Chief Justice Reprimands Frankfurter

Washington, April 25 (AP)—Chief Justice Earl Warren in an unusually far-reaching opinion in the Supreme Court bench has cautioned Justice Felix Frankfurter against making any dissenting remarks to "degrade" the high tribunal.

Warren's reprimand came after Frankfurter yesterday made a lengthy dissenting opinion to a 5-4 decision that set aside a murder conviction. Warren told the 17-year-old Frankfurter, who would be in the court's close conference room but not in open court session.

The Chief Justice added that if the dissenting remarks by Frankfurter had been made in the latest formal, written dissenting opinion, Warren would have no objection to his doing so.

Mr. Frankfurter's dissenting opinion was the last of many that he has written in the Supreme Court since he joined the court in 1939.

Warren's reprimand was a surprise to those who follow the court's proceedings. Frankfurter has been a vocal dissenter in many cases, but he has never before been reprimanded by the chief justice.

The dissenting opinion was written in a case involving the conviction of a 17-year-old boy for the murder of a girl.

Warren's opinion was a landmark decision, as it set aside the conviction and the death sentence that had been handed down by a state court.
