Great Debate Looms Over 'Great Debate'

New York, Oct. 12 (AP)—A great debate appears to be shaping up over — of all things — the "great debate" between the presidential candidates.

Sen. John F. Kennedy has accepted a network offer to make television available for a fifth debate early in November.

But Vice President Richard M. Nixon is cool to the idea and has suggested that instead of a fifth debate he and Kennedy expand their fourth joint appearance to two hours.

Kennedy has not yet replied. Originally, four one-hour debates were scheduled. Two already have been held and the third is set for tomorrow night.

The proposal for another debate "Around Nov. 2" was made in a telegram Saturday by three Democratic senators. The National Broadcasting System and the American Broadcasting Co. agreed to give television and radio time and the Mutual Broadcasting System offered its radio network facilities.

The Kennedy camp feels that the Senator did so well in the first two debates that still another one would be beneficial to him. They also believe that, with the last

that his schedule was "too tight" to permit a TV debate after Oct. 28.

Meanwhile, ABC announced that the split-screen TV debate tomorrow night will be the most difficult and most complicated to mount in broadcast history.

Nixon will be in Hollywood and Kennedy will be in New York. Campaign schedules prevent them from debating face-to-face as in the past.

Identical TV studio sets have been erected in both cities. The sets, predominantly mustard-colored, will contain what the network describes as a combination podium and desk. Each candidate may stand or sit as he chooses.

Studio lighting also has been duplicated in each set and both candidates have been requested to wear the same shade of attire.

More than 200 technicians will be involved in the first debate and NBC the second.

Professor Rollins Sets Retirement

Professor Howard A. Rollins, head of the Department of Plant Science at the University of Connecticut, is retiring after having been on the College of Agriculture staff for the past 30 years.

Announcement of his retirement was made today by University President Albert N. Jorgensen.

Rollins' resignation will become effective Jan. 31, 1961.

He joined the staff at the University in 1930 as an Extension fruit specialist. For the next 15 years he was named head of the Plant Science Department.

An eminent figure in the fruit research field, Rollins has held many state and national offices in horticultural organizations. He is the author of more than 30 Extension bulletins and circulars on fruit growing and has had many feature stories on this subject printed in some of the leading horticultural magazines.

In 1959 Rollins was elected president of the American Society of Horticultural Science. The Society is made up of more than 2,000

Ike's Aid Attacks Lodge Plan to Aid Parochial Schools

Sacramento, Calif., Oct. 12 (AP)—Henry Cabot Lodge's proposal for federal aid to parochial schools "makes no sense" says fellow Republican Arthur S. Flemming, President Eisenhower's secretary of health, education and welfare.

The Secretary told a news conference yesterday the proposal of the GOP vice presidential candidate is an idle gesture because Congress wouldn't approve it.

Lodge's proposal to give aid to parochial elementary and secondary schools exceeds the recommendations of his running mate, Vice President Richard Nixon, Flemming said.

But he said he didn't know whether Nixon will later extend his own proposals beyond providing federal help just for sectarian colleges.

Last year's exports totaled more than \$8,000 tons, worth \$33,600,000. The United States buys more than 68 per cent of India's cashew exports. New buyers are Japan, Iran, and West Germany.

This indicates that movement of the background induces perception of motion in the toad, just as it does in humans when, for example, the moon seems to be moving among sitting clouds. The story is told in Science by Walter Kaess, University of Connecticut, psychologist, and Francis Kaess of Storrs, Grammar School.

Chinese Mathematics
Commentator China claims it is very active in research in mathematics, the backbone of science. Support for the claim is found in an extensive survey made by the American Mathematical Society with collaboration of Wayne State University. The society will make results of Chinese mathematical research available to U.S. scientists.

Mining Link
By evolutionary theory, life began in the ancient sea, with man and other forms of life evolved from simple, one-celled organisms. Man's ancestry can be traced back to a type of jawless fish, known as myxinoidea, the most ancient vertebrates, says Donald D. Jensen, Indiana University psychologist.

But what was the link between them and simpler, spineless animals? Jensen thinks it could be a group of flatworms, named hoploplanetes. They have similarities with myxinoidea in such organs as body muscles, pituitary gland, horny teeth, a backbone-like structure, digestive and circulatory systems, and sense organs and brain, he points out.

Buried Treasures
A new device using the echo-sounding principle is being developed at the University of Pennsylvania Museum to help locate buried archeological treasures. Electrical probes and magnetometers have already proved useful in locating hidden canals, Roman villas, and other prizes and monuments of societies long gone. The new probe will add a new scientific tool.

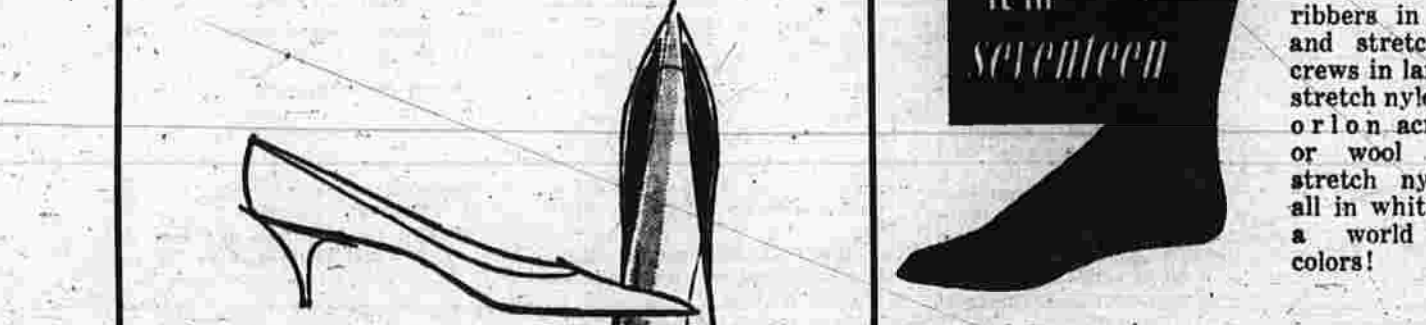

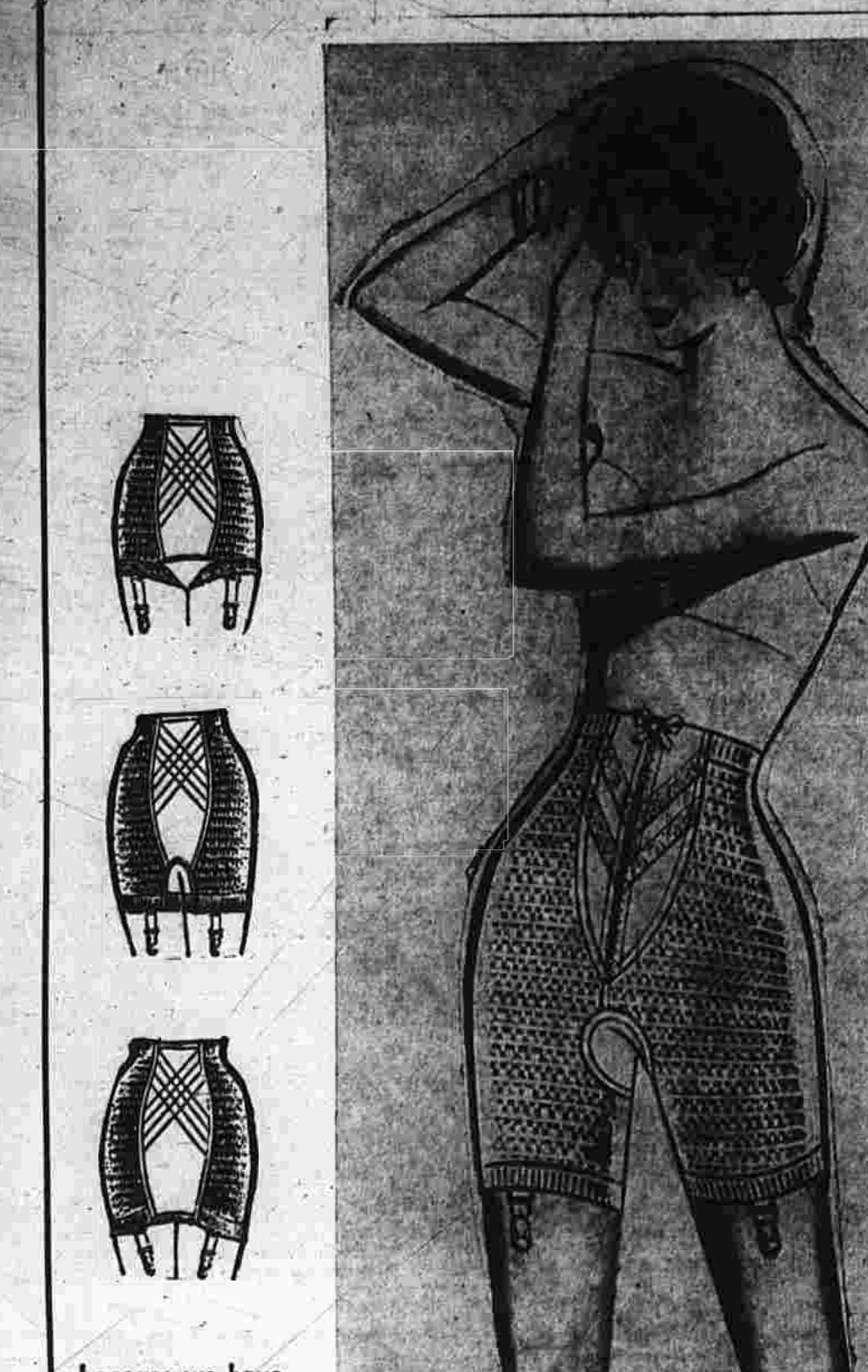

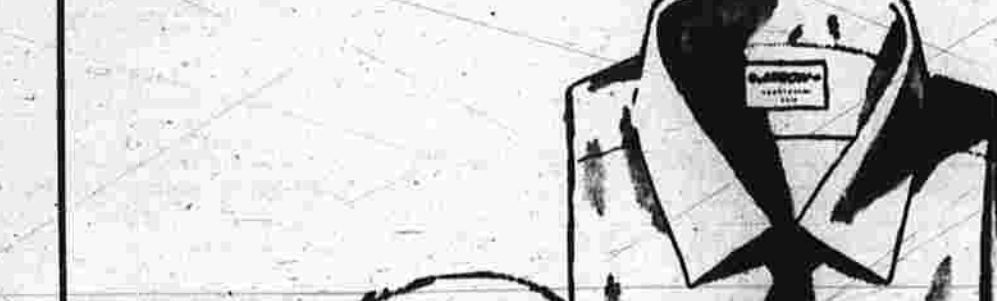
