### Rockville-Vernon Vote on Revised District Due When 'Time Right' Vice Says

Conservative factions in the Vermont District plan to bring to referendum a proposal to revise the district government. A petition calling for the referendum will be filed "when the time is right," a spokesman said today.

Loew V. Vice, chairman of the Vermont Taxpayer Bureau Inc., said the petition, which was being circulated two months ago, is "all ready."

He indicated it will be submitted some time in June or early July, prior to the annual district meeting.

The number of signatures was not disclosed. Vice said when the petition was in circulation that a goal of 750 to 1,000 names was sought.

He talked optimistically of the chances for the proposal and said the Vermont Independent party, of which he is a member, will have a full slate of officers ready for election to the new government.

The petition will call for a referendum on a plan to replace the current board of commissioners by a president-board of directors form of government with broader powers than now exist.

If successful, the proposal would mean that the Vermont Independent party, which has been active in the town, would have a major voice in the district government.

He said he was "not at liberty to make any name of candidates for positions in the new government proposal."

He said the independent party has "got some of the oldest fellows in town" lined up for nomination.

If voters approve the change, the district would become, to all intents and purposes, a town unit and would assume the functions now the responsibility of the board of selectmen.

However, the separatists have indicated they would have the school system a townwide function. The annual school budget is the biggest single item in the budget, representing 70 per cent of the town's operating costs.

A number of objections to consolidation have been advanced. Vice, Bronkie and Correll, all have said the present move for a single government is a waste of time because it comes too soon after the 1960 defeat of a one-government charter.

The majority of voters in the five districts, they say, are still as opposed to consolidation as they were last July 8 when they defeated it a three-to-one margin.

"Suppose the burden of special taxes for certain special services within the city became too great to bear by the persons directly benefited, who will be left to pick up the tab?" was one question.

However, in a later conversation, he said he felt that "whenever they consolidate, they'll pay Rockville's debt." He referred to district tax-payers.

### Rockville-Vernon Independents Plan to Join National Unit

The Vermont Independent Party (VIP), registered in Connecticut, will affiliate with the proposed National Independent Party (NIP) when and if it is formed, according to Loew V. Vice.

A VIP member, Vice said the local party is strongly considering sending a representative to a rally of the self-applied NIP in Chicago Thursday through Saturday.

He said he has entertained thoughts of making the trip himself, but will not know definitely until the middle of the week.

The rally, reportedly to be attended by representatives from conservative and ultra-right-wing groups in various states, is scheduled to be held at Chicago's Merit Hotel, Vice said.

The only theme, he said, is "Keep America for the Americans by all effective government." A target of the independents, he added, is the "selective government in the two old parties."

He said he has been informed that representatives from about half the 60 states are definitely signed up to attend.

Among them is Congressman Edgar Heistand of California, who has figured in recent Communist debate on the controversial John Birch Society, an anti-Communist organization.

Heistand voiced support of the proposal to separate the Vermont Fire District from the City of Rockville and would further move toward consolidation of Vermont's three governments.

Heistand is a full-time administrative assistant responsible to the director.

The committee is awaiting action on the enabling act now before the legislature. The act would empower the committee to place a single-government charter before the voters for approval as soon as possible but with an outside limit of Sept. 1.
