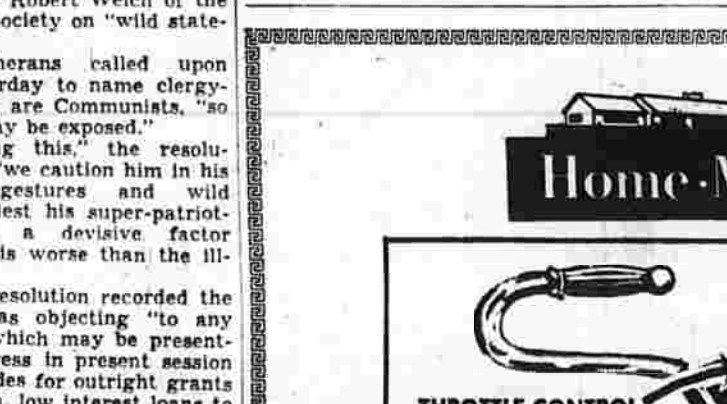

Spontaneous shooting broke out but after daylight life in Algiers steadily returned to normal. Stores and shops opened and buses were on schedule.

Paris, information minister Louis Terrenoire said a plane from Algeria had landed at British Guelma with 100 rebels, "accomplices of Challe but he did not know their names."

Terrenoire met with reporters after the cabinet in a special session discussed the consequences of Challe's instructions.

Terrenoire said the insurrection had put France in a deadly peril. "In the early hours of the rebellion," Terrenoire said, "the state had been abandoned to the mercy of those who did it."

Nits, Body Lice Are Quoted By New Treatment Method

Entoparasites is the fancy name we give a crawling insect that takes up residence in our hair or on our skin.

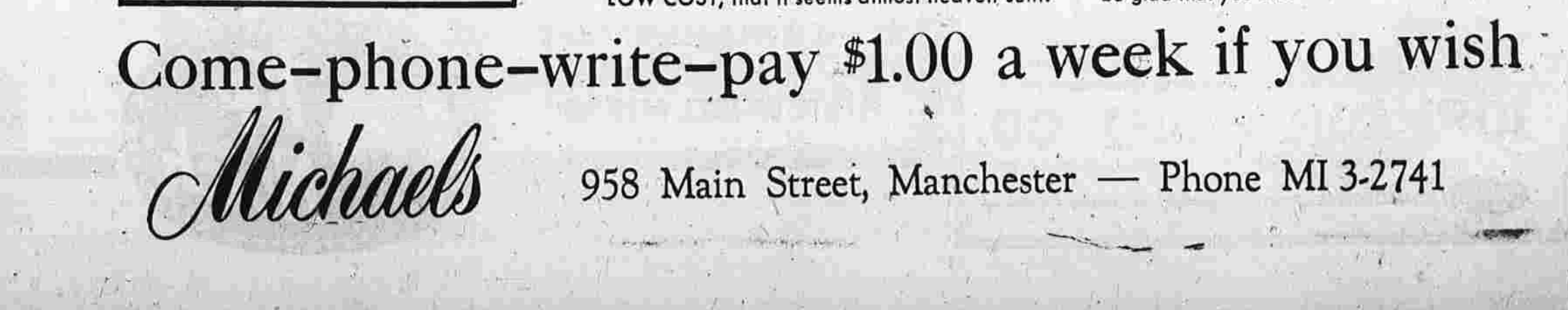
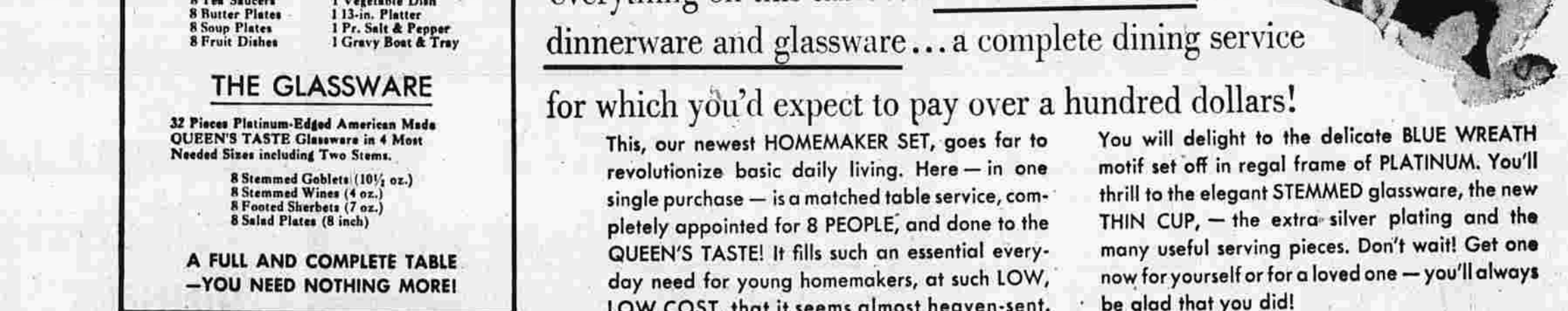
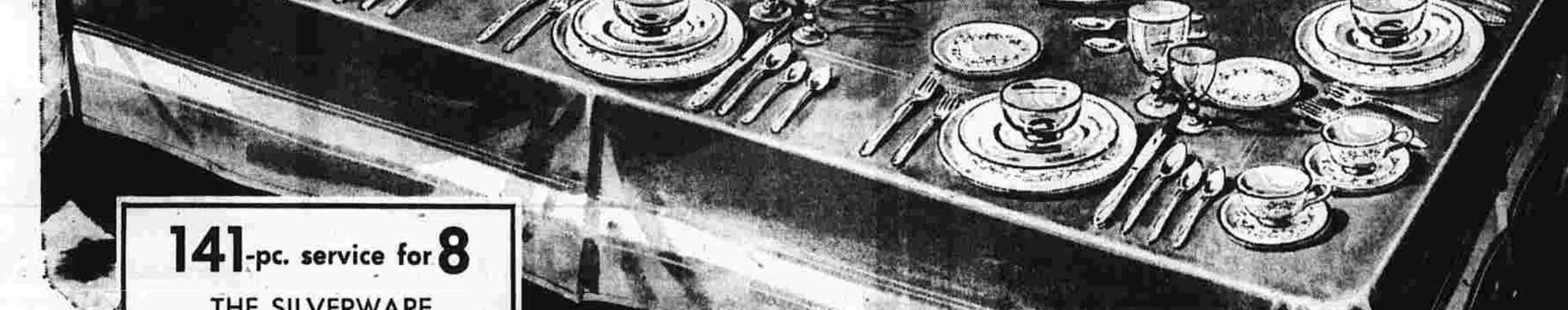

Home Gardener's Handbook

Dry Flowers for Year-Long Displays

By ALLAN SWENSON (Writes for NEA Service)

You can capture the beauty of your outdoor garden this year by drying blooms for long-lasting flowers in indoor displays.

Flower blooms can be preserved in several ways from natural drying to a sand-and-borax treatment. Natural drying works well with cockscomb, celosia, hydrangea and wild plants such as curly dock and milkweed.

All you do is place them in a container without water. Remove all leaves before any drying process because foliage doesn't dry well.

Hanging is a simple way to preserve flowers. Aim for rapid drying. Hanging is generally most successful with larkspur, roses, dahlias, gladioli, thistles and flowers with florets so tiny that other drying techniques might damage them.

Use a pipe cleaner, rubberband or plastic ties to hold a bunch of blooms together. Hang the flowers bloom downward in a dark, dry place such as an attic or boiler room. Avoid basements which are damp. You want dry heat to preserve flowers properly.

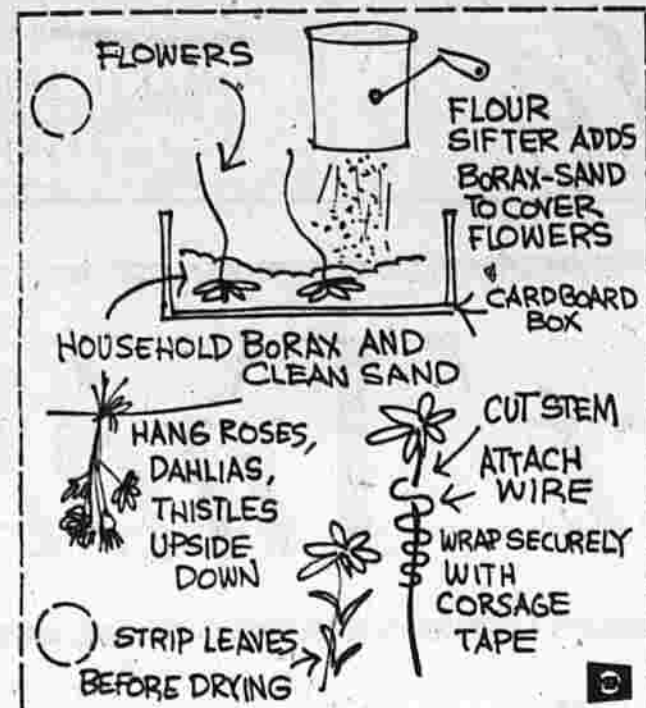
Flowers need slightly more care to preserve them properly. Daffodils, tulips, dahlias, dogwood, roses, marigolds, pansies and asters are best done with the sand-borax treatment. All you need is a cardboard box and a few sheets of powdered laundry borax. Corn cobs can be substituted for borax if you prefer.

Place the box with half borax or corn meal. Sift this mixture into the cardboard box, about two inches deep.

Cut flowers when they are about half open. Clean them of foreign material and use a blotter to soak off excess moisture. Place the blooms upside down carefully in the sand-borax mixture. Then sift more mix into the petals until the flowers are completely covered. Take care not to push petals out of their natural shape.

Place the box in a warm, dry location. You can also bake the flowers in direct sunlight. Flowers should dry in between one and two weeks.

Stems usually need reinforcement. Remove the stem, leaving about half inch near the bloom. Cut a wire stem, using 18 to 32 gauge wire, depending on the size stem you wish to duplicate. Then wrap the stems with florist cord. Use a wire and you are ready to brighten your rooms with dried flower arrangements throughout the year.



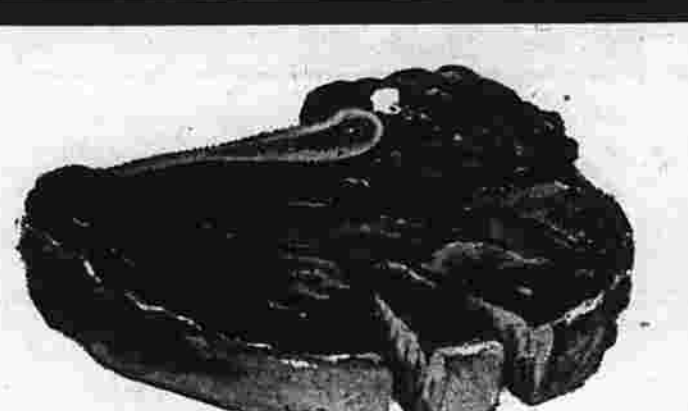

Who would use a slice of bacon for a bookmark? Somebody. Someone else used a butcher knife among an odd assortment of items they have left in books borrowed from the Birmingham (Ala.) Public Library.

Miss Adelle Cobb, head of the library's circulation department, has found everything from money to a butcher knife which had been used to slice chocolate cake.

Miss Cobb has a theory. When a book is left, the reader notes, and before he goes to sleep, he drops whatever happens to be in his hand into the book, closes it, and that's how it goes back to the library.

Loosanoff, director of the Bureau's Biological Laboratory at Milford, wrote in Europe consulting with other shellfish scientists, described the success achieved by his laboratory in the artificial cultivation of oysters and clams and suggested that French scientists experiment with New England grown juvenile mollusks. The French scientists, sensitive to their national love for seafood, eagerly accepted Dr. Loosanoff's offer. New England hard-shelled clams, known locally as "quahogs" and as "Venus mercenaria" by scientists were chosen for the test.

Seventy thousand young clams were carefully shipped by air to Paris where they were met by French fishery scientists and sped to experimental beds at Arzacq and La Tremblade for planting.

These pioneer clams have done so well in French waters that recently the French Institut Scientifique Technique des Peches Maritimes, an institution corresponding to our Bureau of Commercial Fisheries, has asked Dr. Loosanoff for an additional shipment. This time, however, the "clams" will be assigned to the Mediterranean where they are expected to thrive in the much warmer waters than are found along the west coast of France.

Yankee clams sent several years ago by the Milford Laboratory to Florida have made remarkable progress so Dr. Loosanoff has high hopes for the latest shipment which will make their new home in the warm waters of the South of France.

Your Pocketbook

Ways to Prevent Having Your Wage Garnished

It is my fervent hope that a garnishment means nothing more to you than the pickle on your hamburger.

The dictionary says a garnishment is an ornament. But it also offers a legal definition: "a notice to one to appear in court." A garnishment is a court order compelling your employer to hold up all or part of your pay. It means he must send your money to someone who claims you owe him money.

In recent months, several of the nation's largest companies have noted a rise in garnishments. The areas the rate of such debtors is as high as 10 out of 100.

There are several reasons for this increase. Generally, garnishments increase as the hours worked and income declines. Some garnishments have an inherent defect because they are within their means. Others fall into this debt trap because they actually have been hoodwinked into buying without knowing what they are buying.

It is usually the person of modest means that gets into this sort of trouble, often because he is tempted to believe a sale is being offered a real bargain.

The consequences of being a garnishment vary. They depend on state laws, the company for which you work, your marital status, occasionally union intervention. Some employers insist on a charge garnishment; others do all they can to help them. Some union contracts forbid the discharge of garnished employees; others accept it.

If you are garnished, your company is unhappy about it for several reasons. Almost everyone looks down upon those who cannot manage their own finances. The cost to a company of processing garnishments averages \$100 per employee invariably in an unhappy person whose troubles prey on his mind, often causing him to be accident prone.

There are several alternatives to garnishment.

In some states you are permitted to petition for receivership, meaning you turn your entire pay check over to the court which then returns it to you part of your creditor.

Or you can file bankruptcy proceedings.

Better yet, stay out of the garnishment trap by:

1. Not buying anything you cannot afford.

2. Buying only from reputable sources and arranging the financing of noncash purchases through a well-known financial source rather than the merchant.

3. Never signing a paper until it is completely filled out and you understand everything printed on it, including the exact dollars to be financed.

If lines or loss of work makes it difficult or impossible to pay debts, explain this to those to whom you owe money.

Seek legal advice if headed for trouble. In many cities legal aid societies provide services free or for a small fee.

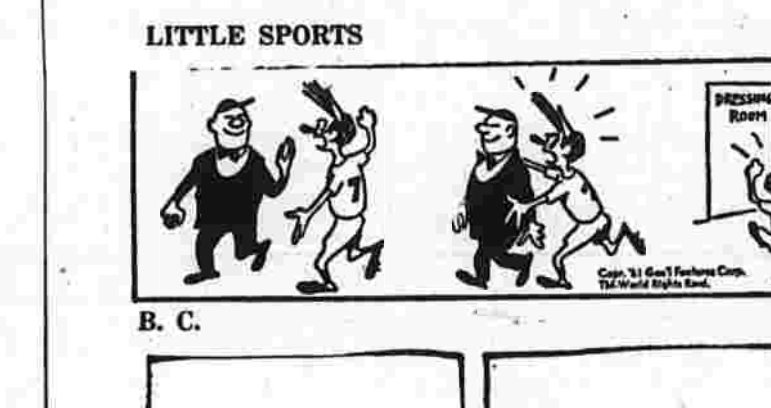

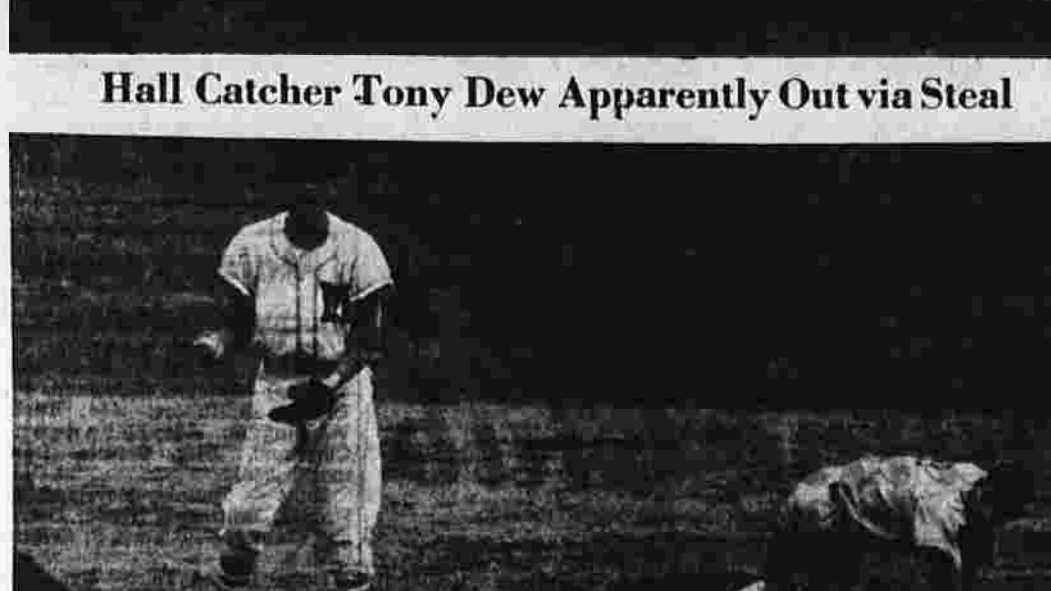

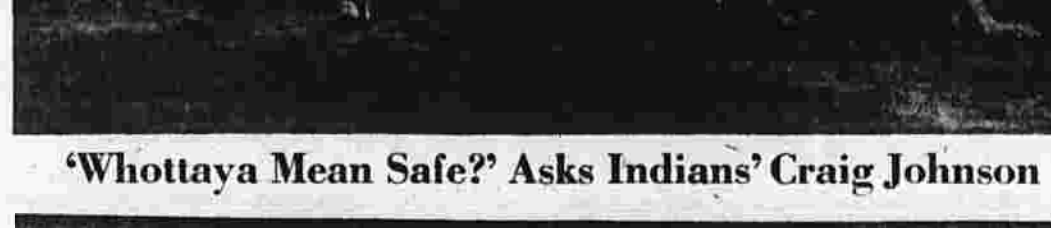
