### Bolton Machine Vote Forced By School Boosters

A petition requesting a machine vote on the vote on junior high school questions scheduled for the town meeting next Monday has been filed with Town Clerk David C. Rooney by the boosters of the school proposal.

### You Should Know... Martin Aroian

For the past seven years, Martin Aroian has been compensating drug prescriptions for Massachusetts patients as chief pharmacist in Manchester Memorial Hospital. For nine years before he worked with drugs and managed drug stores in the greater Hartford area. He has been a registered Connecticut pharmacist for more than 18 years. All drugs used at MEMH are dispensed under his direct control.

Aside from dispensing drugs at MEMH, some of the other important duties to the hospital and public include maintaining an extensive pharmacy library to help staff doctors keep abreast of the latest changing needs and use of the thousands of drugs available to the medical profession.

A joint Pharmacy-Therapeutic committee, composed of Aroian and six staff doctors, meets once a month in an effort to reduce and duplicate the use of hospital drugs. The committee's goal is to make uniform the best use of the best available drugs for the hospital. As a result of this the total cost of buying drugs to the hospital has been reduced and patients being treated. Even at MEMH an estimated 800,000 dollars are saved in the hospital pharmacy.

Another important job for Aroian is to maintain a strict record control system with a running account on how many narcotic drugs are used in the hospital. Each patient is getting, how much of it, and how long the narcotic is being used. He also maintains a record of the different narcotics being used in the hospital.

Periodically, Aroian says, state drug and narcotic inspectors come to his pharmacy unannounced to make inspections. Every medicine, drug or narcotic substance sold to a pharmacy has an expiration date stamped on it. He is the chief drug inspector to see that all drugs with expired dates are thrown out as they are considered inferior by the medical profession.

Drug inspections are conducted in much the same way federal and state bank examiners check banks for discrepancies. During the seven years Aroian has been with MEMH there have been no drug discrepancies reported.

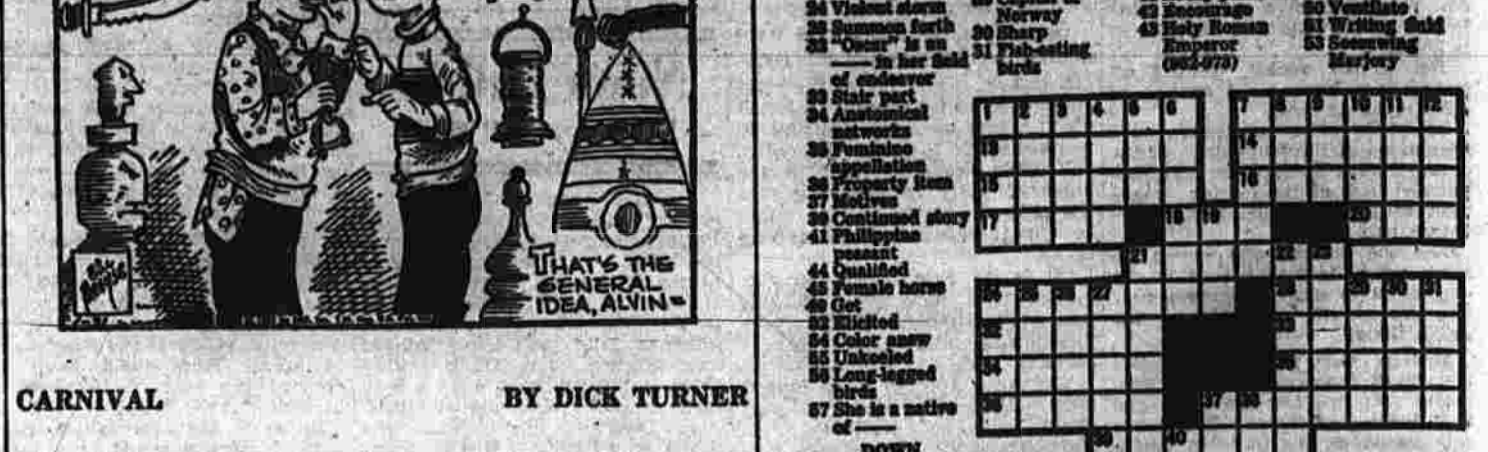
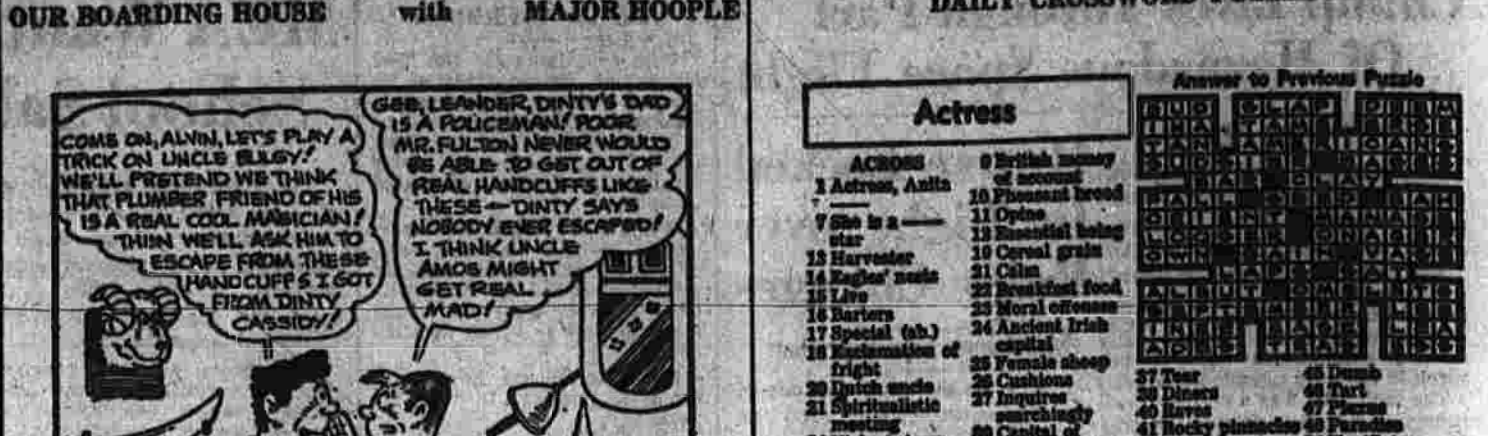

Mrs. Florence D. Loverin, tax collector, said the warrants would be assigned either to county assessors or to town constables tomorrow and, from then on, payment will have to be made through them.

Sixty-four warrants had been readied this morning. Taxes due on the 1959 grand list are 99.4 per cent collected. Mrs. Loverin said, with a handful of minor tax bills, she has only two major bills held up pending appeal of assessments to the Court of Common Pleas.

The assessments, applied by Phoenix Mutual Life Insurance Co. owner of the Center Shopping Plaza and LaPointe Electronics Inc., reflect taxes assessed to \$40,285.
