The equipment used to detect atomic explosions, Hoffield, chairman of the Senate House Atomic Energy Committee, said "We're planning to have some hearings in the very near future to find out why it has gone so slowly."

He urged Kennedy to take steps to make the public anxiously aware that "we do not have a defense against atomic attack at this time." He added:

"All our reports indicate that we stand absolutely naked to an atomic attack by the Soviet Union. We have no defense against missiles from the Soviet, and our people have no protection against radiation that could occur as the result of an attack."

Geneva, July 5 (AP)—Britain accused the Soviet Union today of refusing to negotiate a treaty to suspend nuclear weapons testing and reducing the conferees to the level of Cold War propaganda.

Sir Michael Wright of Britain made the charge at the 25th session of the 25-month-old 3-power nuclear talks Conference here. He quoted him as telling Soviet Delegate Semyon K. Tsarapkin:

"Not only is the Soviet delegate refusing to negotiate with us (on a controlled test basis), but he is reducing the level of discussion to that of a Cold War propaganda platform."

Sir Michael rejected as "unfounded and unwarranted" Tsarapkin's accusation in the last session that the western powers are preparing the ground for a resumption of atomic weapons tests.

Aboard outboards with removable tanks, remove these containers and fuel them on the dock.

On inboards, close all hatches and ports while fueling. Then open hatches and ports for ventilation, and run blower for at least five minutes. Stuff in the lower part of the tank and engine compartment. If you smell gasoline, don't start!

Cincinnati Leading on July 4, Hope Position Promises Flag

New York, July 5 (AP)—The Cincinnati Reds still hold first place by two games now that the smoke has settled on July 4 in the National League race, and their supporters are in a position that promises a pennant. But even the die-hard fans here will admit it isn't necessarily so.

Tradition has it that the Fourth of July wins the flag, yet the Reds have been able to cash in on that bit of folklore only once in three chances. The last time they did it was in 1919, when they won the pennant by a slim margin. In 1920, it turned out to be the last day they were in first place, and in 1935, they lost the pennant to the Milwaukee Braves.

Still, the record shows that 33 July 4 leaders have become champions over the past 50 years in the National League, while 41 have made in the American. It's a tradition that has stood up only twice in the past five years in the NL, however, in 1958 for the Braves and last season for Pittsburgh.

It had for the first time in 1958, when they repeated in 1960, Brooklyn led on July 4. Cincinnati has had the lead on July 4 and won by 13-4.

Win or lose, the Reds have opened up a 2 1/2-game spread over third place San Francisco, and fourth place Pittsburgh by eight and a half games. Milwaukee by 1 1/2, there hasn't been that much daily showing in NL standings at this stage since 1955, when Brooklyn led by 1 1/2 on July 4 and won by 13-4.

The Reds retained their two-game edge by beating Pittsburgh 6-0 on the threshold, pitching Joey Jay while the second place Los Angeles Dodgers won, fourth in a row, 6-3, at Milwaukee. San Francisco split a pair, Milwaukee winning in a romp, 18-2, before the Cubs made off with a 3-2 decision. St. Louis and Philadelphia also split, the Cards winning 10-1 in the nightcap, and the Phillies taking the nightcap, 10-4.

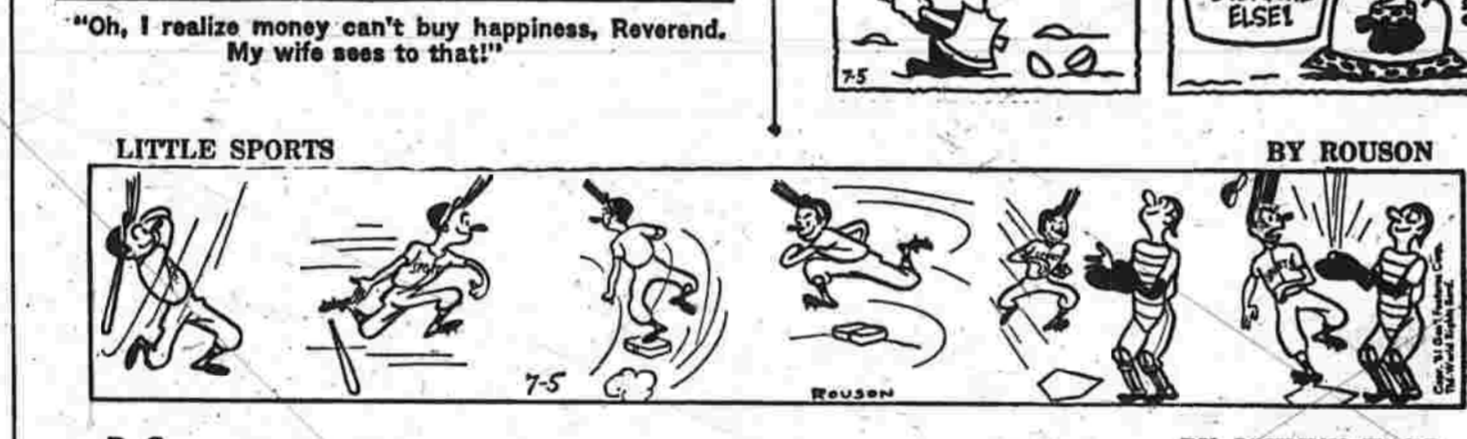
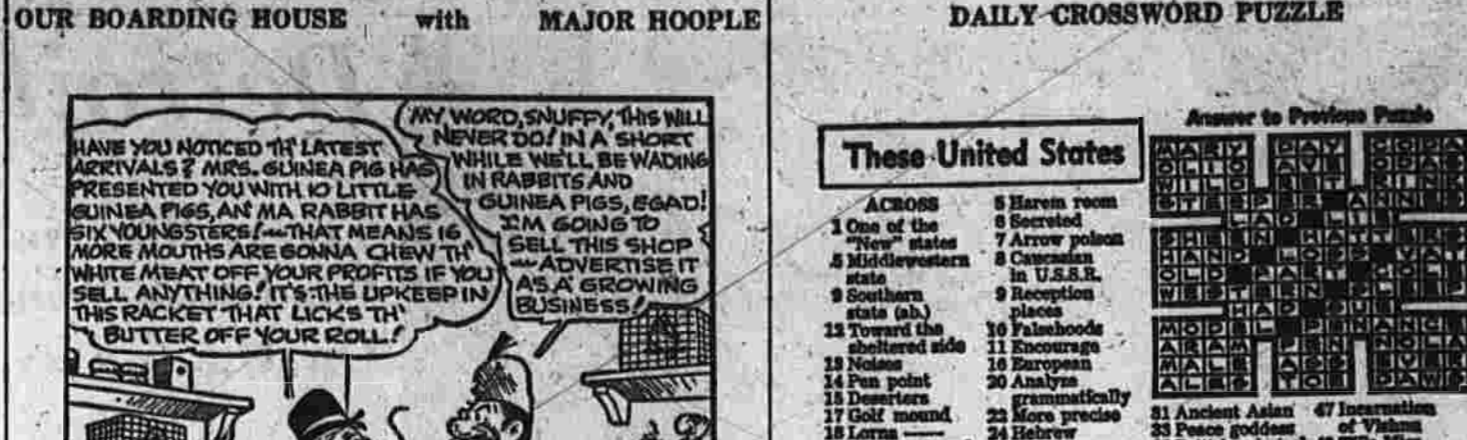

There is also speculation that Chinese might be more willing to negotiate a settlement in Moscow were it not for the fact that the Russian leader has a need to take greater risks in order to prove to Communist officials that he is a dedicated and able leader.

In any case, officials said, one invariable rule about the communist argument, was to judge the Moscow-West argument over Berlin is expected to reach feverishly toward the end of this year and could carry a risk of nuclear war.
