Bailey Report Outlines Bolton School Needs

Edwin M. Bailey, consultant to the Bolton Board of Education on the school needs study, said today that "the need for more classrooms in Bolton is obvious."

Although not agreeing with the report of the Advisory Committee which made it, Bailey said, "I do agree with this report in recommending the construction of a new school plant on the Sissonville property. I also agree with them in their recommendation that this plant should be constructed as a junior high school."

The two statements are a part of several conclusions and recommendations made by Bailey, which he also says he needs to be used for Bolton school facilities (grades 10-11-12) at this time, or in the immediate future.

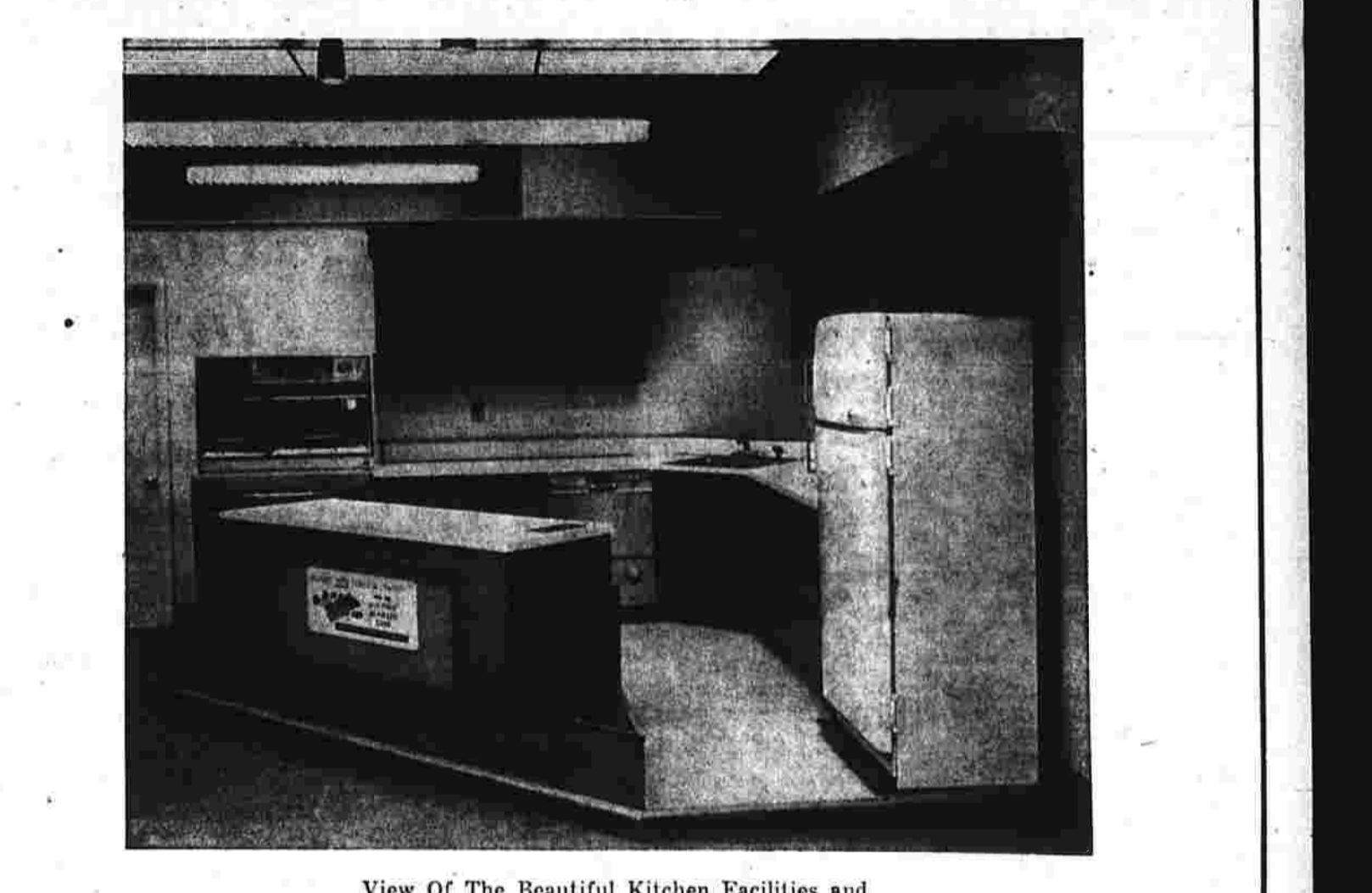

For a few hours the police force was nearly doubled as men on an incoming plane from Boston were being searched for two holdup men who had been wanted to go on duty.

East Hartford police and state troopers assisted.

Shortly after midnight a state trooper reported he had stopped a man walking on the Blue Cross Highway in town and the man had no identification. He was not allowed to leave.

While an accomplice waited outside in a car, Britt, armed with a sawed-off shotgun, last night captured the Colonial Oil Package Store at 282 Tolland Tpk. He escaped with more than \$300.

He captured a few minutes later by Sgt. Walter Ferguson and William Allan Smith. The man's companion, who police believe was his brother, Earl, slipped from Smith's grasp as the two troopers were being searched.

Sgt. Ferguson and Smith, in separate cruisers, had planned in the bandit's car. Main and Waterworth Sts. and the bandit jumped from the auto.

The capture was made minutes after the holdup which occurred shortly after 9 p.m.

Here is the 11-year-old arrested details of the robbery from witnesses. A car with two occupants drove to the lot in front of the pack.

The car was a 1959 Oldsmobile. The driver was a man who had his face partially hidden by a stocking, walked into the store where two clerks and a patron were talking near the counter.

He grabbed one of the clerks, Al Kenan of 200 Hollister St., by the arm and spun him around. Kenan said later he thought the man was a familiar customer engaging in a home visit.

The bandit then said something to this effect, according to witnesses: "Get in this car. This gun is loaded. I'm nervous."

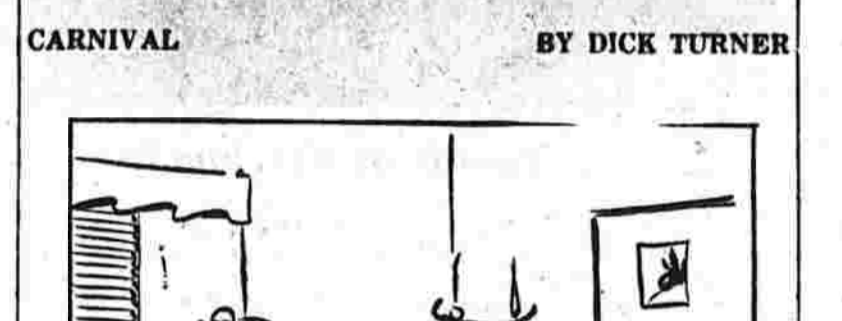

Mary Martin Returns To 'Peter Pan' Role

If inexhaustible energy is one of the prime requirements for a successful acting career, Mary Martin has more than proved it. For its third viewing, Sir James Barrie's classic "Peter Pan" returns to television Thursday, Dec. 8 (7:30-9:30 p.m. EST), with Mary Martin recreating her famous "Peter Pan" role in a two-hour colorcast.

As if her appearing at the Lunt and Fontanne Theatre six nights and two matinees weekly as the Baroness von Trapp in "The Sound of Music" were not enough, Mary

had been attending early rehearsals being conducted across the street at the Helen Hayes Theatre. Here in preparation for the "Peter Pan" role she cavorted with the Lost Boys, the Pirates and Indians of Never Never Land.

At 7 o'clock she left "Peter Pan" temporarily and scurried across the street to her dressing room in the Lunt and Fontanne where dinner was brought to her from a nearby restaurant. Then she put on her makeup and the postulant's habit for the convent scenes in "The Sound of Music."

Hectic Schedule
Starting in early November when the taping of the show began, the schedule became even more hectic. Mary had to travel ten blocks to the Ziegfeld Theatre where the taping of the first act was done. Later on, the daily trips were made to Brooklyn, more than an hour from Times Square, where at NBC-TV's two color studios the second and third acts were taped.

Despite this busy schedule, Mary found time the last week in October to give a party for her friends and their children at the Helen Hayes Theatre. The highlight of this occasion was a demonstration of the "magic" for her song "I'm Flying." With Peter Foy again handling the equipment as he did in all Mary Martin's appearances as "Peter Pan," she flew across the stage to the wonderment of the young as well as the old.

Mary claims that it is not so much a question of energy that keeps her going at such a terrific pace; but rather, a great love of her work and the fact that she enjoys every moment of her day.

After the party she again crossed 46th St. and entered her dressing room to prepare for her role in "The Sound of Music."

To her associates, this boundless energy is taken almost for granted. As any one who is familiar with her life and career knows, Mary has been this way since she attended her first dancing school in Weatherford, Tex. Trained as a dancer, it wasn't long before Mary managed prosperous dancing schools in her native heath before trying the toughest school of all—Broadway.

With just one song—"My Heart Belongs to Daddy"—which she sang in Cole Porter's "Leave It to Me," Mary Martin became a sensation overnight. She has been that, and more, ever since. As the Navy nurse who "washed that man right outa my hair" eight performances weekly, Mary not only captivated New York during a fabulous Broadway run, but later also won international acclaim by affording London many "enchanted evenings" in this musical. Returning to New York, she co-starred with Charles Boyer in "Kind Sir," her first non-musical part, scoring another great personal success. Thereafter, Miss Martin conquered television, via the "Ford 50th Anniversary Show," which also boasted Ethel Merman's ebullient presence; the TV

The roles of the Darling children, of the maid Lisa and the Lost Boys will be filled by new children—the original performers having long since outgrown the roles.

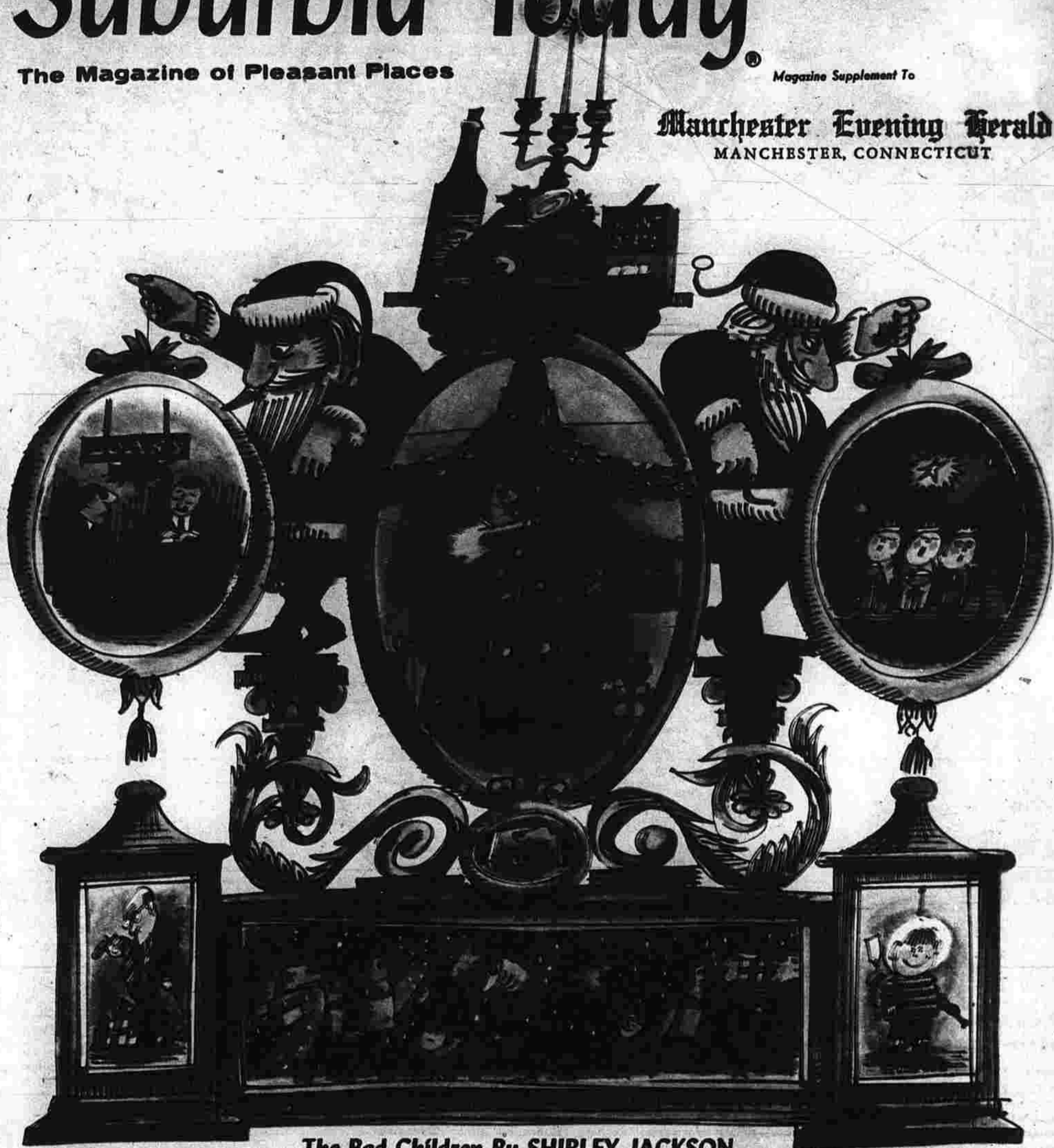

Stir flour, half of salt, onion salt into butter. Stir in milk. Cook over hot water, stirring occasionally until thickened.
