

### Rose Parade **Modest Plan** At Beginning

Little did the members of the Little did the members of the Valley Hunt Club of Pasadena, Calif., realize in 1890 what they were creating. They carried out a modest plan to decorate their buggles and surreys with flowers and show them off on New Year's Day. Their little celebration — called the Tournament of Roses Paradedrew a throng of 3,000 spectators. This Jan. 2, ABC-TV will help attract nearly 77 million people to

attract nearly 77 million people to the 72nd annual Tournament of Roses Parade. Officials estimate conservatively — that at least 76,-600,000 people will glimpse the spectacle in person and through TV, newspapers, magazines and

radio.

The pageant — with 60 flowered floats, 20 marching bands, 200 high-stepping thoroughbred horses, the beautiful Rose Queen and her court of six princesses, a host of Hollywood celebrities and about 1,200 colorfully-clad participants—will be shown on ABC-TV Monday, Jan. 2, (11:30 to 1:45 p.m., EST) with Bob Cummings and Bess Myerson handling the commentary. Dr. Charles Frederick Holder, a famous writer who conceived the

famous writer who conceived the idea 70 years ago, would not rec-ognize his simple project if he

could see it now.

He suggested to his fellow club members in 1890 that they produce original floral designs and parade New Year's morning down the Pasadena main street to the ball park where the rest of the day

would be spent in games and feats of horsemanship.

Responsible for building up the parade to its present-day magnitude, was an eastern newspaperman who waited Pasadana one man who visited Pasadena one New Year's Day. The newspaper-man — his name has since been man — his name has since been forgotten — was so impressed with a flower parade in the winter, he wrote a story that was carried by newspapers in Los Angeles, Chicago and New York.

The publicity started a flew of visitors to California from faraway points. They wanted to see for themselves. Within five years,

the parade had become so farmous and the problems so numerous, the sponsorship to a committee of community leaders who formed the Tournament of Roses Association, a non-profit organization.

Soon, Pasadena no longer could call it a local affair, Neighboring communities, fraternal organizations and, later, states and foreign nations foined in the parade, It has become California's New Year's greeting to the world.

The theme of the 1961 Tournament of Roses Parade is "Ballads in Blossoms." Besides carrying the classic itself, ABC-TV also will take a behind-the-scenes peek at

take a behind-the-scenes peek at last minute preparations for the parade. In a 20-minute videoparade. In a 20-minute video-taped segment, ABC will show the previous might's preparations. Stuart Phelps, who has directed 13 previous parade telecasts, will produce and direct the ABC-TV "Tournament of Roses Parade" broadcast.
