To Take
A mistaken use of a Christian term is to call anything that happens to us "a cross." You often hear the casual religiousist rather than the devout Christian, comments "It's just a crozier" referring to some event, accident, or trouble that has befallen him. This is a misnomer. A traffic mishap, a broken leg, a cut in salary, a contagious child, a bolt, a flat tire—the list is endless—have one common factor: They happen to you. You didn't take them or choose them. The cross is always taken. What we choose, what we support to do, what we sacrifice, what we undertake (not because of some pleasurable experience expected, but because of some cost, discomfort, inconvenience, or loss of reputation) is more correctly called "a cross." Basically, we take it because down deep we want that, and God's will compels us to follow Christ. Only that which is voluntarily assumed is "a cross." "Him that would bear the cross" is what Jesus meant if you would follow Him, take yours.

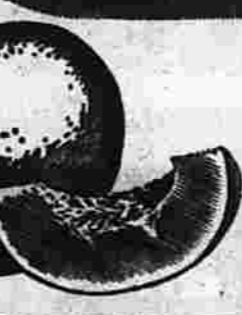

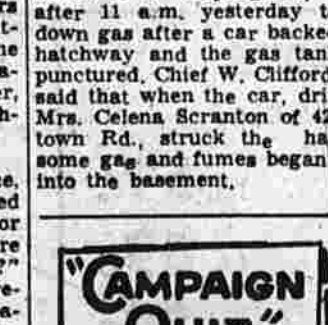

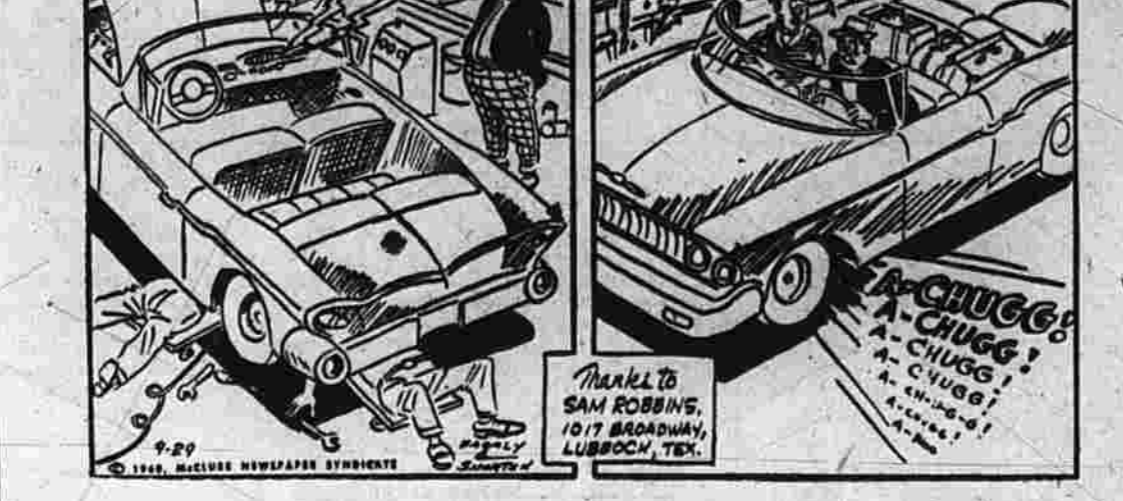
