### State News Roundup

#### Mishaps Bring Death to Five

Five persons died of accidental causes over the weekend in Connecticut.

Three of the victims drowned, including two children. The two others perished in car accidents. Three-year-old Susan R. Seymour of Cos Cob drowned yesterday after she and her brother, Roger, 6, fell through the ice of a pond near their home at 31 Dandy Dr. A neighbor pulled them out, but Susan, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Roger Seymour, was dead before she could be given medical assistance.

In New Haven Saturday, a 2 1/2-year-old boy, Lawrence Ruggerio Jr., drowned in a small brook near his home in the Brookside section. It was too late by the time his father could pull him out.

In Hamden Saturday, police recovered the body of Charles Stothers, 38, of 35 Brown St., Hamden, from Clark's Pond off Whitney Ave. They said he had been missing since early Friday.

A 27-year-old Yale graduate student, Neil McShane, of Charlottesville, Va., was injured fatally on the Wilbur Cross Parkway in Woodbridge Saturday night when his car crashed into an abutment of an overpass. He died a short time later at St. Raphael's Hospital in New Haven.

Leroy Lamb, 53, a building inspector in Groton, was killed in a collision at the intersection of Routes 95 and 27 in Groton Saturday. An autopsy showed chest injuries had damaged his heart.

Both McShane and Lamb were alone in their cars.

### Hodges Says Tax Cut Unnecessary

Washington, March 13 (AP)—Secretary of Commerce Luther H. Hodges says it will not be necessary to cut taxes this spring to spur the economy. Hodges said yesterday he thinks the recession has hit bottom and the economy now can start upward.

President Kennedy said in January that he would take another look at the state of the economy in April. A temporary tax cut might then be considered, he said, if the economy is still lagging. Hodges said, "Generally speaking, I think there's a better spirit and a general feeling that things are going to get better soon."

Hodges was asked during a TV-radio interview if he credited Kennedy for this. He said "Kennedy's decisiveness, his interest in the people... his marvelous program" have helped. "The people have confidence in him and I think that's part of the whole thing," Hodges said.

### Union Workers At NHRP Plan Tax Bill March

Boston, March 13 (AP)—Representatives of 12,000 union employees of the New Haven Railroad have voted to halt work at 9 a.m. Wednesday and march on the State House to support a bill to give the carrier tax relief.

Just what effect the demonstration would have on the New Haven's operations was not clear. Much would depend on the numbers heading the call. But at least a slowdown seemed certain.

At the same time, the New Haven's president George Alpert was invited to appear before a legislative hearing Wednesday on a bill with record of the railroad's expenditures for travel, food, entertainment and similar items.

The invitation was extended by State Senator James D. Boston, chairman of the Joint Legislative Committee on Transportation. He said he feels the requested information desirable in view of Gov. John A. Volpe's proposal to cut the carrier tax 2 percent.

In a letter to Alpert, Boston asked a listing of "all expenses for travel, hotel or other living accommodations, food, entertainment, refurbishing, decoration or equipment of residential or busi-

### U.S. Couple Accused

## British Open Trial Of 5 as Red Spies

London, March 13 (AP)—An American couple and three others charged with stealing naval secrets and passing them on to the Russians pleaded innocent today at the opening of Britain's biggest spy trial since atom spy Klaus Fuchs was convicted a decade ago.

The famed main courtroom of the Old Bailey—where Fuchs was found guilty of giving the Soviet Union the keys to the atomic bomb—was filled as the case opened before Lord Parker, the chief justice.

The accused are: Gordon A. Lonsdale, 37, company director holding a Canadian passport but believed by the government to be a Russian.

Peter John Kroger, 50, bookseller, his wife, Helen, 47, who works for the U.S. Federal Bureau of Investigation says are Morris Cohen and his wife, Lola, American citizens and former residents of New York City.

Harry Frederick Houghton, 55, and his fiancée, Ethel Elizabeth Gee, 46, both British civil servants.

The government claims they stole secrets from the Royal Navy's underwater weapons base at Portland—where Miss Gee worked—and passed them to Moscow over a high-speed radio transmitter hidden in the Kroger's home.

Among the secrets which came into their hands, the prosecution claims were drawings of Dreadnaught, the British nuclear submarine based on designs supplied by the United States.

The attorney general, Sir Reginald Manningham-Buller, headed the prosecution. The government contends that Houghton and Miss Gee passed secret information to Lonsdale who relayed it to the ring's communication center—the innocent-looking bungalow in suburban Ruislip occupied by the Krogers.

Mingled in the courtroom crowd were British counterintelligence agents to testify on the first day of the case. They were to be identified only by letters of the alphabet when called to the witness box.

Intelligence officers from seven other countries were also present.

## Bid Soviet Air Good Intentions

Washington, March 13 (AP)—The White House said today 25 American private citizens who were in Moscow last November urged release of the two RB47 U.S. fliers as "a healthy first step" toward improving Soviet-American relations.

President Kennedy's press secretary, Pierre Salinger, told a news conference, in response to questions, that the group of 25 included two men who now are aides to Kennedy. They are Dr. Jerome B. Wiesner, special assistant for science and technology, and Dr. Walt W. Rostow, deputy assistant for national security.

Salinger said Wiesner and Rostow were in Moscow in November—shortly after Kennedy's election—with 23 other Americans to attend a scientific conference there.

Salinger said the entire group of Americans was in Moscow as private citizens. He added it is his understanding that Russian officials asked the Americans how Soviet-American relations could be improved.

"My information is," Salinger added, "that all 25 indicated that release of the fliers would be a healthy first step."

The White House statements came against a background of clamor from Republicans to know whether secret concessions were made to the Russians for release of Capt. Freeman B. Olmstead, Elmira, N. Y., and John R. McKone, Tonganoxie, Kan.

## Kasavubu to Head United Congo States

Tananarive, Malagasy Republic, March 13 (AP)—Anti-Communist political leaders of the Congo have agreed to replace their centrally controlled parliamentary government by a confederation of semi-independent states headed by Joseph Kasavubu.

The action of the political conference here on the island of Madagascar, which ended yesterday, raised hopes in Leopoldville that the way had been opened to an eventual end to the chaos and warfare that has plagued the Central African territory since it won independence from Belgium last summer.

The conference's final communique made no mention of pro-Communist Antoine Gizenga, whose forces control the eastern provinces of Oriental and Kivu. He was the only major leader absent from the talks. Kasavubu told newsmen that if Gizenga refuses to go along with the conference decision, he will be declared an outlaw. Presumably military measures then would be taken to suppress him.

Diplomats at the U.N. were not available for comment last night. Pravda, the Soviet Communist party organ, termed the conference decisions a colonialist plan to break up the Congo. "The Congo is a single country and it

has one legal government," said Pravda. The Soviet bloc recognizes Gizenga's regime as the only legal Congo government.

Kasavubu, who has been the Central Government president in Leopoldville and the only Congolese authority recognized by the U.N., messaged U.N. headquarters in New York to ask for recognition of the new setup and continued economic assistance. He said partial union has been achieved and the danger of civil war averted.

His cable to assembly President Frederick H. Boland and Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold repeated the conference's earlier demand for cancellation of the Security Council resolution on Feb. 21, which authorized U.N. troops in the Congo to use force if necessary to prevent civil war.

"There is no reason for them (the resolutions) to be executed now," Kasavubu's message said.

The conference agreed that technical assistance needed by the Congo can be made by the United Nations as an intermediary but without prerogatives of our sovereignty.

Kasavubu announced a delegation led by Katanga province officials would go to New York to tell

NAZI CAPTURE DENIED  
Mar Del Plata, Argentina, March 13 (AP)—Police today disclosed any knowledge of a published report that Nazi Josef Mengele has been surrounded by Israeli agents in a stone quarry near here. The report was published by the newspaper La Manana, which said Mengele's arrest was "a matter of hours." He was a Nazi doctor in Auschwitz concentration camp in World War II and is wanted by Argentine and West German governments.

DOCK STRIKE ENDS  
San Francisco, March 13 (AP)—Teamster local 85 returned to work this morning, re-opening the San Francisco Port after a 4-day dispute over cargo handling. Secretary Harold Lopez said agreement was reached with shippers after a 12-hour session ending at three o'clock this morning. The settlement affects more than 7,000 members of local 85 and brings back to work longshoremen who refused to cross Teamster picket lines.

### New Testament Revised

## The New English Bible

London, March 13 (AP)—A New Testament in modern English, 13 years in the writing, went on sale today.

Known as "The New English Bible," the new translation is the first revision in Britain since 1881.

And for the first time in British history, all the major churches in Britain, except for the Roman Catholic, joined in the revision of the project, says the original Greek and Hebrew have been translated into "English which is as clear and natural as the subject matter will allow."

Here is a comparison: Authorized version of the Lord's prayer: "Our Father which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in Earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into tempta-

tion, but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen."

New English Bible: "Our father in heaven, Thy name be hallowed; Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, On Earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us the wrong we have done, As we have forgiven those who have wronged us. And do not bring us to the test. But save us from the evil one." The revision was suggested in 1946 by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland. It said the church's work was hindered by the archaic language of the Bible.

A joint committee was formed in 1947 to direct the new translation.

All the responsibilities of publication were entrusted jointly to the University Presses of Oxford and Cambridge, which bear the whole cost and own the copyright.

The joint committee is composed of representatives of the Church of England, the Church of Scotland, the Methodist Church, the Congregational Union, the Baptist Union, the Presbyterian Church of England, the Church in Wales, the Church of Ireland, and the Society of Friends (Quakers). Also represented are the British and Foreign Bible Society and the National Bible Society of Scotland.

The publication is a joint statement of 1861 made as few alterations as possible. The wording of the changes was limited as far as possible.

## Tornado Damage High In Missouri, Arkansas

A turbulent storm raked the Midwest with damaging winds and heavy rains today after spawning more than a score of tornadoes which smashed paths of destruction through Missouri and Arkansas.

One woman was killed and at least 57 persons were injured yesterday as swirling winds crumpled homes, toppled radio towers and blew automobiles off highways.

Today, rain, sleet and snow drove eastward from the Mississippi valley. A band of sleet across southern Wisconsin fringed heavy snow which spread from northeastern Iowa and southeastern Minnesota over Wisconsin and into Michigan.

The precipitation was accompanied by 30-40-mile east and northeast winds, but not the violent twisters which spun over Missouri and Arkansas during the night.

Property damage was extensive in the 2-state area. Repairmen struggled to restore communications disrupted by downed lines. Felled trees barricaded roads. Heavy rains, flash floods and hail impeded rescuers.

It was feared the list of injured might grow when rescuers reached isolated areas. Sheriff Tommy Walker of Gelesco, Mo., said today after a twister had ripped through the Cape Fair area of Table Rock Lake.

There are so many people living in cabins around Table Rock Lake and back in the hills, there's just no telling how many got hurt. And it may be days before we find out.

At least one storm battered community—Vilena, Ark.—State Police were dispatched to the scene after reports of looting. A tornado whirled out of the darkness near West Plains, Mo.

and shattered the little frame Friendship Baptist Church, in which 30 persons were attending Sunday evening services. A worshiper, Mrs. Frances Huddleston, 42, was killed. Her husband, Dr. J. A. Huddleston, 43, was seriously injured while 10 other churchgoers suffered lesser hurts.

The twister destroyed a filling station and damaged several other buildings near the church. Earlier, the same tornado destroyed a store, filling station and home at Hardenville, about 25 miles southwest of West Plains.

Six persons were injured near Tipton Ford, about seven miles south of Joplin, Mo., where a twister destroyed at least two homes, damaged several others and hurled a pickup truck against a tree.

Three of four radio towers of Station KWTO were blown down by a tornado that struck about three miles south of Springfield, Mo. Several farm buildings also were damaged.

Other twisters were sighted near Branson, Monett and Nevada, Mo., and several automobiles were blown off U.S. 71.

Considerable damage was reported in the tornado-struck Arkansas community of Busch, near the Missouri border, where at least 14 persons were injured.

"I woke up on the floor," said Bobby James Stewart, 26, who was in a cafe when the twister churned through Busch. "Everything else was gone and there was an ice box on top of me." He was seriously injured.

At least two tornadoes were sighted in the Clarkville, Ark., area. One struck the nearby community of Woodland, injuring at least 12 persons. Also hit in that

## Cuba Executes W. A. Morgan, Castro Ex-Aide

Havana, March 13 (AP)—William A. Morgan, American soldier of fortune who fell from national hero to traitor in the eyes of the Fidel Castro regime, was buried yesterday in a crypt beside the Cuban major executed with him.

Friends of Morgan's Cuban wife attended the rites in Colon Cemetery, and a Catholic priest officiated. Mrs. Morgan, in hiding to escape captivity, did not attend the funeral. She and 10 others were convicted of treason along with her husband last week, and she was declared a fugitive.

The 9-man court at La Cabana Fort sentenced Morgan and Maj. Jesus Carreras to die Saturday after convicting them of aiding anti-Castro rebels in the mountains. A firing squad shot them in a dress most outside the ancient fortress a few hours later.

The military tribunal acquitted three of the defendants. Saturday, gave Morgan's former driver 15 years in prison after he had turned police to his death yesterday. Seven defendants to 30-year jail terms.

## Financier Plunges 17 Stories to Death

New York, March 13 (AP)—Multimillionaire Iannis Ditisheim, 59, Swiss-born financier with a taste for the daring in both work and play, plunged to his death yesterday from the roof of a 17-story Bronx building. Police said it was an apparent suicide.

A note from Ditisheim to his wife, Cornelia, was found on the roof. Police declined to disclose its contents but they said it emphasized worry over his health and not his finances.

Mrs. Ditisheim said she awakened in the morning to find her husband missing from their rambling 18-acre estate, Les Oiseaux, in suburban Tarrytown, N.Y. She identified the body here.

Mrs. Ditisheim told police her husband had appeared in good spirits Saturday. She said he spent the entire day at home.

The building from which Ditisheim plunged, one of seven apartment houses in the 116 million Fordham Housing Develop-
