**"THE WAY I HEARD IT"**  
by John Gruber

Last week I gave you some hints on judging values in a phonograph. This time I am contemplating the purchase of such an instrument for Christmas. And I add I would discuss "components" and "FM" equipment this time. So here goes.

Many people seem to think they will get a better system if they purchase "components" (i.e. turntable, pickup, pre-amplifier, amplifier and speaker) separately, and assemble their own system. This is not necessarily true, despite what you may read in magazines dedicated to "high-fidelity." A system should be designed to be balanced from one end to the other. It does no good to buy a \$100 speaker if the pickup is a \$4 one, and the reverse is also true.

It is true that the speaker in a cabinet should not be in the same cabinet as the turntable and amplifier, and this rule is violated in commercially offered equipment. At the same time, the same engineer designs the whole system in balance, from pickup to cabinet, something that never happens when you buy components.

AM broadcasting is limited to a high frequency of 5,000 cycles per second, and there is no limit (theoretically) to the upper frequency of FM broadcasting. Thus it would seem that FM would naturally have higher fidelity.

This is not necessarily the case. The program originates in a studio and goes to the transmitter over a leased telephone line, in most cases. Chain programs are likewise fed to the transmitter over leased lines from the point of origin. Now telephone lines have definite limits on their frequency response, generally not over 4,000 cycles, and many times less.

You won't get a lot of water just because you have a big bucket. If the well is nearly dry, and you won't get 15,000 cycles if the telephone company limits the transmission to 6,000. You will get less FM than you will get better programs as a rule, and you will get fewer commercial minutes as a result. So FM does have advantages, but not necessarily in fidelity.

If you buy a tuner to go with your present amplifier, be sure it is at least of the power transformer type, otherwise you will meet inevitable run into the problem of hum. Hum is a low frequency, usually built which do not hum excessively, but the reason is because their small speakers won't reproduce the hum.

"Hum" is actually a low note approximately the "B" above the lowest "B" on the piano. Small speakers do not reproduce low notes, just as small instruments can't do it either; a piccolo can't sound like a bass viol, no matter how adept the performer may be.

If you have a good sound system, be sure you get a good FM tuner to go with it. This will not be cheap, should have a minimum of nine tubes neglecting double-purpose tubes. My own, incidentally, uses 12 tubes, but it is a combination AM-FM tuner.

Such a device puts out considerable heat, so be sure it is well ventilated. In fact, all your electronic gear should be housed in a cabinet, and not built in tightly as you see it so often in the magazines dedicated to home decor.

This reminds me, that the only claim I haven't yet seen a manufacturer make for his equipment, is that it will reduce the humidity in the room. This is not true, but it is a nice thought to warm the room very slightly.

**SIMPLE MANUEVER SHOWS TRUMP BREAK**

Perhaps you're tired of hearing that genius is an infinite capacity for taking pains. So I won't tell you that the greatest bridge players were hard to get results with very simple materials. Maybe you can come to the same conclusion all by yourself after you've looked at a simple hand:

Only a bad break in diamonds can bother you. "No problem," observes Terence Reese in his magnificent new book, "Play Bridge With Reese, if the trump are 2-2, for in that case I can simply ruff the fourth diamond."

As he points out, you want to draw trumps if they break 2-2, because if they break 3-1, you mustn't give the enemy a chance to take all three of dummy's trumps out.

But how do you find out how the trumps are going to break without giving them the chance to remove dummy's trumps?

**Human Intellect**  
The answer lies in the human factor. You can almost always persuade the enemy to tell you what you want to know.

**Dummy's Trick**  
If you lead the king of hearts from dummy, you can almost always be sure that the king of hearts is in the hand of the dummy. If East has A-x of hearts he will almost surely take the trick at once. For all East can tell, he has a 5-3 of trumps or even 4-4, and it would be ruinous to refuse the first trump trick, which the same would be true if West had A-x of trumps. Actually, the king of hearts is allowed to win. And now you may
