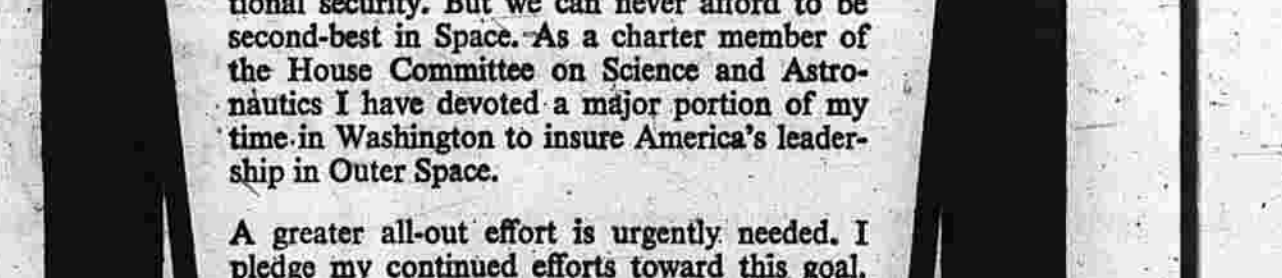

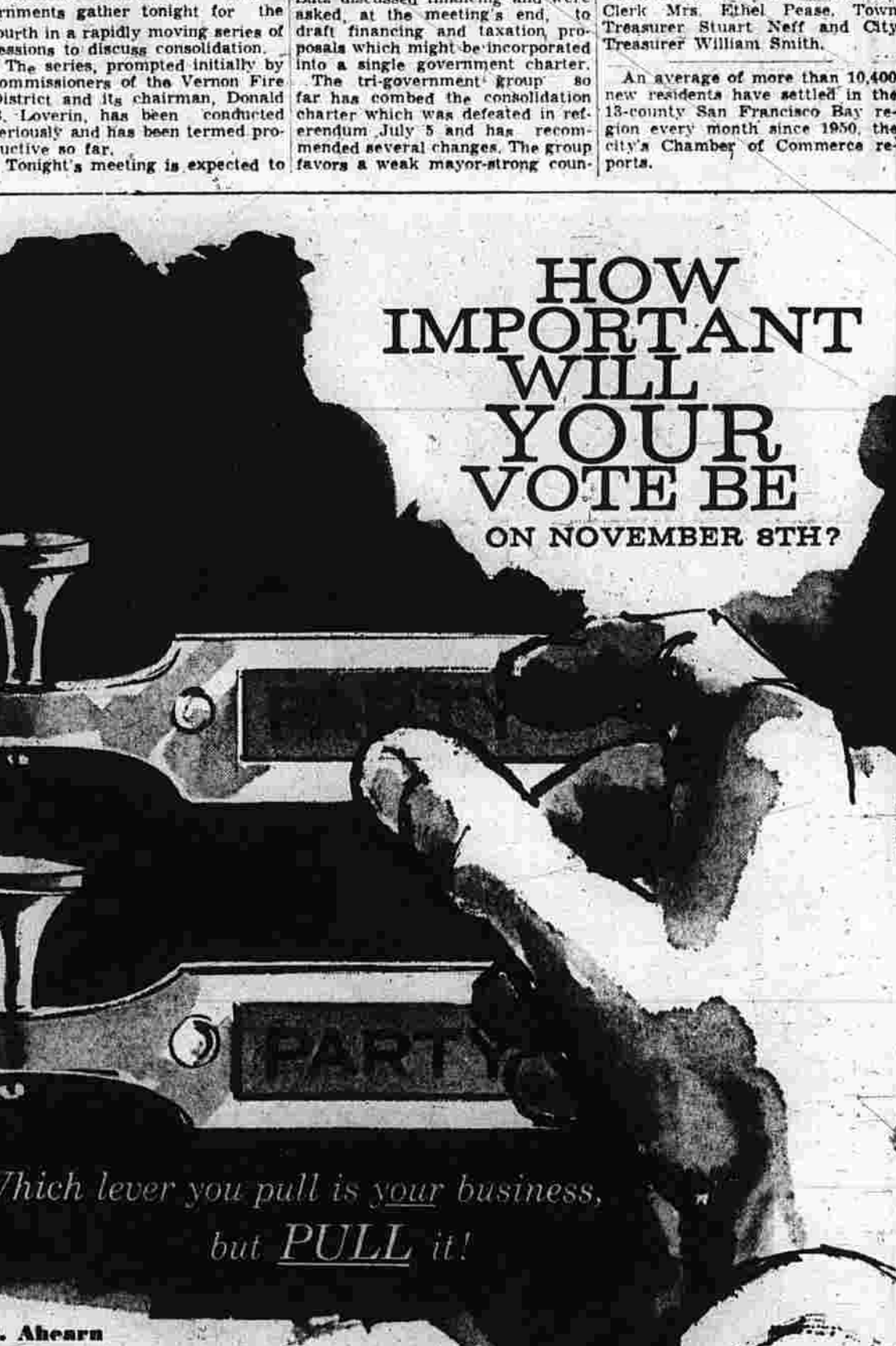

But by far the biggest roar of approval — punctuated by some rebel yells — came when Eisenhower referred to the South as a long-time staunch defender of states' rights "to its great and everlasting credit."

Eisenhower — peering in academic cap and gown — delivered that part of his speech with more vigor than any of the rest, and the crowd loved it.

All told, he was interrupted 18 times during his speech — eight of them when he was talking about states' rights.

On arrival in Houston the President was met by former Texas Gov. Allan Shivers who beamed Eisenhower in 1952-56 and now heads Texas Democrats for Nixon and Lodge. Also on hand was Mrs. Oveta Culp Hobby, former secretary of welfare in the Eisenhower administration and president of the Houston Post. The newspaper has endorsed Nixon.

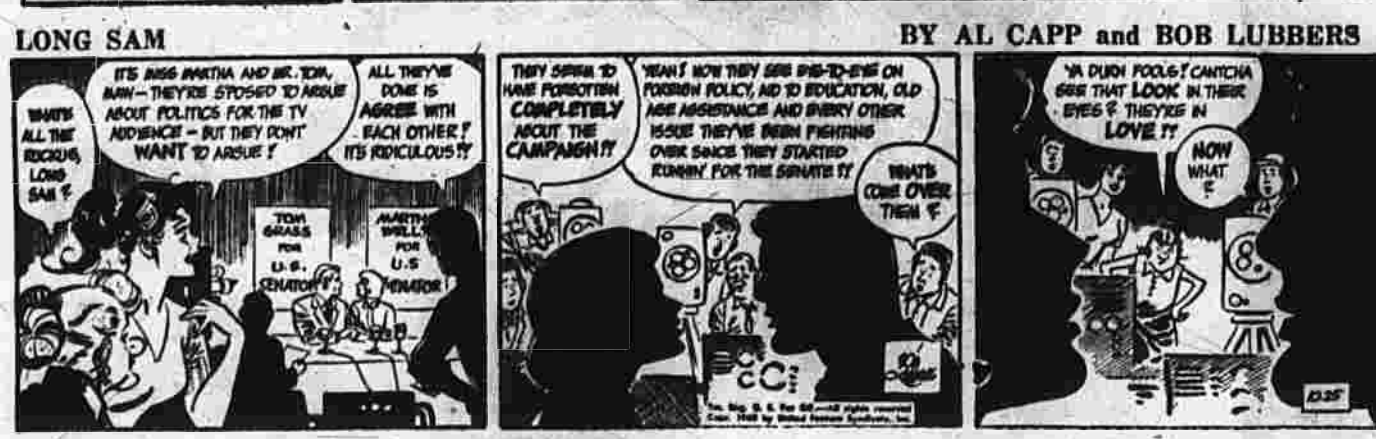

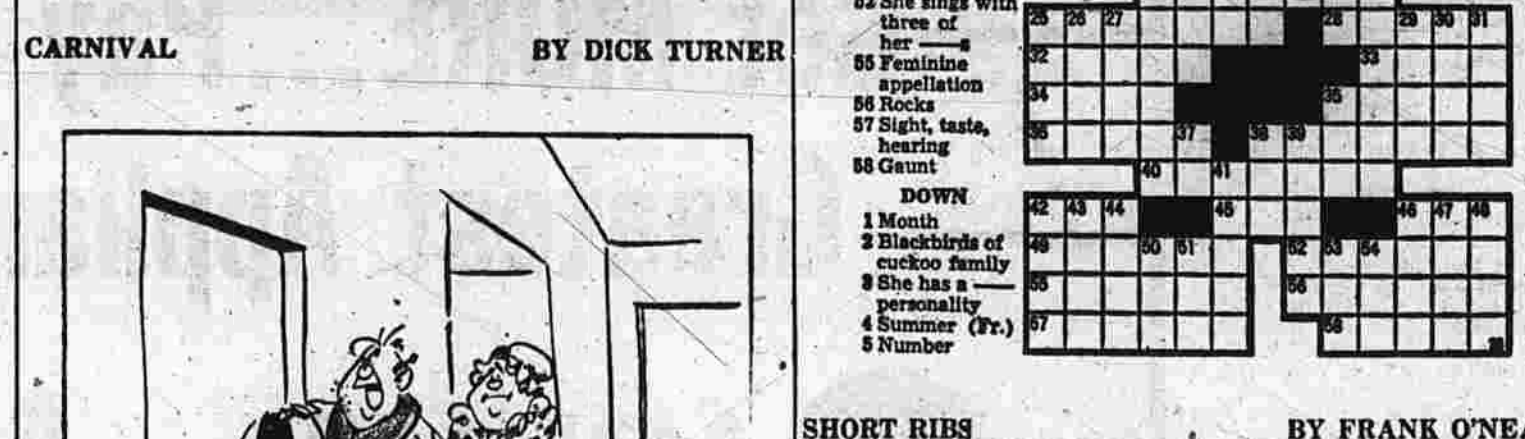
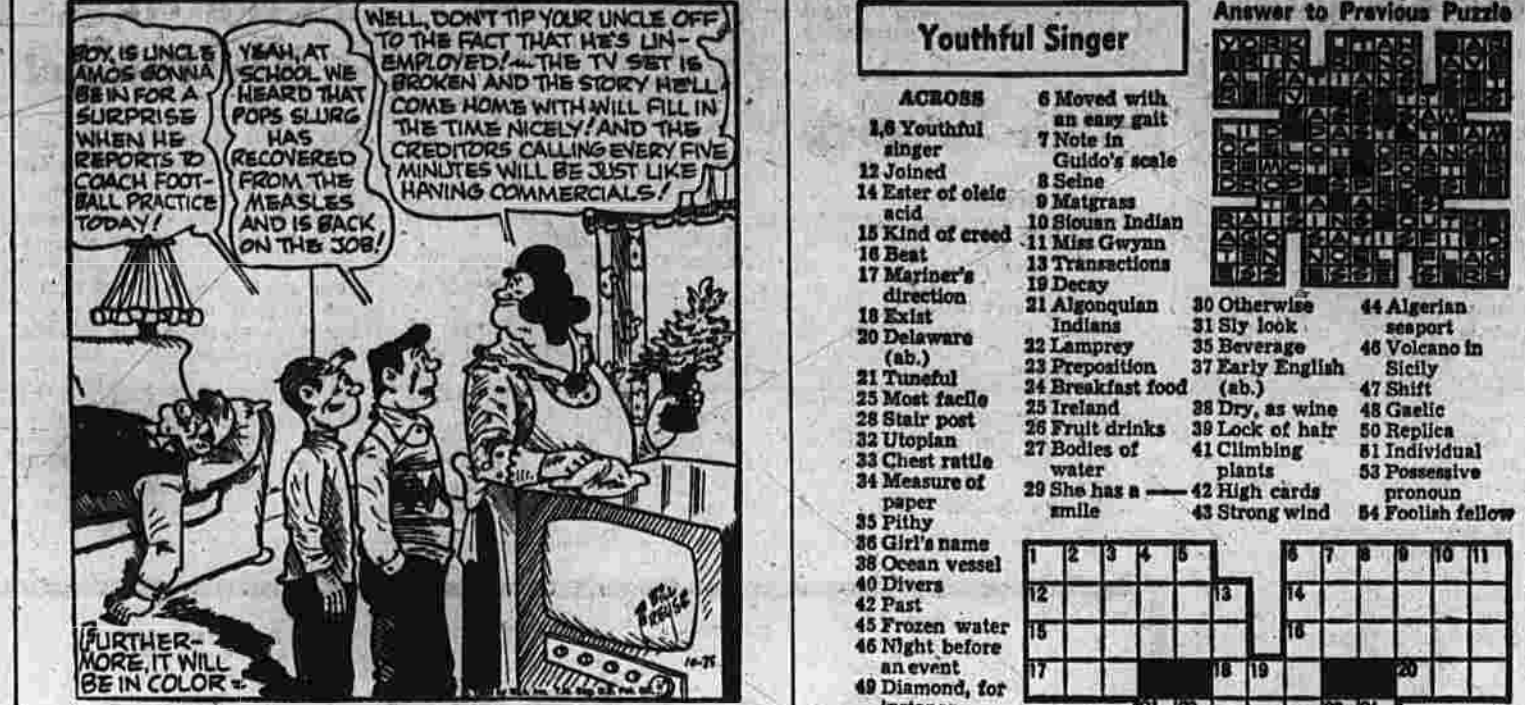
