### Ulbricht Talks Of Soviet Pact

where 500 refugees from communism are taken in daily.

The only question, Ulbricht said today, was whether the process would be "easy and painless or more difficult." Ulbricht spoke for 30 minutes to the People's Chamber. East Germany's Soviet style parliament.

Ulbricht asserted that the western powers have no legal right in Berlin. He said their presence could lead to war and promised that this danger would be eliminated.

"The only question, he added, was whether the process would be 'easy and painless, or more difficult.'"

Parroted Soviet Premier Khrushchev's recent statement on the subject, Ulbricht insisted that his regime has only peaceful intentions. He vowed not to interfere with the internal affairs of West Germany once it is made into a "demilitarized free city" and said it could be protected by the "strongest international guarantee."

He called for a peace treaty with "both German states" but said if West Germany refused to sign one, he would sign alone with the Soviet Union.

Such a treaty, he said, would prepare the way for German neutrality. Ulbricht laid some emphasis on the idea of a neutral Germany, an old Communist Party slogan that has been mentioned again in recent weeks.

"What would be so bad about being neutral?" he asked.

He said German neutrality would promote peace and would guarantee that Germany would not be a battlefield in a nuclear war.

Ulbricht presented what he called a "peace treaty" for a neutralized Germany. Actually it was a warmed-over version of the Communist demand for German unity with the Communist East to have at its equal to the West. It would have "both German states" — West Germany and Ulbricht's German Democratic Republic — sign a peace treaty with the wartime allies.

The western powers refuse to recognize Ulbricht's satellite republic. Last week, West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer turned down the idea of neutrality for Germany.

Ulbricht's plan provides for reunification of force by the Communist East. The major victors of World War II would guarantee Germany's neutrality. Two German states would be represented at the United Nations. West Berlin would be a neutral, demilitarized free city until Germany is reunified.

### Tot Falls Under Blades of Mower

A four-year-old boy yesterday afternoon suffered multiple lacerations of the chest, face, and right arm when he fell under the blades of a lawn mower near his home at 78 Forest St.

Thomas H. Ferguson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas F. Ferguson, is reported in "good" condition this morning at Manchester Memorial Hospital, where he underwent surgery last night.

The child was riding in the jeep which pulls the gang mowers when he slipped off and under the blades. The driver of the mower, Paul H. Smith, 33 Hartford Rd., also riding in the jeep, alerted him.

### Colla Company Paved Its Way From Drives to Flood Dams

By JACK REPASS

The Thomas Colla Co., 251 Broad St., last week was low bidder—at \$238,238—for the dam construction contract for the first dry reservoir in Connecticut's Flood Control Program at the north branch of the Park River in Bloomfield.

The project, located on the west side of Tuxedo Ave., north of Bloomfield Center, will be one of four dry reservoirs to be placed in that area.

Total fill and excavation for the first reservoir dam project will involve the moving of some 18,000 cubic yards of earth and will take about three months of steady hauling by earth moving vehicles to complete the job. The project will begin sometime in August.

Thomas Colla, president-treasurer of the local firm, said the main dam will be 5,000 feet long, 30 feet at its greatest height and will have an emergency spillway 800 feet long and 200 feet wide. An additional dike area, 800 feet long and 18 feet in depth, will also be built to create the approximately 325 acres of dry reservoir area. It's a big project, but one the Colla company has grown large enough to handle easily.

Colla, a Hartford native, came to live in Manchester in 1948. He was then a builder of porches and garages and did alteration work to homes. In 1947 he formed his own company and developed a specialty in building driveways for homes.

Since that time, Colla has completed over 10,000 individual contracts.

### Meeting Set Today On Building Strike

Hartford, July 6 (AP)—Representatives of the Hartford Mechanical Contractors Association and Steamfitters Local 218 met today in an effort to end a six-day strike.

The meeting follows yesterday's report that a related strike involving bricklayers may soon be over.

Atwood L. Hall, negotiations chairman of the Hartford General Contractors Association, predicted an early end to that walkout after a two-hour negotiation session with state and local members and representatives of the Bricklayers Local 1.

Members of the bricklayers' union will meet tomorrow, several hours after another scheduled negotiation session at which the association is expected to submit an offer for a settlement.

"It's my personal opinion that the union membership will accept the offer we will make at Friday's meeting," Hall said.

"I don't think we're too far apart on the issues, or that it will be a long strike."

Meanwhile, striking plumbers of Local 76—the third union involved in the strike—said they are hoping to meet with negotiators before the end of the week.

The strike is the second one to affect construction projects in the area within a month. The last dispute ended July 7 after a strike of nearly two months.

The contract of all three unions expired midnight June 30.

In all three negotiations, wages have been one of the major stumbling blocks toward a settlement.

cularly inaccurate about the amount of land he actually owns. "He not only grouped my land, but also land owned by my sons and sons of the farm hand's manager for others," said Garst. He did not reveal, however, how much land he does claim this to.

Garst also took exception to Romanov's calling some of Garst's political ideas naive, and to the farmer's gloomy description of the farm area around the Garst home.

Garst said he told Romanov that the countries with high literacy rates, including the United States and Soviet Union, have been the leaders in progress, whereas famine and poverty were rampant in nations with high literacy.

"To add that technical progress in the United States has enabled the country to take more men off the farms and put them in industry, whereas the Soviet Union is using nearly half its total population on the farms."

Regarding Romanov's description of the interior of the Garst home, Garst said: "That doesn't bother me. But it probably will make my wife a little angry."






