The United Arab Republic is deeply involved with the USSR and often has exhibited hostility to the West. President Sukarno of Indonesia is being advised by the chief of the Indonesian Communist party who traveled to the United States with him. Prime Minister Nehru of India supports the Communist line on the issue of Red China's membership and some others, although the West considers him basically a friend.
Those were the sponsors. The outcome of the struggle over the neutralist resolution likely would have little bearing one way or the other on their attitude regarding future issues before this assembly. But the United States still has an opportunity to convince the other Asians and Africans that its policy of opposing the resolution were valid.
The President can hardly place himself in the position of permitting the United States to be directed by the wishes of a government which claims to be neutral, to do something he considers to be against the best interests of the United States.
The United States is explaining to the other Asian and African nations what it had believed to be the reality. That President Eisenhower would have been ready to simply asking East-West contacts without specifying the U.S. Chief Executive and the Soviet premier by name. The President has plenty of reasons for objecting to a man who has so rudely insulted and vilified his country.

Americans also are explaining to the Asians and Africans that the United States regards U.N. actions seriously and that should the President's resolution be adopted, the President's resolution and the U.S. Communist, on the other hand, have insulted U.N. actions, as can be amply demonstrated in the record.
The United States has been in positions like this before, and has managed in the past to weather temporary storms.
When the United States voted against what Africans and Asians considered their interests on a question concerning North Africa and on the question of the French atomic explosion in the Sahara, just to select a few examples, there was much calamity howling. Americans were told they had done themselves irreparable damage that they could no longer hope for friendship from the Asians and Africans.
But it did not work out that way. U.S. prestige held firm. One reason for this was the activity of the Communist themselves. Every time the United States goes into a jam, the Communists do something to ease the pain. Their threats and bullying and their aggressive inertia have cancelled out events which might have reacted permanently to U.S. harm.
And the Communists, being what they are, can be expected to do again.
