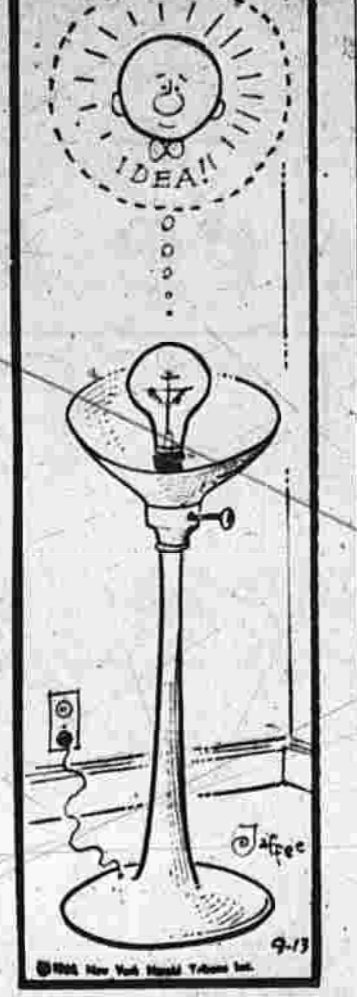

Under each part, the federal share would be at least 50 per cent in states of lowest per capita income. But in many cases states would not have to put up a cent to get the extra aid, age assistance money, at least at the outset.
Eisenhower also signed into law a so-called anti-payroll bill aimed at eliminating deceptive TV-radio practices exposed by congressional investigations.
The bill, outlawing quiz show fixing and payoffs, is an outgrowth of headlines-making House inquiries into fraudulent TV shows and undercover payoffs to disc jockeys by record promoters.
Although the Senate stripped the bill of some stiff penalties provided for by the House, provisions contained in it still provide power for the government to prosecute adequately and justly with respect to deceptive broadcasting practices.
Rep. Gen. Harris (D-N.Y.), principal author of the bill and chairman of the subcommittee which introduced the legislation, said the measure to Eisenhower.
Perhaps the most significant feature of the bill is a provision for fines. This is designed to give the Federal Commission more flexibility in policing the broadcasting industry by authorizing it to raise wrongdoers' television and radio fines to a maximum of 10 days.
When first passed by the House, the bill carried no limitation on how much a station could be fined and also wrote in specific procedures under which broadcast stations were to be fined by the FCC could appeal to the courts for review.
