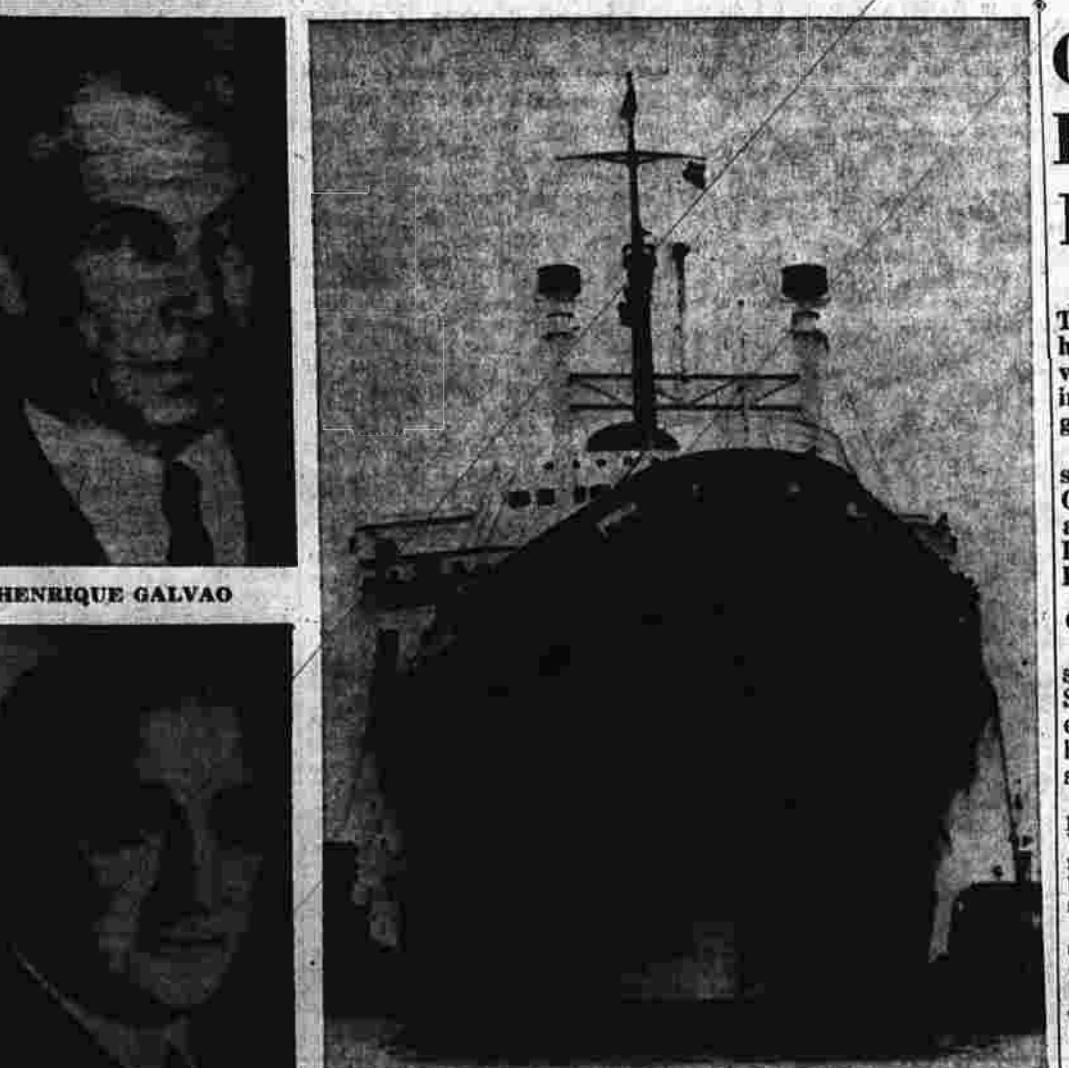

### Visiting Nurses Make 505 Calls

Manchester public health nurses made 505 visits during December, bringing to 8,500 the total number of visits made during 1960. Mrs. Rachel Barnes, nurse supervisor, reported at an annual meeting of the Manchester Public Health

Nursing Association board yesterday at Manchester Memorial Hospital. The visiting nurses made 632 more calls last year than during 1959. MHPHA has three full-time and one part-time nurse. There were 20 home visits made to expectant mothers and 616 visits after births. Mrs. Barnes reported. During December, MHPHA sponsored three maternity clinics

for 88 persons, four TB clinics for 80, and one tumor clinic for four persons. MHPHA staff, succeeding Mrs. Geraldine DeMarche who resigned, Miss Smith is a graduate of St. Francis Hospital School of Nursing, the University of Connecticut, and has been on the staff of the Hartford Visiting Nurse Association.

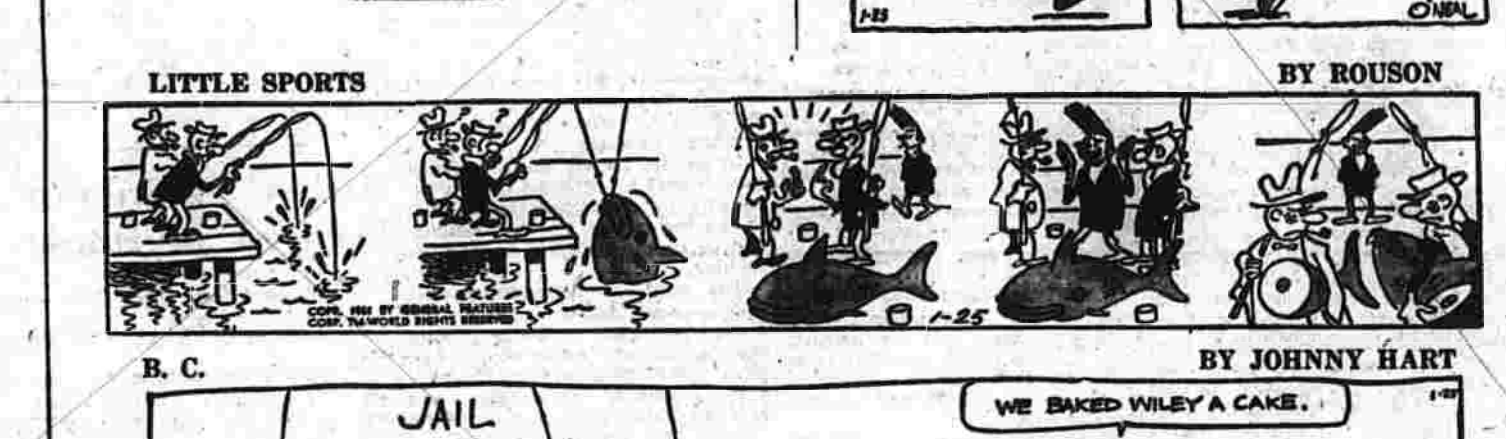

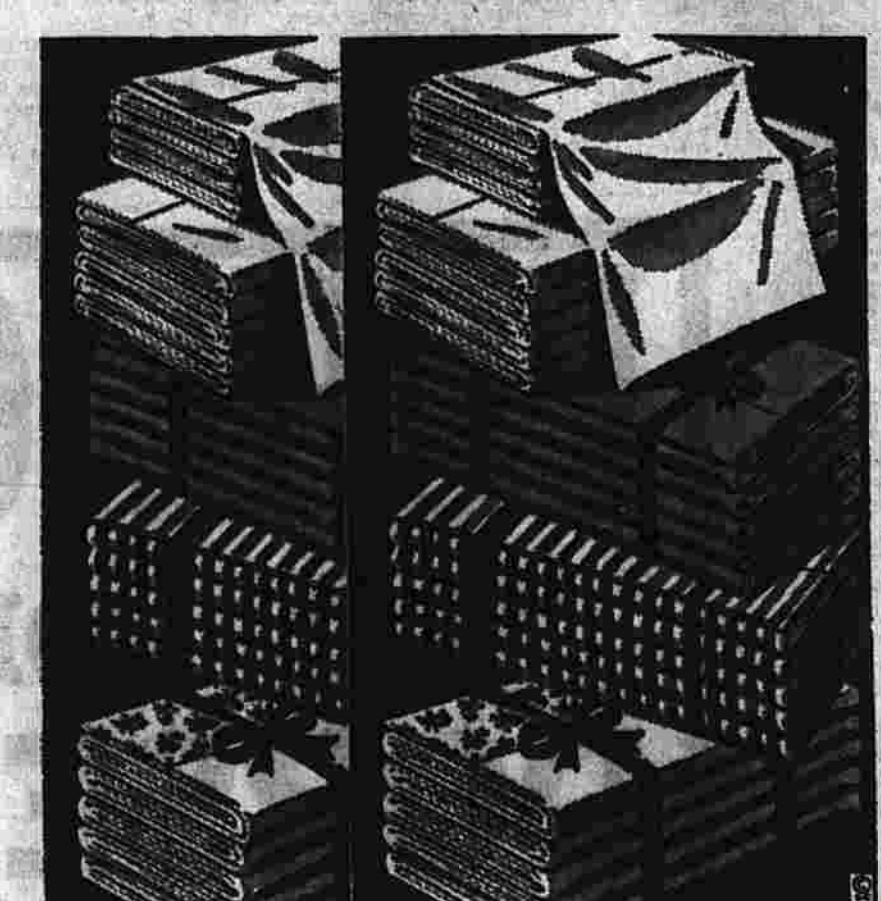
