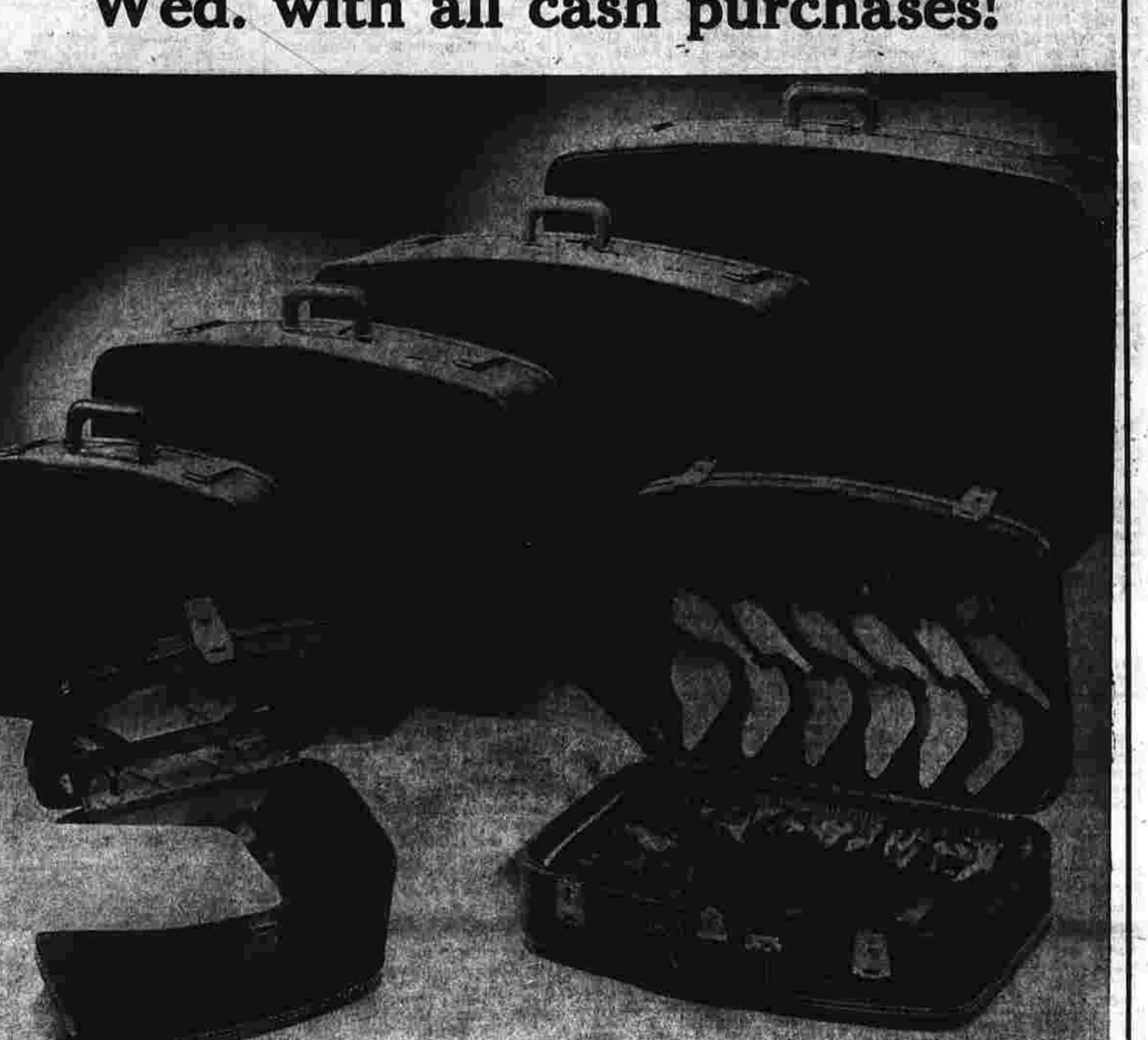

GET YOURSELF OUT WHILE GETTING IN GOOD

By Alfred Sadowski

If you're trying to get out of a place it's the height of foolishness to slam the door in your own face. The right technique is to keep the door open and squeeze yourself through.

No medals will be awarded for the solving of this. There were several reasonable ways for South to get to the available contract of game in notrump. For example, North might have bid two diamonds instead of four clubs. South would bid two spades and North could try two notrump. South would raise to three notrump, and the hand would lay itself out for nine tricks.

As the bidding went, South had to try for 11 tricks at clubs. He won the first trick with dummy's ace of hearts, drew two rounds of trumps, cashed the top spades, discarding a heart from dummy, and made a spade in dummy.

With the stage thus neatly set, declarer led the remaining heart from dummy. This is where East did his dog-stamming act. He went up with a diamond. This looked East neatly into his own hand, where he didn't want to be. If East led a diamond, dummy's king would win a trick; if he led a heart, South would ruff while South discarded a diamond. Either way South was home safe.

East's only chance is to play a low heart instead of putting up the queen. As the cards lie, West is able to win the trick with the jack of hearts. West then returns a diamond and East gratefully takes his two tricks.

The gentleman in the corner would like to know what sort of idiot East would be if South had 3-5 of hearts instead of 2-6. In that case, South would win the second heart trick with the jack, and East would never win a heart trick. East would have the consolation of knowing that he made the only play that had a chance to defeat the contract. Putting up the queen of hearts gives him no chance at all; playing low gives him the chance that his partner has the jack of hearts.

Charles Abell, district superintendent told four school boards last night that there are "two things that are mighty important in making changes in the present salary schedule."

Abell pointed out the importance of the following factors: (1) How you did it in the past. (2) How you do it in the future. (3) How you do it in the present.

Abell emphasized that too much "But, how do we do it?" is important in order to retain members of the present staff.

Abell related to the four school boards recommendations relating to the salary schedule to the Boards of Education of Andover, Hebron, Marlborough and Regional District 3, all operating under the Marborough Services Salary Plan, with three pages of information on the effect on individual towns. He also reviewed a 14-page report which included recommendations from the staffs of RHAM High School, and Hebron and Andover elementary schools. No recommendations were covered by those of the other staffs.

In conclusion, Abell recommended the establishment of a 4-board salary committee, which would meet as soon as possible with representatives of the teachers in all four school systems. He emphasized the importance of board members meeting with teachers as soon as possible "to hammer something out," with the understanding that each representative has to go back to the group for a final opinion. "I don't believe there is such a wide divergence that we would have trouble," Abell said.

Abell pointed out that he has been working on salary schedules since February 1942, and has found that changes have to be made each year, due to growing student enrollments, scarcity of teachers and other factors. The determining factor in making the above recommendations, he said, was what would be best for the children in the district.

Voting, Ribicoff Made Top State News in '60

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS
New Haven, Conn., Dec. 21 (AP)—The top Connecticut news story of 1960 was President-elect Kennedy's victory in the state and the appointment of Gov. Abraham Ribicoff to his cabinet.

Other major stories of the year included: The slaying of Stamford policeman David Troy by Joseph DeSalvo, who killed himself Dec. 14 in his jail cell while his first-degree murder trial was incomplete. The upholding by the Connecticut Supreme Court of errors, of the state law permitting towns to provide transportation to parochial and private school pupils. The million-dollar fire Sept. 7 at the Second Congregational Church in Waterbury, which was set by an arsonist. A fire that swept through the heart of Mystic during the bitter December snowstorm.

The December snowstorm that caused at least 10 deaths, shut down schools and businesses and turned travel into a cold, frustrating nightmare. Yale's unbeaten, untied football season. The death of Andrea Margaret Sullivan in a New Haven hotel on New Year's Day. The crash of a helicopter on a test flight at the Sikorsky plant in Stratford last April, killing three men. The departure of county government.

The shaping of the New Circuit Court system that goes into effect next month. During the year, Chief Judge Edward Fisher died and was succeeded by Judge Jay Fishburn. DeSalvo's death, as well as some other major stories, occurred after the balloting was virtually completed. Kennedy carried Connecticut by more than 90,000 votes. Subsequently he picked Ribicoff to be his secretary of health, welfare and education. He also chose former governor Chester Bixby as undersecretary of state. And another consequence of the Kennedy victory likely will be the elevation of State Democratic chairman John Bailey to national chairmanship. Ribicoff will be succeeded as governor by John N. Dempsey, the present lieutenant governor.

The first of the second major news stories from editors was the March 8 tragedy at Berlin in which eight persons lost their lives. A New Haven railroad train crashed into the automobile in which they were riding. In third place was the United Aircraft strike that lasted for several weeks, idled thousands of persons, cost the company millions and had vast economic effects. A commitment to launch the nuclear submarines also figured in the top news.

The May homecoming to New London of the Submarine Triton, after the circumnavigation of the globe under water, was voted fourth place. And in sixth place was the launching last month of the polarizing mirror, which has led to several weeks of idled thousands of persons, cost the company millions and had vast economic effects. A commitment to launch the nuclear submarines also figured in the top news.

The fifth spot went to Hurricane Edith that hit the Connecticut coast last September, and created fears of a disaster that would have cost millions. Disturbances at the Connecticut State Penitentiary, which included rioting and furniture throwing. In October there was another disturbance in the hospital ward of the Prison, but this one was relatively minor.

In other penal news during the year, the county jails went under state control with the demise of county government, and the new Debra Taylor, who had been dubbed a mad-dog killer, was executed in the electric chair. The New Haven Railroad's trouble—and extensive hearing on them in New Haven by an Interstate Commerce Commission—ranked eighth.

Number 10 was the capture in Connecticut of a gunman who allegedly shot a Long Island man during a robbery of his home last July and then abducted the man's wife in a stolen car.

Although steel has been hurting, the report noted that aluminum is winning a bigger market in the industry. It said the average 1961 model uses about 62 pounds of aluminum compared with 28.6 pounds five years ago.

Whereas the compacts, which use fewer raw materials, accounted for 80 per cent of 1960 production, the department forecast a jump to 85-90 per cent next year.

While the prospective 1961 drop in unit production is distinctly bearish, the report pointed out, still another dampening factor was the increased share of the market being claimed by compact cars.

India Admits Slavery Exists

New Delhi, India, Dec. 21 (AP)—Prime Minister Nehru said today that slavery is still practiced among tribesmen in the Northeast Frontier Agency. But he said his government is going about abolition as fast as it can and liberated 160 this year.

The total number of slaves was put at "only a few hundred." But he said the government is anxious to find a solution because of "developments across the border."

The agency area adjoins Communist-occupied Tibet and parts of the area are claimed by Communist China. Nehru fears the existence of slavery may be exploited by Red Chinese propagandists.

Nehru said the government for years has been doing its best to pry or even to buy slaves out of bondage.

This year the government allotted 25,000 rupees (\$5,200) to buy freedom for slaves. The frontier agency may spend up to 500 rupees (\$105) to free a man.

Nehru warned that it is a slow process, however, and it would only add to the problem if a slave was liberated without provision for his rehabilitation—and in many cases his master's rehabilitation as well.

He described the slavery as a heritage of past feuds between villages and tribes.

Since the election he has been supervising recent maneuvers throughout the country in his post as general counsel to the GOP. Alcorn began his political activities in 1933 after being graduated from Yale Law School. He became a member of the Suffolk Republican Committee, and is still a member. He was elected to the State House of Representatives for the 1937, 1939 and 1941 sessions, serving as majority leader in 1939 and speaker in 1941. He was also assistant's state's attorney for Hartford County from 1942 to 1948. He succeeded his father, the late Hugh M. Alcorn, as state's attorney. In 1948, he was the unsuccessful Republican candidate for lieutenant governor. Alcorn was elected to the national committee in 1958. And after the defeat of former Gov. John Lodge in his bid for re-election in 1964, Alcorn was regarded as the top GOP leader in the state. He was chairman of the state's delegations to the Republican national conventions both in 1960 and 1960. Alcorn announced his resignation in his law office whose walls

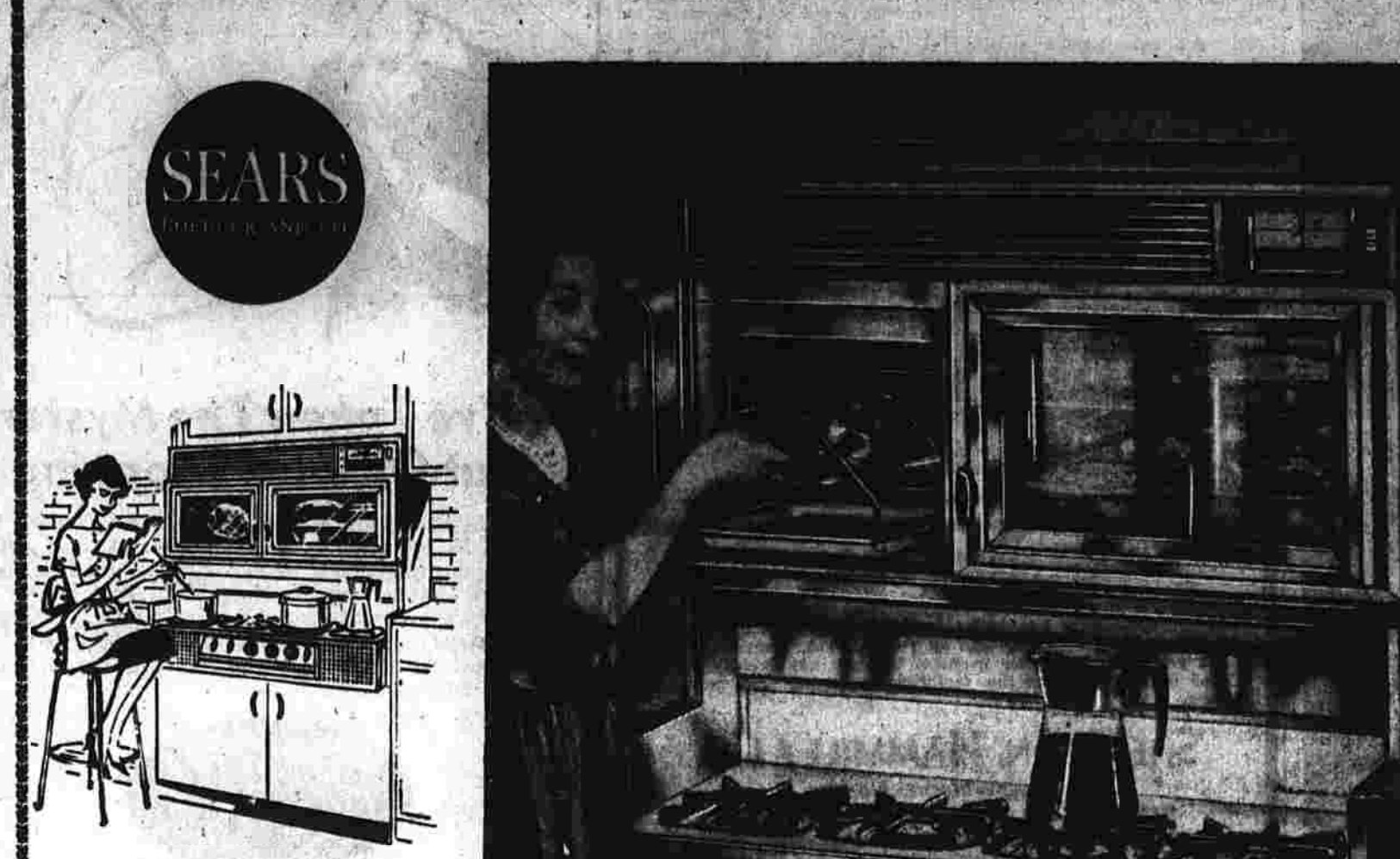

30 Bags Yule Mail Destroyed on Train

New Haven, Dec. 21 (AP)—About 30 sacks of Christmas mail were destroyed yesterday when a fire broke out in a combination club and mail car on a 9-car New Haven Railroad passenger train.

The fire sent smoke swirling through some of the cars, but an estimated 150 passengers, including 30 blind children, were uninjured.

The train was on route from Springfield to New York.

The blaze broke out in the mail room of the car about 9 p.m. about one mile northeast of Union Station. The car was directly behind the engine.

New Haven city firemen kept the fire confined to the single car. The 30 blind children aboard the train were from the Connecticut school for the blind in Hartford. They were on their way home for holiday vacations. They occupied a car directly behind the club-mail car.

The children were moved to a rear car and remained aboard the train until the rear cars were stalled into the station by a switch engine about 30 minutes after the fire broke out. Later they were transported to home stations by special train.

Other passengers left the train and boarded another train that was stopped to pick them up.

A cross-section of the train at Springfield, Mass., discovered the fire. He attempted to put it out with a hand extinguisher, but it spread rapidly, forcing him to retreat.

Edward Brown, a porter in the club car, said the car filled with smoke quickly. He said 16 passengers in the car fled screaming.

"I was even too scared to take my clothes or collect my baggage," Brown said.

An unidentified woman accompanying the blind children said they became excited but all followed directions.

Postal officials said about 100 sacks of mail were unscathed by the fire but were drenched by water. The officials said the sacks would be dried out and delivered. Unidentified damaged mail from the fire, the officials said, would be sent to a dead letter office in Boston.

'Bravest Little Girl'

Wrapped in a ragged red blanket, five-year-old Marie Clement still manages a smile for police who rescued her after five days alone in an unheated tenement. Last Wednesday Marie's mother, Mrs. Marie Clement, to hospital suffering from pneumonia. They didn't know the little girl was hiding in another room. The mother recovered enough to seek about child Monday night. Police found child, said she was "Bravest little girl you ever saw." (AP Photos).

Baltimore, Dec. 21 (AP)—The Martin Co. turned its back yesterday on airplanes and its face full to the missile age.

W. B. Bergen, company president, turned over to the Navy a plane. With it went one of the pioneer "flying machine" makers.

Mobutu Opposes Invading Province

Cocquillville, The Congo, Dec. 21 (AP)—Col. Joseph Mobutu announced last night he does not plan to accept an immediate invasion to overthrow the pro-Lumumba government in Oriental Province.

The Congolese army leader had reported moving troops into Equator Province—adjoining Oriental—for a massive invasion to crush the rebel regime Stanleyville that has defied the central Congo government in Leopoldville dominated by Mobutu and President Joseph Kasavubu.

But Mobutu told newsmen he did not plan any immediate military action against the Stanleyville regime and did not wish shed Congolese blood unnecessarily.

The Army leader said the rebel government of Antoine Gizenga, pro-Communist deputy premier under Patrice Lumumba, would be brought down by the economic blockade the Leopoldville government ordered against Oriental Province this week. All road, river and air travel into the Province was banned.

"Already the Oriental troops are short of uniforms and ammunition," Mobutu said. "With their supplies cut, they cannot last long."

Mobutu and Kasavubu came to Cocquillville, capital of Equator Province, for a triumphant reception yesterday by thousands of wildly cheering Congolese. It was the president's first Congo tour since Leopoldville since he dismissed Lumumba from the premiership on Sept. 6.

The New Circuit Court—3 Scofflaw Drivers Face Automatic Fine Jumps

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS
Scofflaws involved with violations of the motor vehicle statutes will be brought up short once the circuit court goes into operation next month—first by an automatic jump in fine, then by an automatic suspension of the license to drive.

It will be up to the offender how he is treated.

He may pay his fine by mail in all but the most serious cases, appear in court for a trial or submit to the prescribed penalties.

Failure to heed a summons the first time will raise the fine.

Failure to pay the increased license suspension—coupled with the issuance of an arrest warrant.

Any suspension will remain in effect until disposition of the offender's case in court.

All of which could have been done in Connecticut before but wasn't.

There was no systematic handling of traffic violations on a state-wide basis in the old minor courts now going out of existence.

Pay-by-mail fines for motor vehicle offenses—not to be confused with the similar plan in larger communities for parking violations—have been employed to varying degrees by some courts in the past.

Suspensions for failure to appear in court have been imposed but not frequently. The courts simply didn't notify the State Department of Motor Vehicles about these cases very often.

There were only three suspensions of this kind in 1956, 36 in 1957, 104 in 1958, 108 in 1959 and 187 the first 10 months of the present year.

Most of them, says Motor Vehicle Commissioner John J. Tynan, concerned Connecticut operators who didn't show up in the courts of other states.

Now that failure-to-appear cases are to be referred to the department as a matter of routine, the commissioner says, it will probably be necessary to obtain additional personnel for handling them.

The whole process starts when a state trooper, say, stops a driver on the highway for some violation and hands him one of the new uniform traffic ticket summaries.

It is explained that the motorist may pay his fine by mail without going to court if he signs a combination guilty plea, waiver of hearing and agreement to pay for the offense involved. He gets this information from an officer that which he carries.

As an alternative to mailing or taking the fine to a violations bureau, the motorist is also given a date on which to appear in court.

The fine must be paid within five days.

If the motorist doesn't do so and doesn't appear in court, either, he gets one more chance, and only one—to pay a fine voluntarily.

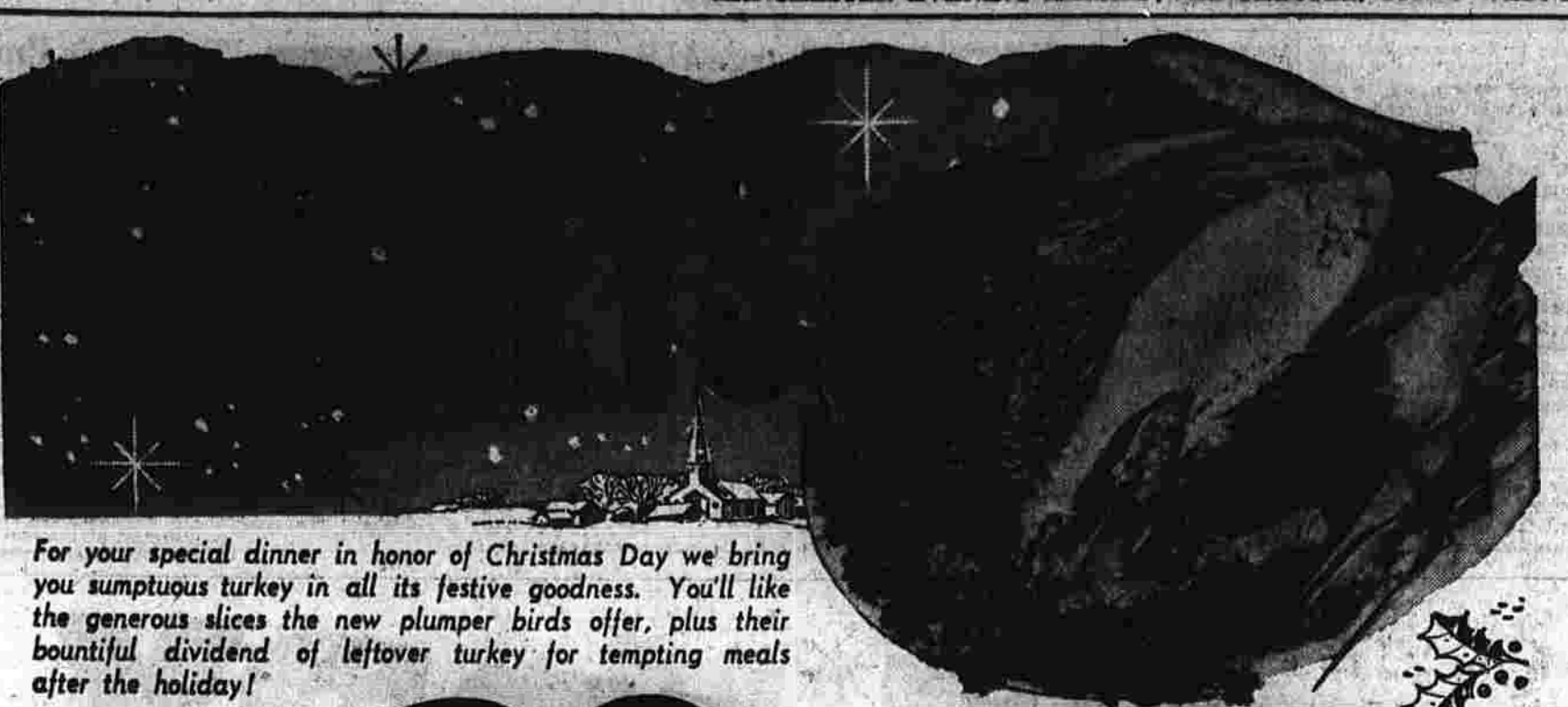

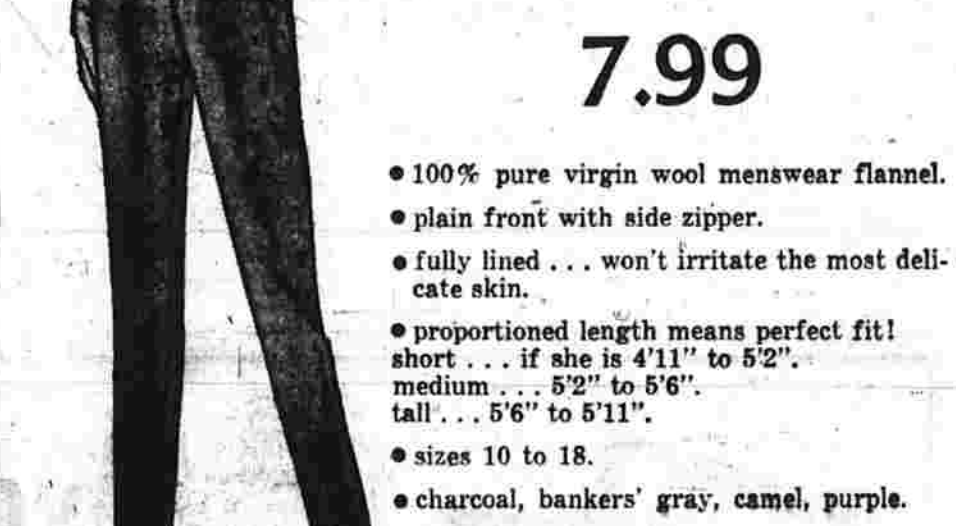
