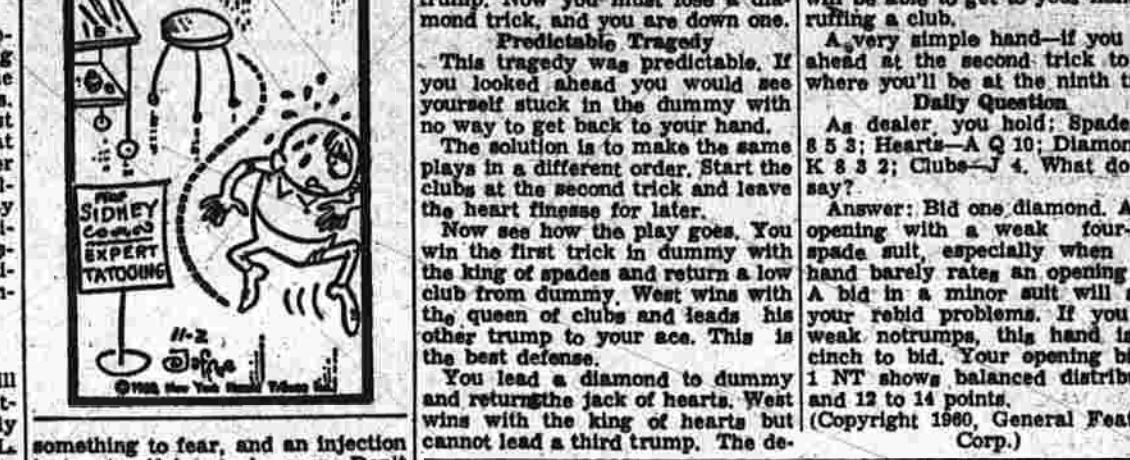

In just one week the 1960 presidential race will be over, and Pat Nixon or Jackie Kennedy can set it down to the serious problem of what to do about the White House draperies.

It is just seven more days every body will know for sure who the next president will be, and the many-faceted political battle that preceded it will be part of American folk lore.

At the beginning of the race an English newspaperman remarked, "I can't get interested in a controversy between two Americans and the Law of the Pack."

It also seemed to be pretty well agreed on all sides that if Dwight Eisenhower were able to run again he could beat Nixon-Kennedy ticket early in the morning, and still arrive at the 18th hole in time for lunch.

Somehow, however, that early atmosphere of wisecracking satire and political indifference vanished. Two factors probably influenced the change:
