Rockville-Vernon Water Official Alays Fears Of Shortage if Surplus Sold

An official of the Rockville-Vernon Water and Aqueduct Co. said today the Rockville community need not worry that the water company will leave its present consumers high and dry.

Edward F. Williams, president of the Water Service Inc., which owns the Rockville water supply, said the company's proposal to sell surplus water to other municipalities would not affect the amount of water available to present consumers.

The company has petitioned the State Water Resources Commission for permission to sell not more than 100,000 gallons a day out of the service area, which includes Rockville and portions of Vernon, Tolland and Ellington.

The population in those towns, Williams said, "could double or even increase four times in the next 10 years and there would still be plenty of water for consumers in Rockville and the surrounding communities."

According to the proposal, the company would sell water not to exceed the 100,000 gallons a day to the Connecticut Water Co. which serves the towns of East and South Windsor, Suffield, Thompsonville, Windsor Locks and Warrenton Point.

The proposed contract, Williams said, "also recognizes (the water company) primary obligation to supply its franchise area with an abundant supply of water... any excess water can be sold outside the franchise area under this contract."

He said the yield from Lake Umbagog (Sulpice) in the next few years has been conservatively estimated by engineers at 15,000,000 gallons a day. He said that excess water can be sold outside the franchise area under this contract.

Any permission granted by the State Water Resources Commission, he went on, "would be for a period of not in excess of 10 years. It would be subject to review for a longer period of time."

The Connecticut Water Co. has made known Nov. 10. Williams said the sale of excess water outside the franchise area would be of financial benefit to present Rockville area customers in that it would postpone the need for a rate increase.

The Connecticut Water Co., which would purchase the excess water, has indicated it will seek a rate increase within the next year.

With the announcement of the water company plan, Rockville and Vernon officials indicated they would investigate thoroughly the proposal. Mayor Leo B. Finley Jr. said an engineer from Bunk and Buck, consulting firm in Hart-

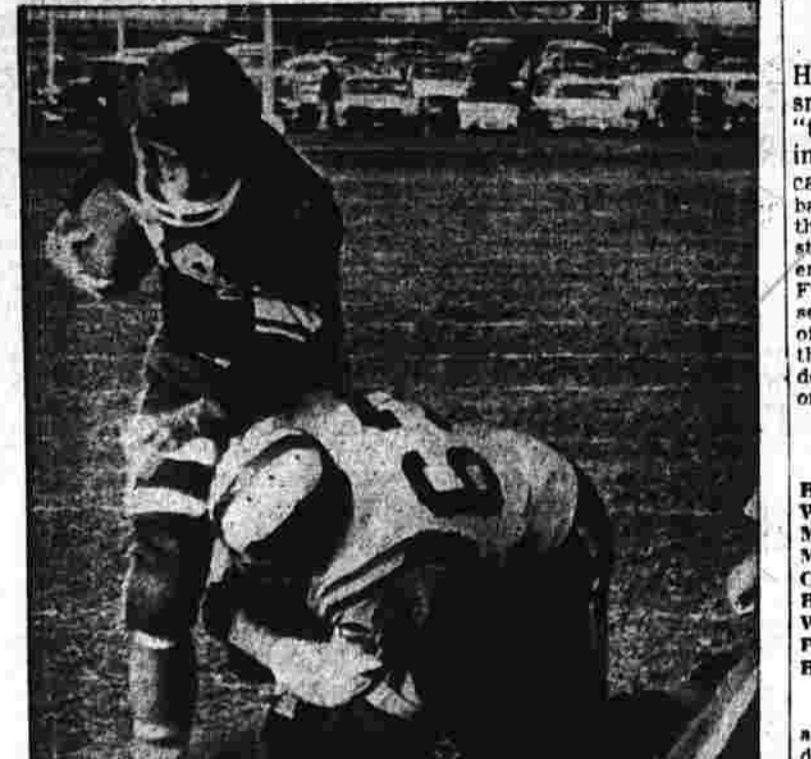
