Lumumba Backers Threaten to Kill Belgian Hostages

Leopoldville, The Congo, Dec. 9 (P)—Supporters of Patrice Lumumba who rule Oriental Province today threatened to kill an unspecified number of Belgian hostages unless the deposed premier is freed.

They made the threat in a telegram to President Joseph Kasavubu and Col. Joseph Mobutu, the Congolese army commander whose troops arrested Lumumba and clamped him into prison.

Bernard Salumu, boss of the regime in Stanleyville, capital of Oriental Province threatened to retaliate against the hostages if Lumumba was not released within 48 hours.

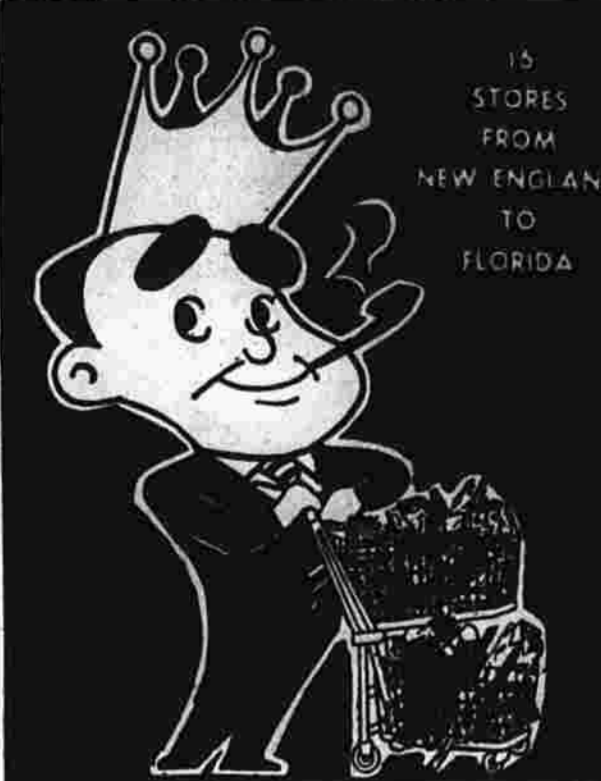


Skelton Awaits Major Surgery

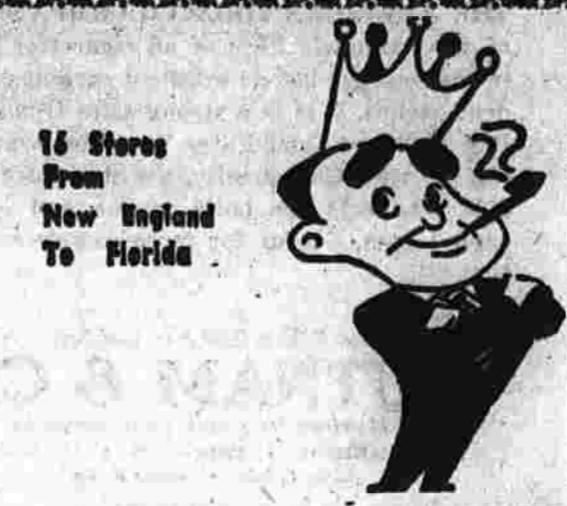

State and federal mental health programs must provide early diagnosis, treatment and care to a patient's home community, rather than in a distant hospital. This is the warning of Sen. Pat McNamara, chairman of the Senate Subcommittee on Problems of the Aged and Aging. On any given day, the senator pointed out, one of three beds in public mental hospitals is filled by a person 65 or older. By 1970, it is estimated, the number of aged patients in mental hospitals will be up 34 per cent over 1959. If this trend is uncorrected, it will burden taxpayers in every state with almost prohibitive building and operating costs. McNamara said, "And it will mean a tragic, uncorrected end for thousands of aged who gave their lives to build the American economy." The subcommittee's report said "in-between" community facilities between the state mental hospital itself and the family which is struggling with the problem of the older patient with a mental difficulty—are the weakest links in the chain of available care. Mental hygiene specialists who testified at hearings urged that federal help, including grants, in setting up geriatric clinics be given states and local communities. Older mental patients are by no means hopeless, experts reported. Dr. Maurice Linden, director of the division of mental health in Philadelphia's public health department, said that about 60 per cent of the aged people admitted to public mental institutions can be "vastly benefited." And one-third can be returned home. "But," he warned, "there is not the widespread education among our professions and our medical colleges to provide sufficient scope to treatment programs for the aged." Dr. Regis F. Downey, superintendent of Pennsylvania's Maryview State Hospital, said 40 to 60 per cent of about 500 patients over 65 admitted to the hospital in a two-year period were ready to go home three weeks after their admission. "But," said Dr. Downey, "we could return less than 10 per cent to the community. Lack of facilities was the reason." Brightening the picture for older people with mental difficulties has been development of numerous facilities to substitute for the mental hospital. These include skilled nursing homes, homes for the aged and psychiatric units in general hospitals. Still another is "open hospitals," an arrangement which provides part-time treatment for the patients, permitting them to live at home. 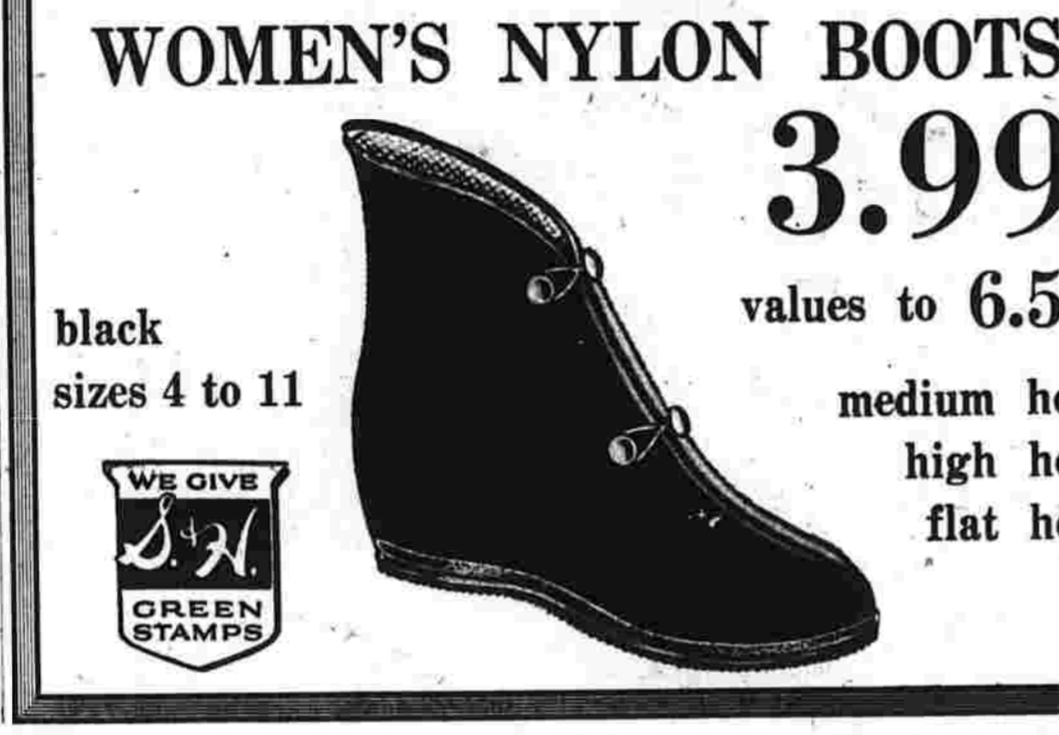
