Pat McGoochan Star of CBS 'Danger Man'

Patrick McGoochan, star of the new "Danger Man" series on CBS Television Network, reveals that a strange indifference to financial security plus a desire for a life of excitement led to his becoming an actor. By all rights, he should have become a farmer and taken over his family's productive acres in Ireland. Or he might have become an executive for a British firm. Instead, he is an actor.

Encyclical Nightmare For Vatican Scholars

By BENNET BOLTON Vatican City, July 17 (AP)—Pope John XXIII's monumental social encyclical, "Mater et Magistra," was a translator's nightmare for the Vatican's Latin scholars.

It was easier to explain "dielectric material"—"vaporous incandescent" (more prosperous state), "Economic development" (economic thinking).

The Latin experts translated the phrase "the end of Asian and African colonial regimes" this way: "Depuis la publication administrative forma coloniarum propriae assise de Afrique populi" (the rejected form of public administration typical of colonies such as those of the people of Asia and of Africa).

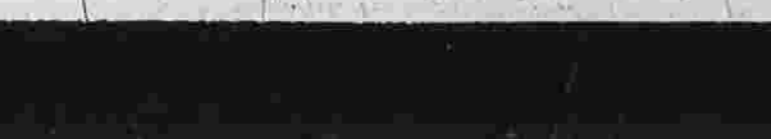
