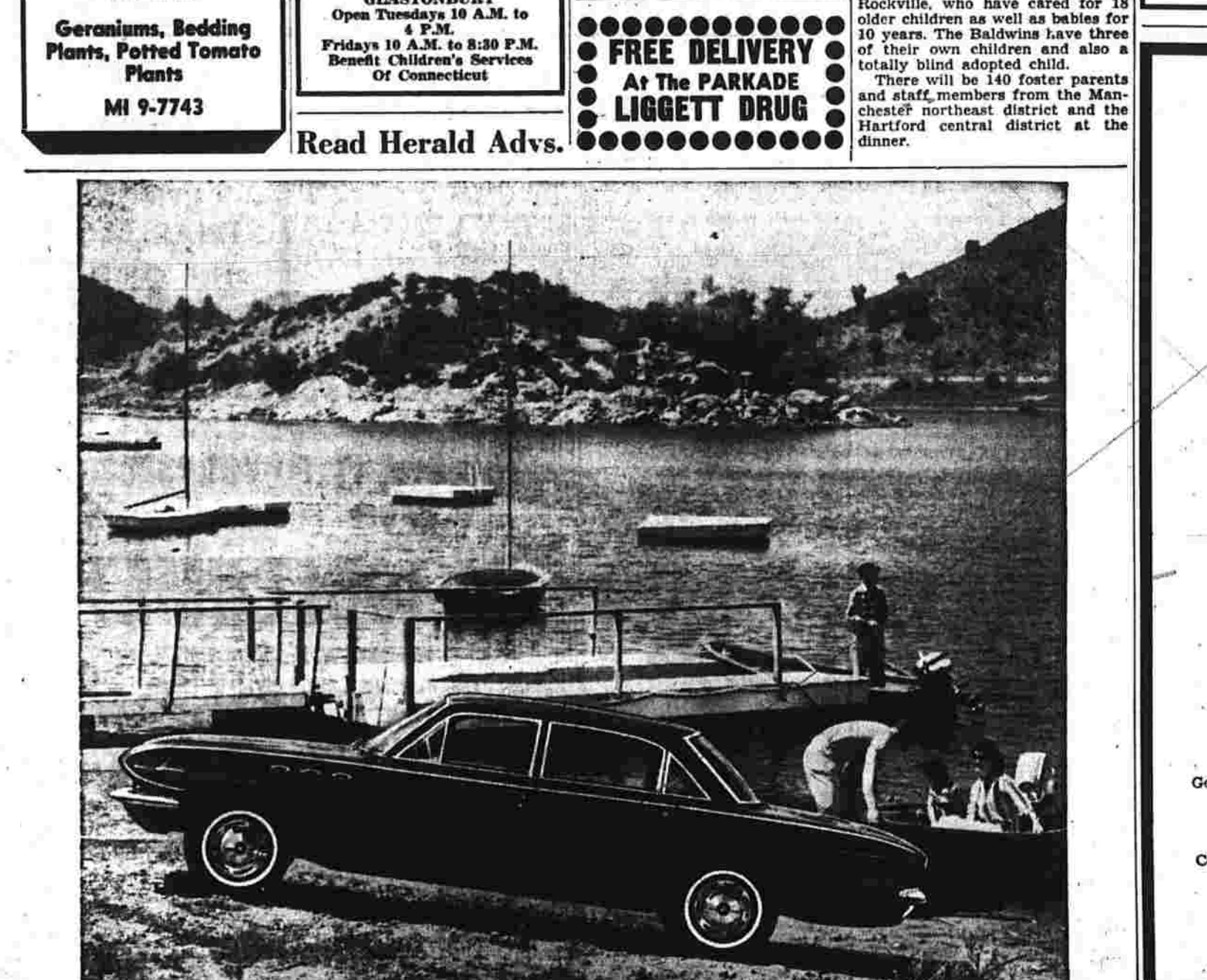

### South Windsor Town Clerk's Salary Issue Dominates Budget Hearing

The Board of Finance held a public hearing last night before 40 persons to review a \$561,615.26 general government budget proposal. Most of the items went unquestioned, but a few were subject to discussion.

The most controversial item of the evening was the \$9,000 salary request for town clerk.

The town clerk has operated under the fee system to date, but with the change in government Oct. 31, he will be salaried. In order to make the transition more gradual, however, the salary arrangement will not take effect until March 31.

Under the fee system, the town clerk received \$3,000 for duties other than those of his office, and \$5,000 to \$5,000 a year in fees. Under the charter, an elected official's salary cannot be raised or lowered during his term of office, and his salary would therefore be set for four years at the time of his election. It was felt by most that the clerk's income should not be lowered because of the change of government. There was a feeling, however, that \$9,000 is a high salary.

The question arose as to the advisability of paying a town clerk \$9,000 as opposed to an estimated \$7,500 for town manager. It was pointed out that the \$7,500 figure was only a request or approximation, and that, being an appointed official, the town manager may have increases in salary whenever the council sees fit.

Charles Hudson suggested a minimum and a maximum salary schedule be set for the town clerk so that someone like Charles Stone, the present town clerk, who has been in office for 16 years, can be properly recompensed. Also, if the need arises for a less experienced man, there would be adequate provisions for his proper salary.

The second item to be explained in detail was under registrar of voters. Mrs. Arline Bidwell and Mrs. Elaine Grizer spoke on behalf of the \$1,600 appropriation for equipment. This figure would cover the installation of a fingerprint card system by Remington Rand, and served three terms as grand master of Bay State Masons.
