### From Your Neighbor's Kitchen

 Mrs. Charles R. Baxter Jr., 64 Chestnut Dr., has two recipes for pies or squares which are popular finger refreshments for company meetings or tea.

She recently sent a box of these Brown Sugar Squares and Hood's Pineapple Squares to her son, Richard Baxter, freshman at Cornell University, for midnight snacks during exam period.

**Brown Sugar Squares**  
 1 cup shortening  
 2 cups white sugar  
 4 eggs, separated  
 2 teaspoons vanilla  
 3 cups sifted flour  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 2 teaspoons baking powder  
 2 cups light brown sugar  
 1 teaspoon vanilla  
 1 cup chopped nuts

Cream shortening and gradually add white sugar; beat until light. Add egg yolks one at a time; add two teaspoons vanilla and beat well. Sift flour, salt and baking powder. Add to the first mixture and beat well. Spread evenly in a greased baking pan, 11x17 or larger.

Beat egg whites until stiff. Keep beating and add brown sugar gradually with a teaspoon of vanilla. Spread this mixture over the first mixture. Put on by table-spoonful starting from the outer edge. Sprinkle chopped nuts over the top. Bake at 325 degrees for 25 to 40 minutes. Makes about 40 squares.

**Hood's Pineapple Squares**  
 1 box light brown sugar  
 2/3 cup shortening  
 2/3 cup flour  
 1/2 teaspoon baking powder  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 1/2 cup wheat germ  
 2 eggs  
 1/2 cup coconut  
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
 1 small pkg. chocolate bits  
 1/2 to 1 cup coconut  
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Melt shortening; add brown sugar; mix and beat. Add egg whites, beat three eggs. Add sifted dry ingredients. Add sugar and shortening mixture. Spread in a greased 9 x 13 pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Cut into squares while warm. Makes about 40 squares.

Both of these recipes came from friends in Manchester, and other friends. Mrs. Baxter has asked for these recipes ever since.

Mrs. Baxter was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. and grew up in Ithaca, N.Y. She is a member of the Y.W.C.A. and the Y.W.O.B. ### The Doctor Says

One Reader Has Worms' Fear of them is common. By HAROLD THOMAS HYMAN, M.D.

A New Jersey mother writes me a frantic note about worm infestations. She demands to know why, if the doctor's treatment with worm-killers or worm-catchers is so darned effective, it is necessary to go through all this house-pooing and hand-washing and "soul-searching?" And, without awaiting an answer, she concludes: "If it is a shame the medical profession hedges on this subject."

While I do not presume to be a specialist for worms, I can explain the necessity for the "house-pooing" (worm-killers) and vermicides (worm-catchers) perform exactly the functions that their names imply. Their action is limited to the killing and/or expulsion of worms that have already gained access to the intestinal tract. However, they do not prevent future invasions. It is essential to combine active worm prevention with active worm killing.

The logical thinking behind this program is the same as that which leads the housewife to perform domestic chores daily instead of expecting a single cleaning or washing to last a lifetime.

An anonymous writer, who writes under her initials lest her friends recognize her, asks the question: "wants to know if I favor the 'preventive' idea. It is good to have a cleaning out every week or two with a large dose of a worm-killer. I favor the 'preventive' idea."

Dear East, West, North or South, as the case may be, I regard the process to which you refer with exactly the same horror that my fellow columnist, Mr. Osgood Jacoby, would regard the lumping of a partner's ace.

Except under the most unusual and compelling circumstances, I would no more take or order what you call a strong laxative than I would favor application of a powerful irritant to any other "sensitive membrane" such as the eye.

Indeed, the insult conferred on the intestinal tract actually accomplishes nothing. For the catharsis of the day is followed by the contraction of tomorrow. And so on, as the saying goes, to infinity.

If your bridge partners feel that their functions need a bit of a nudge, advise them to drink two glasses of very hot tap water on arising. And if that does not produce the desired effect, let 100 tons of water be added to a teaspoonful of bear-pounce of soda to either or both.
