Danny Kaye Debuts On CBS Tomorrow

Hollywood —(NEA)—Television's most celebrated holdout and the most talented entertainer of them all—Danny Kaye—shrugged his sport-jacketed shoulders when the CBS-TV cameraman asked the question: "Where are you going to go?"

show comes to home screens Sunday evening, Oct. 30. With Danny's shrug came a smile and the words: "I would be delighted to tell you where I'm going to go—if I knew. But I don't know. If something happens I'll be there so just follow me."

That's what the camera crew did—and it was like following an egg-shaped tumbleweed in a hurricane because that's the way Danny Kaye works. The rays of the morning sun high in the Beverly Hills burnished Danny's yellow bathrobe, his sandy hair and his freckles, and he pulled the Venetian blind cord before returning to his office—and to his first words about "Television and Me."

That wondrous film, last shown in 1957, was about his work with the world's needy children for the United Nations Welfare Fund.

In the show, for which his wife, Sylvia Fine, resumed her role of the lyric writer Danny likes best, he worked "exactly like I work on the stage." Although taped in advance, the cameras caught the hour show in one full 60-minute session (with an audience of 400) because of Danny's theory: "I wanted to catch the spirit of a whole, uninterrupted show for its culminative effect. We have a few imperfections but we decided not to retape them. They are the imperfections of spontaneity and I like 'em."

\$4.5 Million Spent On TV Campaign

One of the television trade magazines, "Broadcasting," has made a careful tabulation in its current issue showing that the bill for network television campaigning by the national candidates comes close to \$4.5 million—of which about \$2.8 million was absorbed by the three major networks without charge to the political parties or campaigners.

The four candidates by election day will have received a total of 21 1/2 hours of network time free, while the total paid time comes to 14 hours and 35 minutes—a grand total of 36 hours and 5 minutes of exposure. Vice President Nixon has had 30 minutes less of camera time than Sen. Kennedy—but only because he so far has declined the invitation to appear on CBS's "Face The Nation" program. Otherwise, the unpaid TV time is very carefully balanced.

Broadcasting magazine estimates that the Democrats are spending \$865,000 on their political broadcasts and the Republicans \$787,000, much of the money being invested in five-minute spots.
