Treat today's hand as a problem. You're supposed to win 12 tricks as nothing no matter how the missing cards are divided and no matter how cleverly the opponents defend. All you can assume about the defense is the opening lead.  
Clearly the diamonds are going to break 4-0 since with any other break you could put your cards down on the table and claim your hand... without getting an involved that you lose the hand if the diamonds break normally.  
The correct play begins with the queen of spades from dummy at the first trick. Then lead a low diamond from dummy.  
If East shows out, take the ace of diamonds and lead a low diamond back. West must play low since you would have the rest of the diamonds if he put up the king. This permits you to win a second diamond trick with dummy's queen.  
Sam Assured  
Now you return to your hand with the king of spades and lead the jack of hearts for a finesse. Whether the finesse wins or loses the ace is assured with three spades three hearts, two diamonds and four clubs.  
How would this line of play work if East had the four missing diamonds? At the second trick, West would follow suit with a diamond.

**District Delays Action On 2 Major Projects**

Action was tabled last night by the Eight District directors on a proposed addition to the North End Parkhouse and the sewage treatment plant expansion.  
The decision was reached at the monthly meeting of the directors at the North End Parkhouse, according to Eighth District President Russell Miller, a Manchester building contractor, presented the proposal to the directors and a bid for the proposed 20 by 50 foot firehouse building. Directors will vote after contractors to submit proposals.  
Henry Buck, senior partner in the Hartford engineering firm of Buck and Buck, told the directors that attorneys for his firm and the district must now work out details of the project.  
Atty. John D. LaBelle, district counsel, will discuss with the directors the possibility of making an agreement with district directors' attorneys on the project.  
LaBelle suggested that directors also discuss with him, at that same meeting, progress he is making on revising the charter, job plan, drawing him by the directors.  
There was considerable discussion among directors and Fire Chief John Metz about the high fire danger areas within the district.  
Heading the list, according to Metz, is the old Son Ami building on Hillard St. The directors were told that the sprinkler system in the building has been abandoned and that the only hydrant in operation outside the building does not have adequate pressure.  
The directors voted to send two letters in hopes of getting the situation remedied. One will go to the Manchester Water Co., requesting that an additional hydrant be placed immediately at the building on Hillard St.  
The other letter will go to the new owners of the building, Leonard Rubin, Stuart Carlson and Jack Hunter, all of Manchester, and Irving Eagle of New Haven. They will be asked to place a hydrant on Electric St. near Loomis St. which would be connected to a buried 200,000 gallon water tank that is nearby.  
It was also decided to set up a meeting in the near future with representatives of W. G. Glenny, the Manchester Water Co., and C. B. Burr, in hopes of working out arrangements for placing a hydrant on Electric St.  
The American Fire Equipment Co. of Boston was the low bidder on 800 feet of two and one half inch hose at \$128 per foot. Bid from two other concerns were also received.  
**Vote Pay Hikes**  
Chief Metz was given authority to purchase a dozen fire helmets over the next two months at a cost of \$15.00 each.  
Fire station custodian Walter Dore was voted a pay raise of a week, retroactive to July 15. Dore, a fireman, reported that he had been in the meeting room and upstairs hall of the firehouse.  
Pay raises were also voted for Sewer Department Superintendent Calvin Guggart and Charles Garow, a sewer department employee. Their raises were also retroactive to July 15.  
District Tax Collector Arthur Warrington reported that, as of Saturday, he had collected \$70,981.70 in current taxes. He said that a list of delinquent taxpayers
