

### \$170,710 Paid Out In Idle Benefits

Unemployment benefits paid by the Manchester office in November amounted to \$170,710, it was announced today by John J. Loomis, local unemployment compensation office manager.

Checks disbursed compensated 4,115 weeks of November unemployment with an average check of \$41.65. Payments by check are made directly to claimants in the local office. Loomis said.

Unemployment claims filed in Manchester last week increased 1.2 per cent from 1,482 to 1,478. The figure denotes a fourth consecutive week rise in unemployment.

Connecticut's unemployment claims for compensation hit their highest level since mid-July with an upward trend of 2.2 per cent. The figure last week to 46,700, it was reported by State Labor Commissioner Renato E. Ricciuti.

The increase was due mainly to seasonal construction cutbacks and factory layoffs, particularly in electrical equipment, machinery, textile and apparel industries.





