Expect Unexpected With Perry Como

If ever you have the opportunity to meet Perry Como personally, be prepared to be pleasantly surprised in one way or another. Those who have been associated with him for many years will confirm the fact that he never fails to amaze his friends, not only with his mild mannerisms under the most trying circumstances, but with his uncanny knack for coming up with unexpected statements or actions.

his weekly show, Perry has more than earned this appellation. Actually, if you've seen him on television, you can consider yourself as having met him personally: Unassuming, soft spoken, warm, talented with a natural sense of humor. He's relaxed and easygoing, although he once told a newspaperman, "I'm not relaxed, I'm just tired!" During television rehearsals or record cuttings, Perry's quiet good humor is never lost, yet he's known among television people and musicians to be at tireless and careful worker who can kid one minute and next make craftsmanlike suggestions on script, camera, balance and tempo.

His patience and true fondness for his fans provide the key to the man's personality. He'd rather be late for rehearsal or an appointment than fluff them off, they snap their cameras and press him for autographs at the stage door. Despite the stature he has attained in the entertainment field, he still finds time to afford the press interview. In our particular case, an original interview had to be canceled because of sickness in the family. He not only gracefully accepted our excuse but set a new time immediately, and sent a telegram wishing speedy recovery.

was Perry some way back in his home town of Canonsburg, Pa., in the early years when, as a barber he entertained his customers with a song while cutting their hair—and in the same relaxed manner, if the mood moved him, would pick up a guitar and sing and play a song to the delight of all those around him.

Perry's relaxed manner has come to be expected. However, when one enterprising reporter commented on his casual manner and asked him what he thinks about as he confronts an audience, he received a typical unexpected Como retort. "I'm thinking about lying down, but there's no place to lie so I stand up."

Of course, a glance at Perry's rise to fame will reveal a series of unexpected incidents from his first audition with a local Ohio band in 1933 right up to his first radio contract with CBS.

Perry was on vacation when he auditioned as a singer for Freddy Carlone's Band. He had no intention, at the time, of pursuing a singing career since his barber shop business was prospering. However, he was offered a job by Carlone and, despite his thriving business, accepted the offer.

He developed a strong following in Ohio for a number of years and in 1938 joined the Ted Weems Band. He recalls one momentous engagement at the New York Strand when the band shared the bill with Ann Sheridan. To Perry Como, this was the big time!

But again, in his career the unexpected occurred. Having married his childhood sweetheart, Ros-

selle Belline in 1933, they were blessed with their first child in 1940. Perry was weary of traveling. His home life was a happy one. He was eager for a normal quiet life. One day before he was to sign the lease for another barber shop, General Artists Corp. contacted him offering Perry his own CBS radio show and an RCA Victor recording contract. Roselle persuaded him to accept the offer with the old clincher, "You can always get another barber shop if it doesn't work out."

Rose Parade Modest Plan At Beginning

Little did the members of the Valley Hunt Club of Pasadena, Calif., realize in 1890 what they were creating. They carried out a modest plan to decorate their bugles and surreys with flowers and show them off on New Year's Day. Their little celebration—called the Tournament of Roses Parade—drew a throng of 3,000 spectators.

This Jan. 2, ABC-TV will help attract nearly 77 million people to the 72nd annual Tournament of Roses Parade. Officials estimate—conservatively—that at least 76,000,000 people will glimpse the spectacle in person and through TV, newspapers, magazines and radio.

The pageant—with 60 flowered floats, 20 marching bands, 200 high-stepping thoroughbred horses, the beautiful Rose Queen and her court of six princesses, a host of Hollywood celebrities and about 1,200 colorfully-clad participants—will be shown on ABC-TV Monday, Jan. 2, (11:30 to 1:45 p.m., EST) with Bob Cummings and Bess Myerson handling the commentary.

Dr. Charles Frederick Holder, a famous writer who conceived the idea 70 years ago, would not recognize his simple project if he could see it now.

He suggested to his fellow club members in 1890 that they produce original floral designs and parade New Year's morning down the Pasadena main street to the ball park where the rest of the day would be spent in games and feats of horsemanship.

Responsible for building up the parade to its present-day magnitude, was an eastern newspaperman who visited Pasadena one New Year's Day. The newspaperman—his name has since been forgotten—was so impressed with a flower parade in the winter, he wrote a story that was carried by newspapers in Los Angeles, Chicago and New York.

The publicity started a flow of visitors to California from far-away points. They wanted to see for themselves. Within five years,

the parade had become so famous and the problems so numerous, the sponsorship to a committee of community leaders who formed the Tournament of Roses Association, a non-profit organization.

Soon, Pasadena no longer could call it a local affair. Neighboring communities, fraternal organizations and, later, states and foreign nations joined in the parade. It has become California's New Year's greeting to the world.

The theme of the 1961 Tournament of Roses Parade is "Ballads in Elegance." Besides carrying the classic itself, ABC-TV also will take a behind-the-scenes peek at last minute preparations for the parade. In a 20-minute videotaped segment, ABC will show the previous night's preparations. Stuart Phelps, who has directed 13 previous parade telecasts, will produce and direct the ABC-TV "Tournament of Roses Parade" broadcast.
