

Time seemed to stand still for more schizophrenics than for patients suffering from other forms of mental illness, they said.

Hairy Ear Rims

Hairy ear rims are a prime clue to a scientific detective hunt that may show a genetic link between the Mediterranean race of Europe and the brown race of India, a researcher suggests.

The characteristic of hair on the ear rim is passed on through the chromosomes, reports Dr. R. Tuggles in *Genetics*, Cambridge, Mass., in the *Journal of Science*. This rhizome is passed on father to son.

The finding of this parental pattern of hairy ear rims in Italy and in the brown race of India is further evidence of a relationship between the two peoples, he said.

Boy or Girl?

For the number of years it has been possible to tell the sex of an unborn baby, the fourth month of pregnancy. But the method has dangers, requiring a puncture to the uterus and membranes to sample the fluid surrounding the fetus.

Sometimes this starts an abortion process.

Although the risk is not worthwhile merely to satisfy the curiosity of parents, it can have important uses, said Dr. Pavi Hille of Copenhagen County Hospital and Fritz Fuchs of the University of Copenhagen.

One of those is in hemophilia—a hereditary disease marked by abnormal bleeding which strikes only males though it is carried by females. In Denmark where some abortions are permissible to prevent births in which there is close hereditary risk to the child, the procedure is useful, they wrote in the *British Journal*.

French Receive Support Funds

Paris—In France, families receive social security payments covering prenatal and maternal care, maternity leave, housing, and the like, and one family in four benefits from family-allocation funds.

The payments were instituted to help arrest the declining birth rate, but, since the war, France has had one of Europe's highest rates.

Three million families receive support funds; the more children, the higher the payments.

Case Bros. Rescues Neighbor, Pays Water, Sewer Charges

Case Bros. Inc. last night moved to pay a \$868.74 assessment against a Spring St. man and wife who said they were too hardpressed to pay for water and sewer charges that would have been the paper company's bill.

Mr. Patrick A. Hellandbrand, 487 Spring St., protested the charges in tears during the public hearing in the Municipal Building. Her husband said their home has an artesian well, recently installed, and a septic tank. It would be a great hardship, he said, to pay the \$458.77 sewer assessment and \$410.97 water assessment.

Mrs. Hellandbrand said she would have to go to work to raise the money and didn't know how she could take care of her children.

The two were the only property owners other than Case Bros. on the assessment list for the utilities intended to benefit Case Bros.' proposed Lookout Mountain subdivision on the north and south sides of Spring St. adjacent to the proposed Metropolitan Homes subdivision.

Later on in the meeting, Mayor Eugene T. Kelly told the Hellandbrands that a representative of the paper company had told him before they spoke that the firm would handle their assessment. The representative was Hayden Griswold Jr., an engineer planning the Lookout Mountain subdivision.

The Board voted for the utilities with the condition that the company submit in writing its intention to pay the assessment.

It was learned on good authority that the Hellandbrands should be helped. That he worked toward this end, and that he knew the help was forthcoming before last night's meeting, Kelly himself could not be reached for comment.

And Mrs. George Harwath, 265 E. Middle Turnpike, and Fred Knoff, 77 E. Middle Turnpike, appeared pleased that their original assessments of \$48.03 and \$11.36 respectively were reduced to \$19.32 and \$12.52.

other system using pressurized water, like all other U.S. atomic submarine power plants, has been installed.

The Bargo was damaged last June 15 when fire broke out in an after compartment while the submarine was taking aboard liquid oxygen. To help quench the fire, it was necessary to flood the compartment. The Navy says the Bargo is due to return to operation about Nov. 1.

The huge radar picket submarine Triton, which earlier this year circled the world while submerged, went into drydock for routine inspection and overhaul not long after completing its record-breaking "shakedown" cruise on May 10.

The Triton is expected to be ready for return to the sea in about a week.

Up to now, 12 nuclear powered submarines, including three Polaris missile boats, have gone into the fleet. Another, the Polaris and Robert E. Lee, completed sea trials yesterday.

"Katanga troops will not fire first, and we do not intend any aggression," said Tombouze, "who said that the Belgian troops will be sent to Katanga only if they are necessary to ensure the independence of Premier F. Lumumba's Central Congo government."

"The U.N. troops try to land here," Tombouze continued, "that will be an act of aggression and we will oppose it."

Tombouze has a hard core of only 100 loyal Congolese and Belgian troops under about 100 Belgian officers, and police forces still undergoing screening to weed out the ultrarightist.

Army recruiting is going on steadily, in the case of the Belgian officers, but no new personnel have to be trained and they certainly will not be ready to fight the U.N. troops.

The premier said he had not been officially sent U.N. troops to Katanga, announced in Leopoldville last night by Hammarskjöld after the Belgian government agreed to pull its troops in Katanga and to let the U.N. troops take their place.

He also had no notification from the Belgians of their decision to send U.N. troops to Katanga.

However, Tombouze said that he had received a letter from the U.N. Secretary General, Ulf H. Eide, on Friday, in which the government's position was outlined.

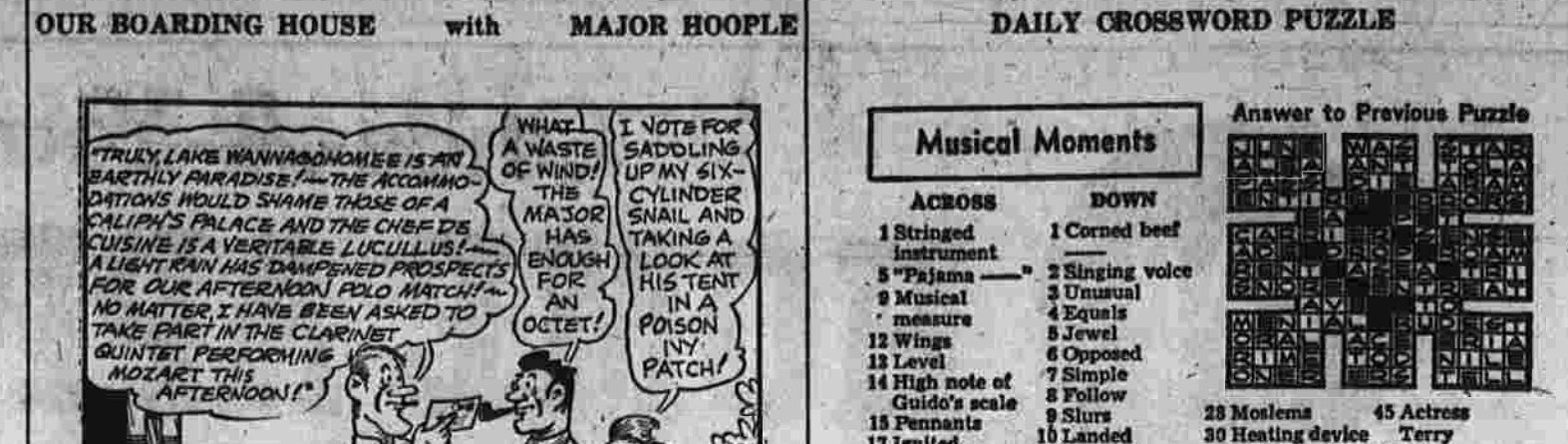

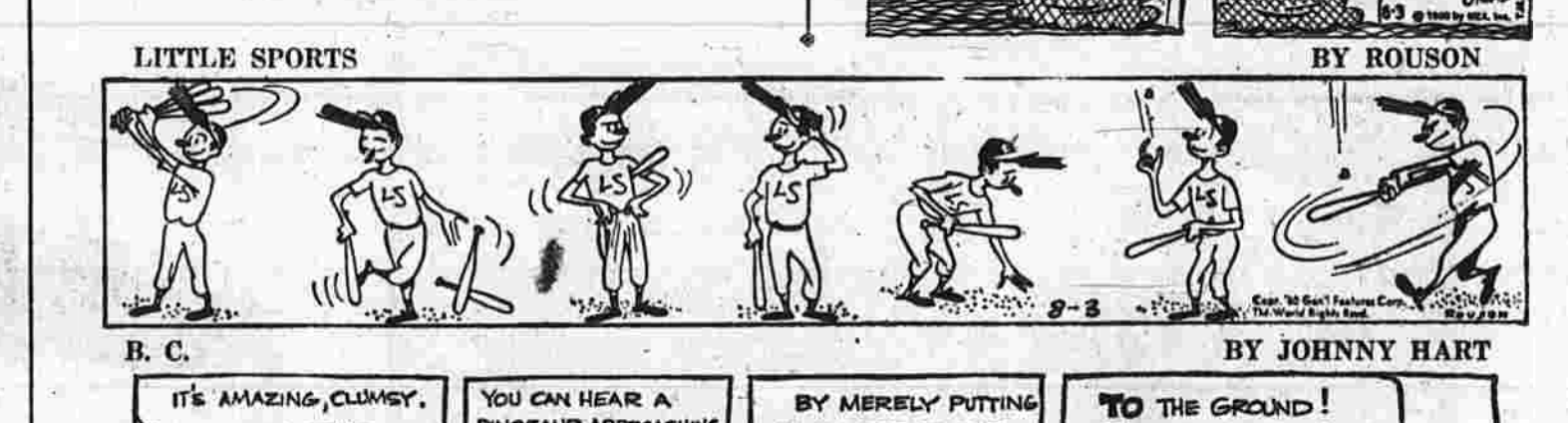

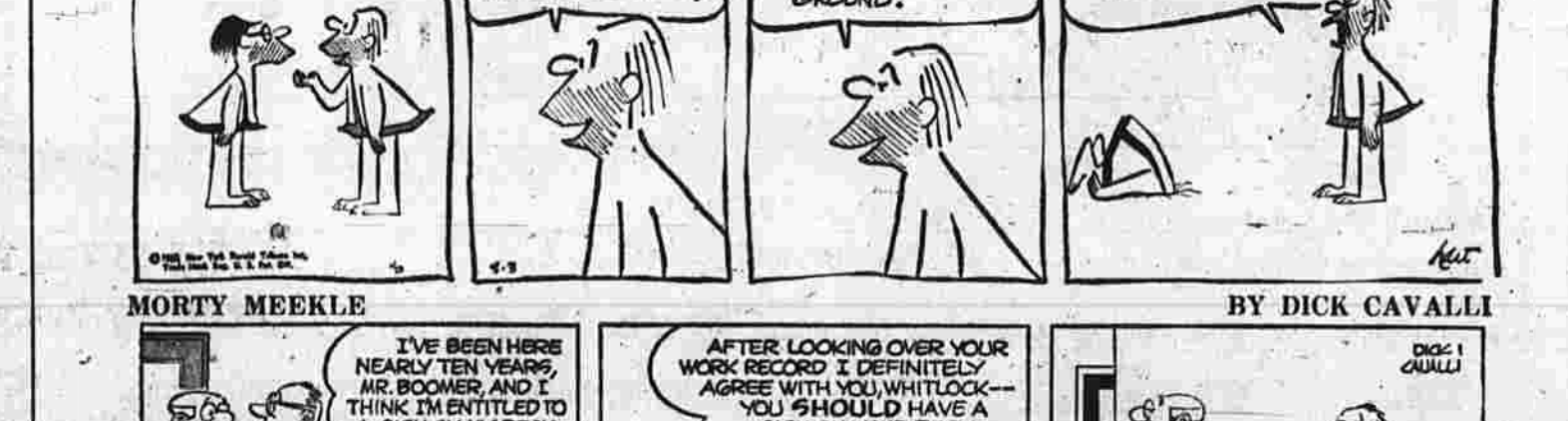
