Death Count 338 In Holiday Traffic

Chicago, Jan. 4 (AP)—The New Year's weekend traffic accidents claimed 338 lives, but the toll was the lowest for a 3-day New Year's holiday since 1953, when 317 traffic deaths were counted.

The National Safety Council, which had estimated 340 traffic fatalities for the extended weekend, said probably 14,000 more motorists and pedestrians suffered disabling injuries during the holiday period.

The cause of the explosion would be purely guesswork pending the report of a group of investigators being flown from Washington, D.C. Their report may be weeks in coming.

Now this word "pragmatic" is a new one, applied to the field of public service, that is, and it seems to convey a fresh thought and the idea of a fresh kind of approach. Consequently, we rather hesitantly ask why and how it differs from that "know-how" which Dwight Eisenhower and his Republican associates so proudly bring to Washington eight years ago at this time.

One difference is that pragmatism is a rancor word. Another difference is that the Kennedy know-how artists are indeed younger. And, to go to the very difference, Kennedy has succeeded in combining up with a rather rare combination of the individual whose distinction has been both academic and practical, whereas Eisenhower's top man had the idea that the main reason for books was to balance them. So, on balance, we ourselves will take the pragmatic approach to the new official family. We'll interpret our inevitable response as an act of emity on our part. We will make that into more grist for his television propaganda mill.

And he will certainly use the increased strain of the new situation between our two nations as the atmosphere for new accusations against a new group of men, namely, the Communist friends, and new exhortations to the Cuban people to take out any discontent they may feel in hatred for us. In this sort of a contest, however an irresponsible demagogue who relies on his own small size for protection, and a responsible giant who knows the world will condemn him if he strikes the first blow, there is an inevitable initial advantage to the demagogue. He can take as he will; we must keep our temper. He can seize the labor force propaganda gains; we must rely upon the ultimate victory of truth and good sense. He can break once; we must control our instinct to flatten him. And we must realize that there may be a considerable period during which he can make our sins and confessions of the past, whatever they may have been in our relationships with our good neighbors of the hemisphere, more valuable to his own propaganda than they have any right to be, considering the aims and directions of his own rule.

The Pragmatists
The Kennedy official family which has now taken shape is being described in various terms. It is young. It has more P. M. Beta Kappa distinction than any official family in the nation's history. Yet it escapes being defined as a prospective administration of brain-trusters—a title the Roosevelt New Deal administration won with many fewer academic distinctions.
