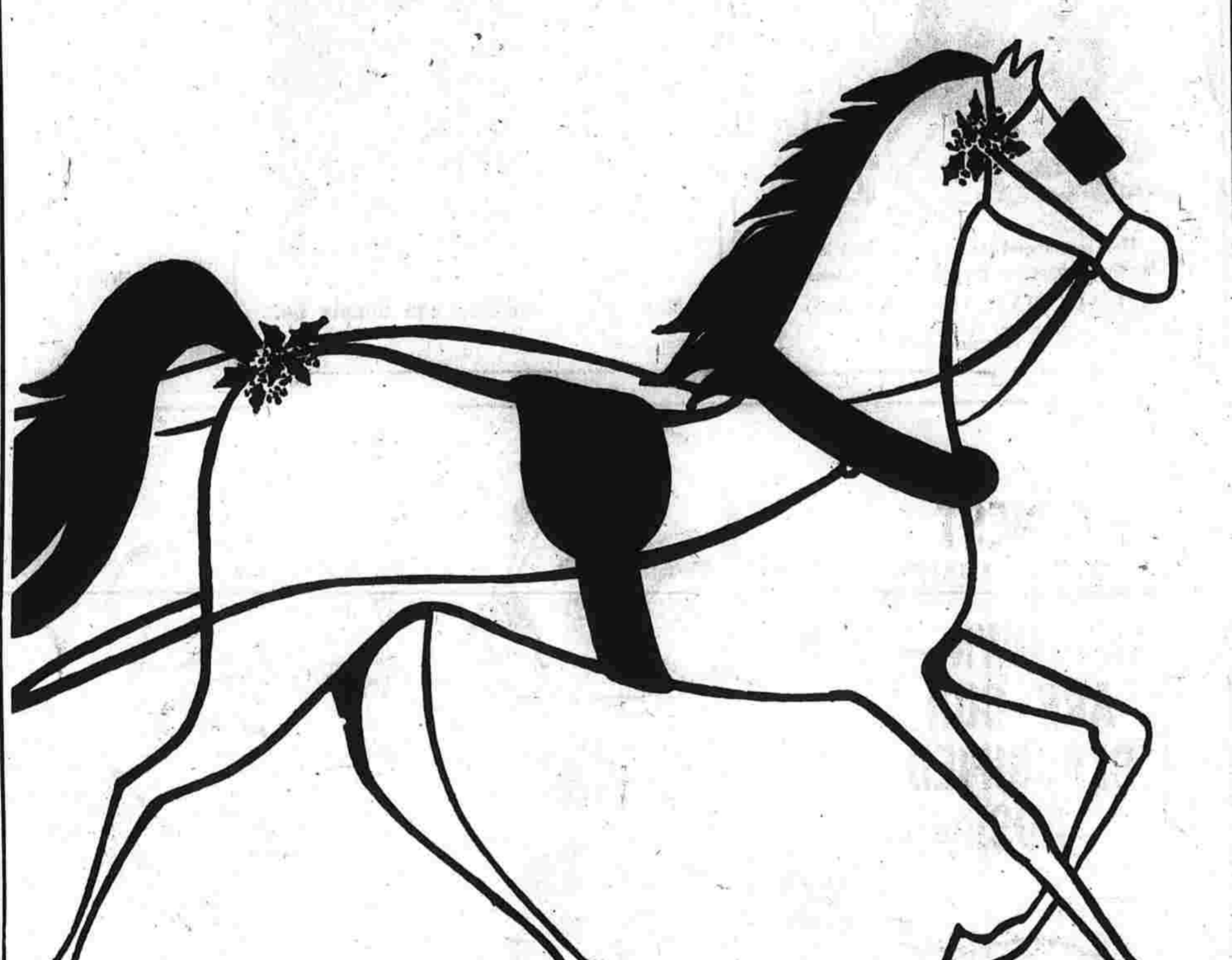

# "THE WAY I HEARD IT"

New Year's Day with its resolutions is just around the corner, so why don't you resolve to attend more "live" programs of serious music. And at the same time, make a resolution to keep the "live" off, except when you really want to listen to the music, let's get away from this insidious habit of always having music in the background.

You'll find that your enjoyment is very considerably increased by such a course of action. Most people seem to feel that the practicing musician has a greater appreciation of music because he has had some sort of secret initiation into the mysteries of the art. Nothing could be further from the truth. The musician understands much more about music than he is credited with. He knows how much time giving it his undivided attention.

If I frequently know the "live" and then look at me hopefully as though I could give them the secret password. There just isn't any password. Further, there is as much to listen for that there isn't any simple answer.

Music means different people in different ways; consequently the approach to listening must be varied to suit the individual. Rhythmic appeal is probably the most universal, and the chief reason for the popularity of dance music and marches. Realizing this, most composers of serious music expend a great deal of their effort in drumming up common and complex new rhythms.

The results are usually too involved to be grasped at first hearing, so the casual concert-goer is likely to dismiss such a new music as valueless. Much of it is valueless. I'll agree, but you

Moser carried. Then, police said, Moser tossed acid at his wife and then at the girls.

Hearing the shots, a neighbor, Veronica Frommeyer, 50, a nurse, ran out and met Moser as he was fleeing. When she asked what happened, Moser threw acid in her face and drove off in his car.

Moser reached the home of former neighbors, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Garthwaite, whom he accused of having caused his domestic problems, police said.

Garthwaite was shot twice, in the thigh and face. His wife, a friend of Mrs. Moser, was splattered with acid.

An intensive hunt started for Moser, with more than 60 state and local police taking part. Moser, his car stuck in snow, began waving and was spotted by a state trooper in a lonely area.

Moser bolted down the road, pulled out a revolver and shot himself.

Veronica Frommeyer was released after treatment at the hospital. Garthwaite, who underwent surgery, is recovering well. His wife was listed as satisfactory.

Some Socialist workers reported that pickets they had never seen before were appearing at factories in the strike zone.

So far no serious violence has developed, but there have been sporadic incidents of shopkeepers being beaten when they refused to close.

The strike has produced a spreading stoppage of railway and bus services, gas and power supply, the mails and such municipal services as garbage collection and many industries.

Many cafes and restaurants have closed.

Justice Minister J. Bart Lilar has threatened to take drastic measures against "unrestrained" sabotage. Three newspapers have been ordered to call upon strikers to strike duty to military. Scores of strike agitators have been arrested.

## Sheinwold on Bridge

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF OPPONENTS' ERROR

By Alfred Steinwold

If your opponent always plays perfectly, you would be better off from today's hand. But if your opponent is a mere human being, you may have chances to seize upon their errors.

Anybody can see that South should draw trumps promptly. He can then lead a heart toward dummy in the hope of finding the queen in the West hand.

As it happens, East wins with the queen of hearts and returns a club to punch dummy. Declarer leads the king of hearts from dummy to force out the ace. The declarer then takes a club trick, but South gets rid of a diamond on the jack of hearts to make his contract.

The correct line of play is that declarer should lead a heart to force out the ace. But when we were put to the test, we were not so lucky. We went off in the wrong direction by leading a low diamond from dummy at the second trick.

South Signal

East ruffed and South ace-trick played a low diamond from his hand. West thought for a moment and then led a heart to force out the ace. Declarer then led a low diamond from dummy at the second trick.

What do you say?

Answer: Don't make a mistake with an expert partner. The jump is merely invitational, not forcing. (Copyright 1960, General Features Corp.)

## 2 Trucks, 4 Autos, Bus State Sailor Killed In Nightmare Crash

thrown from a shore patrol wagon in that city.

State Police Cpl. Lionel Hatt described this morning's crash in detail as a nightmare and the most confusing he has seen in 30 years of investigating accidents.

The first crash came, Lieutenant Hatt said, when a sports car, driven by Lieutenant Deegan attempted to pass three other cars going up the slipperly hill. "Palling" makes it Deegan backed his car off the shoulder on the opposite side of the hill.

Seconds later, a tractor-trailer, loaded with 22,000 pounds of coiled steel for Meriden Conn., delivery from East Providence, came over the hill.

The truck driver, Cloyd C. Johnson, 47, South Windsor, Conn., said he saw the sports car and tried to avoid hitting it, but he applied his brakes.

The heavy truck slipped off of control down the hill and crashed on two sides of the highway. The trailer shipped around and crashed against the left side of the hill.

The tractor-trailer was a passenger. It was being driven by Gray.

The passengers were sailors William and Kane.

The whipping tractor then slid around, crashing against a sedan in which Reynolds was riding alone, forcing it into ditch. Then the truck, continuing to slide, slammed into the sports car, crushing the two lieutenants.

Minutes later, a second tractor-trailer, driven by Louis Harris, 42, Harrisburg, Pa., and bound for Fiske Island, was easing gently up the slipperly hill.

Harris said he saw lights of the bus as he rounded the bend. Then he stopped, blinding his light to warn the bus driver of the slippery conditions on the hill.

"I kept blinking my lights. I thought about jumping out as my bus kept coming for me," Harris said.

The bus crashed head-on against the tractor-trailer and rolled over a car, driven by Harvey A. Denman, 22, Pitts., Mich., who was the first accident and killed the car to avoid piling into the cars tossed helter-skelter in front of him. Denman, a sailor stationed at New London, was not hurt.

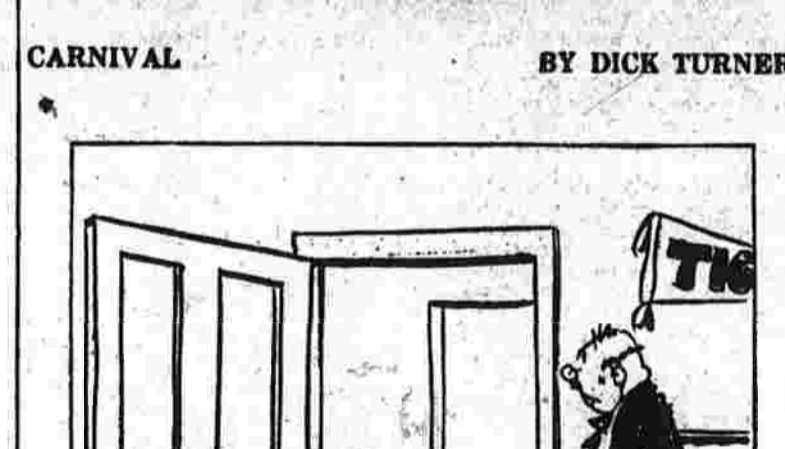

## Dean's Runback Saved Eagles

Philadelphia, Dec. 27 (AP)—The Philadelphia Eagles have won their first National Football League title in 11 years and they did it by coming up with the big stopper on defense, clutch passing by Norm Van Brocklin and rookie Tom Donahoe's kickoff return on a newly installed play.

The Eagles, a Cinderella team which rose from last in 1958 to second last year and the Eastern Conference crown this season, came from behind yesterday for the fourth championship in the season to defeat Green Bay 17-13 for the world championship.

And for Coach Buck Shaw and Norm Van Brocklin, both of whom were back in the game, the victory marked the greatest moment in their long and colorful football careers. Sports writers voted the 34-year-old Van Brocklin the outstanding player of the game, the 61-year-old Shaw, who installed the play which led to the winning touchdown in the fourth quarter, said after the game: "You can't go any further than this." It was Shaw's first title in 12 years of coaching professional football.

Defense Outstanding

"The defense did a great job," said Shaw. "They did the job done when they had to."

The Eagles were next to last in rushing defense but always managed to get the big runners in play. Green Bay, a last place team like the Eagles just two seasons ago, it was a day of heart-
