NASA Plans on Fleet Of Standard Vehicles

Lawrence Welk Summer Replacement Now Successful Show

By CHARLES J. LEAVY
When Lawrence Welk and his Champagne Music made their debut on the ABC-TV Network July 2, 1955, it was just as a summer replacement. Audience reaction was so favorable immediately that the show continued and is now on its sixth successful year.

Over 50 million tune in Lawrence Welk coast-to-coast each week. Although he jokingly admits his fan mail is predominantly from "mothers," he receives plaudits by mail

from every age group; high school boys and girls, laborers, businessmen and even a fire department dispatcher in Brooklyn, are numbered in the cross section of his loyal fans.

Roads Own Mail
These fans are highly critical and Lawrence Welk accounts in part for the success of the show to his sincere and thorough care in reading each and every fan letter that he receives.

"I have always firmly believed that by taking care of my television audience, they will take care of me," Lawrence says. "This is a basic principle of good public relations, but it's surprising how many experts in the field don't always practice it, and as a result, go by the way."

Along these lines, another reason that accounts for his success is a stubborn nature. Welk recalls one pre-televised meeting with those who suggested the addition of such gimmicks as a line of pretty girls and ballet dancers to add excitement to the show.

Welk listened, characteristically pressed his hands together and said, "Gentlemen, no."

He insisted on presenting simply "music people want to hear." This stubborn nature and his industrious care to consider his fans' criticisms have, at times, presented difficult problems for the Champagne King.

His decision to use a number of different Champagne Ladies resulted in an outcry from many loyal fans who felt the show would not be the same without Alice Lon. However, Welk weighed the issues and firmly decided to go along with his decision. He does say, however, that if a singer comes along who has all the qualities to fit smoothly into the job, he won't hesitate to go back to a regular Champagne Lady.

"Come to think of it," notes Welk, "if I hadn't been persistent in my youth, Lawrence Welk wouldn't be on television. My folks were strongly opposed to the idea of me going into show business but that good old Germanic stubbornness was just as strong

in me as it was in my parents."

Takes After Dad
A farmer by trade, musician at heart, Welk's father, an Alsatian immigrant, settled on a fertile plot of land near Strasburg, N. D., where he built a simple home and raised a family of four boys and four girls. The next to the youngest boy, christened Lawrence, inherited many of his father's fine traits, including love of music.

While still a toddling youngster, Lawrence showed interest in his father's old-fashioned accordion which he brought with him from Europe. The instrument is still in the Welk family. During the evenings, when the elder Welk played the instrument for relaxation after the chores, little Lawrence was by his side.

By the time he was 13, Lawrence had learned to play the accordion passably well, without having taken a lesson. But he was

talented enough to serve up the music for the community dances and to be featured on church and social programs in the community.

Lawrence's folks eventually saved enough money to buy him a new accordion with a piano keyboard. Lawrence still considers the event one of the most moving moments of his life. The beautiful instrument with sparkling rhinestones proved to be a genuine inspiration to him. He studied ardently and practiced at every spare moment, after working in the fields all day.

Several years later he left the farm and started on the road as an accordion soloist. His showmanship and fine playing soon put him in demand throughout the vicinity of the Black Hills.

Later in Aberdeen, S. D., Lawrence formed his first "orchestra," consisting of drums and accordion. Eventually augmented by a saxo-

phone and piano, this combination went to Yankton, arriving the day of the inaugural broadcast of radio station WNAX, one of the pioneer stations of the Middle West. He was invited to present his small band on a daily program; his first appearance on the airwaves. By 1927, Lawrence Welk's orchestra had grown to six pieces, and was known as the "Biggest Little Band in America."

Feature Many Instruments
As the years passed, Lawrence became pre-occupied with the thought of giving a distinctive touch to his music... a sound that would set it apart from other orchestras, making it recognizable the moment it was heard. After experimenting with various arrangements, giving prominence to various instruments, he hit upon a grouping of instruments which created a bouncing, effervescent effect. He liked it and had the style employed in all his arrangements. Because of its lightness in quality and bubbling flow, it was labeled "Champagne Music."
