40 Jews, Escaping Morocco Believed Lost as Ship Sinks

Almeria, Spain, Jan. 12 (AP)—About 40 Jews trying to escape from Morocco to Israel are feared lost in the sinking of a Spanish-owned motor yacht off the North African coast.

Rescue ships reported they picked up 24 bodies, including a 3-year-old boy and a 9-year-old girl, and three surviving Spanish fishermen. The bodies were taken to the West Mediterranean before dawn yesterday. It was believed about 40 passengers were aboard.

Moroccan officials said the boat was taking Jews without exit permits from Mellilla to Israel.

A report today said the boat sprang a leak in her bow, the forward hold was flooded in minutes and the vessel sank before it could get off a distress signal 10 miles east of Cape Verde Islands, just outside Almeria Bay, Morocco.

The survivors were rescued and landed in Almeria, where Moroccan naval officers questioned the three men. They included the captain of the ship, Francisco Morilla, who reportedly was owned by a Spaniard living in Gibraltar.

The captain of the Spanish schooner Cabo Gata radioed that he hoped to get to Almeria with the survivors later today.

When you double the odds on a particular contract you may be offering very high odds that you will beat them. It's all right to do so if you know what you're doing and are willing to take the risk.

West's double worked out well. West got two trump tricks and his two aces. His partner showed up with a club trick. But West had taken a rather big risk for practically no gain.

Forget about the actual North-South hands and consider what they might well have been. Duminy might show up with the Q in spades, this limiting West to one trump trick. South might have four diamonds and only two clubs, in which case he might limit the club loss to one trick.

West couldn't be sure of beating three spades. If you had asked West what odds he would give on leading South's hand, he might have worked himself up to something like 1 to 1. His double, in fact, was a quotation of much higher odds.

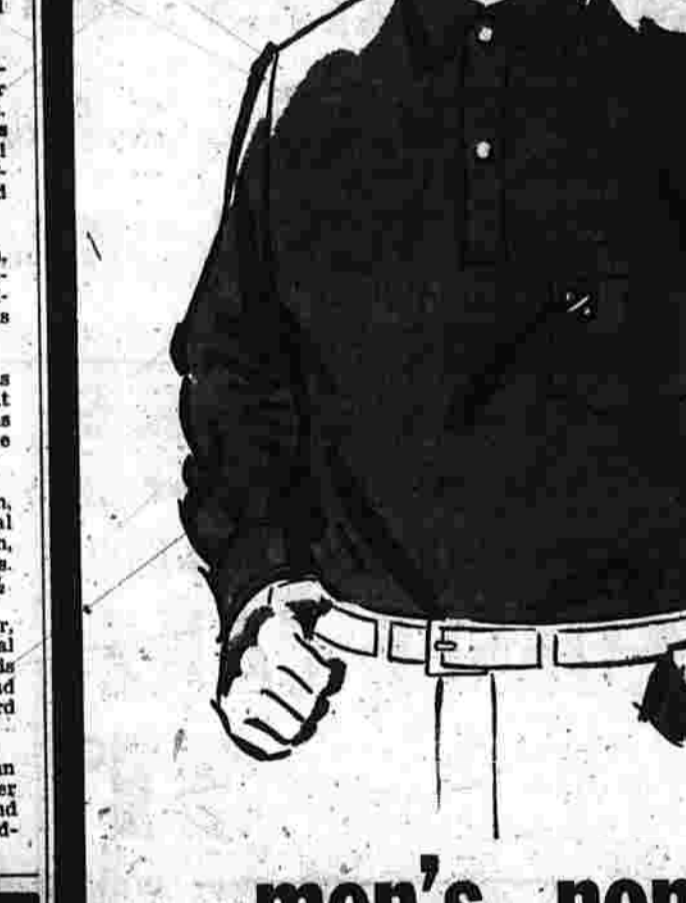

But cheer up. Every normal person feels that way part of the time. But there is no need to feel like that all the time. There is a way out. Become a day dreamer—at whatever time of day you need it most.

Some people sneer at day dreamers as impractical. They are usually unimaginative people who had only one dream in their lives. They put this dream into harness and beat it with a whip until it got them what they wanted out of living.

Then they discover that what they really all they want from living is after all. So they lose their faith in dreams of any kind. Cape Canaveral, Fla., Jan. 11 (AP)—An attempt at a second successful Polaris missile launching by the nuclear submarine Robert C. Taylor failed when the missile failed to be launched.

The Robert C. Taylor, the first of the new class of missile submarines, was on operational patrol within a few miles of the Cape Canaveral test range today. It was scheduled to launch the Polaris missile at 11:30 a.m. but the launch failed.

The missile was popped from the sub by compressed air and its first stage ignited as it cleared the water. It seemed to be a successful launch but when it reached an altitude of about 10 miles it began a loop back toward the ocean.

What caused the malfunction was not immediately known.

force." It was still concentrating on the competition of naval airpower and carriers when suddenly it became aware of the Polaris missile system, by now a reality with the first rocket boats in the fleet.

Overseas continental target areas which can be hit with missiles fired from submerged submarines are also being attacked by the long range strategic missiles of the Air Force. So now Air Force spokesmen are hammering hard on the idea of precision attack on military targets instead of

attacks on enemy population centers designed to inflict broad, general damage. Precision attack and "counter-force" of missiles primarily aimed to destroy enemy military power—and thus his ability to mount an offensive—has become the new air force position.

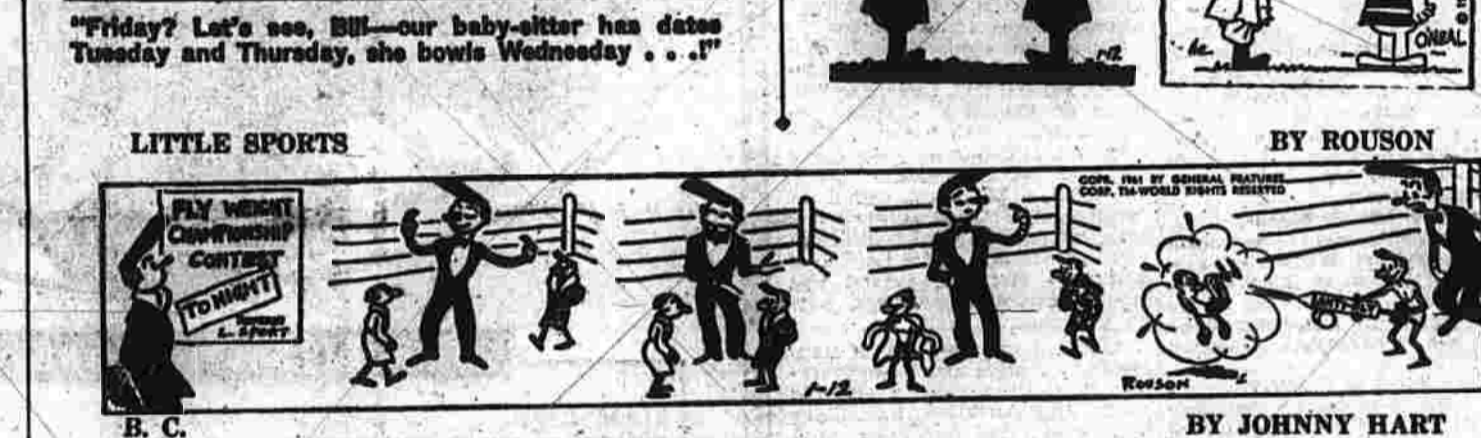
