Stamps in the News

German Evangelical Day
 The 100th Anniversary of German Evangelical Day is being celebrated July 15, with the issue of two stamps by the city of West Berlin.

The stamp will appear in two denominations. For the 10 pfennig value the emblem of Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church is depicted in green and violet, the ruins of Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church are represented in red and yellow on the 20 pfennig issue. This church is significant in that it was left as a memorial after the World War II, and serves the cause of peace for the citizens of Berlin.

Both of the new stamps carry the inscription—Deutscher Evangelischer Kirchentag 1961—in an unique capital letters. "Deutsche Evangelische Kirche" and the value also appear in the same type face.

The stamps were designed by Gerhart von Berlin, with lithography by the German State Printing Office in Berlin. Photographs are not available at this time.

Get Full Diabetes Test If Some Symptoms Appear

The commonest cause for sugar in the urine (glycosuria) is diabetes mellitus. But that doesn't mean that everyone with glycosuria is necessarily diabetic. Far from it, as I hasten to assure a correspondent who became glycosuric during pregnancy.

While diabetes and pregnancy may be combined, the vast majority of prospective mothers who develop glycosuria during the pregnancy are simply having a "lactose" (lactose) not the real diabetes. The latter is a disease that's due to a profound disturbance of the certain cells in the pancreas (islets).

In addition to lactose, many other sugars may appear in urine. Maltose, particularly in winter time, try to get out of service by adding cane sugar (sucrose) to the specimen they offer. And in certain families, nearly everyone passes another form of sugar whose recognition requires special tests.

Then, each of us probably is glycosuric at some crucial time in our lives. Some years ago, specimens taken between halves of an Ivy League football game showed that almost half the players gave positive tests. And the same was true of students also may occur as a result of the character of the administration of certain drugs.

Now while the early recognition of a true diabetes is of enormous importance, and every cooperation should be given the campaign given in prompt detection of the condition, it is more the diagnosis of diabetes than a single routine examination.

If you are a suspect, you are entitled to a thoroughgoing investigation before being ruled for insurance or burdened with the diagnosis of a chronic disturbance, however easily that may be controlled with present methods of treatment.

In other words, consider yourself innocent until you're proven guilty. And, if you're a true diabetic, think the diagnosis through you.

One of Dr. Oiler's best known medical axioms suggests that "to enjoy a long, developing chronic disease at an early age."

And Recognize East Germany West Held Preparing New Berlin Approach

One State Department official remarked that what Khrushchev said on disarmament was clear but the parts of his speech dealing with Germany and Berlin have to be examined carefully because of the problem's complexity.

"Words can be tricky," he said, "and his words have to be scrutinized under the magnifying glass."

Khrushchev's new declaration on Berlin was viewed in western Europe today as a tough amendment to the Allied position, the statement of past Soviet demands. There was general regret that the announcement seemed to extinguish faint hopes of an easing of international tension raised by President Kennedy's meeting with the Soviet premier in Vienna earlier this month.

The premier's adamant stand at Vienna already had been discredited by the official news agency Tass June 11. Khrushchev in a TV broadcast that night to the Soviet people spelled out his position again.

At Vienna, he proposed an immediate peace conference on Germany. He said West Germany and Communist East Germany should have to give six months to work out a treaty that both the Soviet bloc and the West would be bound to accept.

Going over this ground in his report to the Russians, Khrushchev summed up his position this way:

"We ask everyone to understand us correctly. The conclusion of a peace treaty with Germany cannot be postponed any longer. A peaceful settlement in Europe must be accomplished this year."

Khrushchev then repeated his old threat to sign a separate peace treaty with East Germany, giving that regime control over the supplies to the Allied garrisons in West Berlin. And he said any attempt to change Germany's present borders "would mean a new nuclear war."

To some British newspapers, the tenor of Khrushchev's remarks appeared to be a warning to the West that he at last means business over Berlin. The Daily Sketch headlined: "Berlin by Christmas."

Waris Mr. K. "The Heat's On," his story said Khrushchev "let no doubt that he has turned the heat on the Berlin issue."

Kennedy himself, in his report to the people of the United States on June 6, declared that "our most serious talks were on the subject of Germany and Berlin."

Khrushchev told the Russian people the Vienna meeting "provided a good opportunity for a first personal contact and an exchange of opinion and was worthwhile and even necessary."

On disarmament, Khrushchev asserted the western nations were not prepared to negotiate seriously "and to be frank, do not want disarmament to this day." He repeated:

Frogmen Net 3 Pacifists

Groton, June 15 (F)—Three pacifists were taken from the Thames River by Coast Guard frogmen yesterday, halted in an effort to place themselves in the path of the newly launched nuclear, missile, firing submarine Thomas Edison.

The 200 million submarine sailed gracefully down the ways at noon, moments after being christened by Mrs. John E. Sloan, 72, West Orange, N. J., a daughter of the famed inventor.

The three gave their names as Gene Keyes, 16, Champlain, 11, a Harvard freshman; Edward Gurnea, 22, New York City, a former Marine who attended Columbia; and Edward Sanders, 21, New York City, a New York University student, all members of the Committee for Non-Violent Action (CNVA).

They had dived into the river at a point north of the launching site after being prevented from putting a canoe in the water.

The three were released after the Coast Guard once they were taken to the New London side of the river. The incident was referred to the U.S. attorney's office in New Haven.

Sanders was treated by the Coast Guard for foot and leg cuts, apparently suffered on the launch. Despite the pacifist activity, James H.
