Bob Hope to Bare Potomac Madness

Hollywood — (NEA) — Where there's a Hope, there's the political barb. Not as potent as it once was but still airborne.
The last of the big-time comedians willing to brave the pitfalls of TV's self-created censorship and the perils of its newly discovered hardrock "honesty," Bob Hope brings a one-hour original political farce titled "Potomac Madness" to home screens tonight.
In a way the show is sort of an electronic "Road to Washington"

idea reminiscent of those movie "Roads" Bob once traveled with Bing Crosby and Dorothy Lamour. For TV, his playmates are Perry Como and Ginger Rogers.
But the partisan quips and barbs which Bob once tossed, spearing all and sparing none, will be missing. The show, you might say, is "The Middle of the Road to Washington" because that's what Bob admits it is.
Nixon and Kennedy, as individuals, will not be Bob's targets. "We're playing it down the middle," he told me during a break in the pre-taping session at NBC's big Burbank Studio. "We kid about both of their ages with the line: 'How come they're running for president — there must be other ways to keep juveniles off the streets,' but otherwise the jokes are about Washington mores and the game of politics."
The most satirical dart, in fact, is aimed in another direction —

at NBC. Since the show will be on the network dedicated to "honesty" (following the quiz show scandals) an actor pretending to be an NBC vice president will say (in effect) at the show's conclusion: "This is NBC, the honest network. We would like all of you to know we were only kidding."
Plot of the farce, with music and lyrics by the ever popular Sammy Cahn and Jimmy Van Heusen, finds Bob as cornball Gov. Gaylor Goober, running for president.
But Ginger Rogers, playing the richest woman in the world and the power behind the Washington scenes, decides her favorite crooner, Perry Como, should win—and he does.
The Cahn-Van Heusen songs written for the show, to be aired just 17 days before the presidential election, include "Playing Politics," "I've Got Charm" and "Where Else but the U.S.A."
As the gal with 90 million dollars, Ginger will wear \$10,000 worth of furs and gowns, all of which will go back to Don Loper's showroom in the morning. Hope has done book shows on TV in the past, but this is his first with an original expressly written for TV.

David Rose Batons the music—and Bob made a golf date with Ike early in October to help make a few preshow headlines and wisecracks.
In the show's mad windup, "President" Como goes to a Las Vegas hotel to keep a singing engagement and loser Bob becomes a hero when he wins millions in a Vegas gambling casino, balancing the nation's budget.
Como's singing of "It Could Happen to You" in the Las Vegas hotel is a cue for a line which becomes a laugh getter:
"The next voice you hear will be the President of the United States."
But the last voice you hear on the show will be that NBC "vice president" telling you that "Oh, Perry and Ginger—that NBC—were just kidding."
And that's a laugh line, too.
